INTRODUCTION

For the purposes of this nominal roll of Geelong & District Volunteers who served in the First World War the Geelong & District is the area to the east of a line extending from Lorne to Winchelsea, Inverleigh, Bannockburn, Lethbridge, Lara and Avalon.

The names listed are taken from the A.I.F. Unit Embarkation Nominal Rolls where the address of the volunteer or that of the nominated next of kin is the defined area. The names were checked against the Nominal Roll of Those who left Australia for Service Abroad 1914-1918 War to confirm the fate of each man. Both nominal rolls can be viewed on the Australian War Memorial website (www.awm.gov.au). Commonwealth War Grave Commission records (www.cwgc.org) were checked to determine the names those who are commemorated as war dead. Each name was checked against the Australian War Memorial Honours & Awards.

It should be noted that there are many discrepancies between the various sources used to compile this nominal roll such as spelling of names, given and family, unit, regimental number, date of enlistment and rank. For those where the fate could not be confirmed the service dossier should be consulted on the National Archives of Australia website (www.naa.gov.au).

This nominal roll includes each volunteer's names, awards, regimental number, rank, unit (for war dead the original unit, if different to the last one, is in brackets) and fate. For the war dead the name and location of the cemetery or memorial is included. Details of cemeteries and memorials are available on the Commonwealth War Graves Commission website. A glossary of terms is included.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

NAME

Generally as recorded on the embarkation nominal roll, however, for the war dead the name recorded by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission is used. Those who enlisted using an alias will have the alias name recorded under the correct name.

It should be noted that the CWGC accepts those who died from wounds, illness, disease or accident resulting from their war service from the 4th August 1914 when war was declared and 31st August 1921 when the war was officially declared ended.

AWARDS

Awards received such as the Military Medal (MM) are included after the name. Further information about the awards is available on the Australian War Memorial website.

REGIMENTAL NUMBER

That recorded on the embarkation nominal roll that, in some cases, may not be the same as that recorded on the nominal roll of those who served abroad. Officers were not issued a Regimental Number but for those who were commissioned after enlistment the original number is included.

RANK

First rank held except for war dead where the rank is the last held. Those commissioned after enlistment will show first and last ranks held. Rank abbreviations are:

As recorded on the nominal Roll of those who served abroad:

CNC – Died overseas, cause not confirmed
DAS – Died at Sea
DEC – Deceased with cause not recorded and not determined by the author.
DFA – Died from Accident
DIED – Died after return from the war
DIS – Discharged
DND – Drowned
DOW – Died from Wounds
DOD – Died from Disease
DRTA – Died during return to Australia.
FN/R – Fate not recorded.
KIA – Killed in Action.
N/L – Indicates the name not recorded on the Nominal Roll of those who Served Abroad.
N/R – Indicates still abroad at the date of compilation of the NRSA. May also be an omission.
POW – Dies while Prisoner of War.
RTA – Returned to Australia
