REPORT

OF THE

Proceedings of the First Annual Meeting of the Subscribers to the Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum, held on

THE 28th DAY OF JANUARY, 1853.

THE REV. A. LOVE WAS CALLED TO THE CHAIR.

THE Chairman having read the advertisement convening this Meeting, the Rev. F. Sherlock, the Secretary, read the Report and the Financial Statement to the end of the year 1852. The following Resolutions were passed:—

- 1.—That the Report now read be adopted, and that it be printed, under the direction of the Committee of Management, together with the names of the Trustees, the Committee of Management, and the Officers of the Institution for the past year, and the Financial Statement; and that the Lists of Subscriptions, and of Diseases and Cases treated, and the General Rules, and the Regulations of the Institution be appended.
- 2.—That the thanks of this Meeting are due to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor and the Legislative Council for the aid afforded by Government during the past year, and for the sums voted (amounting to £4,500) for this Institution for the current year.
- 3.—That the thanks of this Meeting be presented to the Members of Council for Geelong,—Alexander Thomson, Esq., M.D., and James F. Strachan, Esq., for the interest they have evinced in the affairs of the Institution, and their readiness to act in its behalf when solicited.
- 4.—That the thanks of this Meeting begiven to the Committee of Management, and to James F. Strachan and William Roope, Esqs., the Treasurers, for their services during the past year, and especially to Messrs Sladen, Mac Millan, Forster, Roope, Reed, and Lloyd, for their unremitting attention as members of the Acting-Committee, and their efficiency in working and carrying out the objects of the Institution.
- 5.—That the thanks of this Meeting be given to W. H' Baylie, Esq., F. W. Towle, Esq., John Day, Esq., M.D., and June

Rouald Gunn, Esq., M.D., for their services to the Infirmary during the last six months of the past year.

6.—That the following gentlemen be appointed a Committee of Management for the current year:—Messrs. Mac Millan, Manes, Lloyd, Curle, Carr, Forster, T. Bray, Ryan, A. R. Reed Boop, Armytage, Sandford, James Gates, R. Williamson, L. Davis, R. Gibbs, and J. S. Hill, and the Revds. T. C. Stretch, G. A. Ward, F. Lewis, J. Tait, and B. Cuzens: that J. S. Hill, Esq., be appointed Treasurer, and that Messrs. Badcock and M'Kellar be appointed Auditors for the same period, subject to their accepting office.

The Rev. A. Leve having vacated the Chair, it was taken by J. G. Mac Millan, Esq., when it was resolved:—

7.—That the thanks of this Meeting are due to the Rev A. Love, for his services in the Chair this evening.

REPORT

FOR 1852.

At the close of the year the Committee of Management of the "Grelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum," beg to lay before the Subscribers and the Public a Statement of the affairs of the Institution.

This Institution was opened for carrying out the objects contemplated, on the 23rd day of April, since when, to the end of the year 1852, one hundred and forty cases have been received into the Infirmary, of which one hundred and four persons have been discharged, cured, or considerably relieved, thirty-two have died, and thirty-four were under treatment in the Infirmary on the 1st of January, 1853. There have been ten Dispensary cases of out-door patients, and seven admissions into the Benevolent Asylum during the same period.

Of the number of deaths in the above account, your Committee have to remark that twenty-eight were moribund cases, in which there was no expectation of recovery when admitted, and that many when brought to the Infirmary were in the last stage of life. Some were kept alive only for a short time by stimulants; some died within a few hours; and two persons within a few minutes after admission.

The circumstances of the past year have been peculiarly unfavourable to the establishment of such an Institution. The extraordinary increase in price of all articles required for outfit and consumption,—the great expense of labour,—the continual difficulty of procuring and retaining suitable servants,—of obtaining contracts from tradesmen for stores and supplies,—and the great fact that the individual contributions to this the only public charitable Institution in this district, have been during the past year far less than what might reasonably have been expected from the rapid increase of general prosperity;—have been causes of considerable difficulty in establishing and maintaining the Institution,

Your Committee conceive that there has been much mis-apprehension by the public respecting the admission of persons into the Infirmary, and the consequence has been that the Management has been impugned, because applications have been refused when it was considered that the applicants were ineligible for admission as not coming within the objects of the Institution. Applications have been made for the

admission of the insane,—of persons able to pay for medical assistance and to support themselves,—of persons having contagious and infectious diseases,—of women for confinement,—of the disorderly and dissolute houseless from the streets; and it is conceived that the admission of such cases would have been a mis-application of the funds subscribed and in their hands for a specific purpose.

With respect to one class of the above—that of persons able to pay for medical assistance and to support themselves, as it is a point upon which there is much difference of opinion, your Committee beg to suggest the expediency of considering the subject of admitting into the Infirmary a limited ratio of paying patients, being such sick persons as cannot procure in their homes or lodgings the necessary quiet and attention which their cases may demand, and when their reception will not decrease the accommodation of other patients, nor occasion the rejection, for want of room, of any of the destitute diseased who might seek admission.

In conclusion, your Committee beg to urge upon the Subscribers and the Public the necessity of increased and strenuous exertions to support their own Institution, and to give it by their personal attention to the minutiæ of its working and their individual contributions and countenance a firm hold on public estimation, and to enable it to be a great and extending good to the diseased and needy. In meetings of the Committee and of the Subscribers, the small attendance has been a subject of much regret; and at several meetings there would not have been a quorum but for the presence of a few member of the Acting-Committee who have been uniform in their attendance. To make this Institution effective it is suggested that the many leave not to the few the responsibility of directing its affairs, that members of the Committees evince their interest at some sacrifice of time by taking part in and vatching over the proceedings, and that the attendance at the meetings of Subscribers be such as to indicate that the Contributors desire the extended usefulness of the Institu-

GENERAL RULES.

- l. That the objects of the Infirmary be to afford medical General Rules and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it and for casualties; but that no person who shall meet with casualties, and shall be found able to pay for surgical aid, shall receive further than temporary assistance. That the object of the Benevolent Objects. Asylum be the reception of the poor and the distressed, with a view to afford them consolation and assistance.
- 2. That the upper part be set apart for the purposes of the Appropriation of Infirmary; and that the ground floor be for the purposes of the Building. the Benevolent Asylum.
- 3. That the Institution shall consist of a President, two Institution how Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, a Treasurer, a Secretary, Constituted. Governors, and Subscribers, as hereinafter described.

QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

4. That every Benefactor of £20 or upwards, be a Life-Governor, and every annual Contributor of £5 an Annual-Governor, with liberty of having one in-patient or one out patient always on the books of the Institution, subject to the the approval of the Committee of Management herinafter mentioned, and provided that the funds of the Institution admit of the reception of such patients.

- 9. That no person shall vote at any meeting while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the Institution; nor any new Subscriber, unless his subscription shall have been paid for three months preceding.
 - 10. That no new general law, nor any repeal of or alteration in the existing laws shall be valid, unless the same shall have been passed at a special meeting of the Subscribers.
- of 11. The Committee of Management shall consist of the President, Vice-President, Treasurer, and eighteen Subscribers, to be elected annually; six to form a quorum.

- 12. It shall be competent at any time for the Committee of Management, at which at least eight members shall be present, or for nine or more Subscribers, by a writing under their hands, to require the Secretary to summon, at the expiration of fourteen days, a special meeting of Subscribers, the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting, except that for which it shall have been summoned. Every such meeting to be called by the Secretary by advertisement in one of the public newspapers, published in Geelong within three days of his receiving such requisition.
- 13. That all meetings of Subscribers be called by the 1 by Secretary by advertisement in one of the newspapers published in Geelong at least one week before the day of meeting.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

22. No pregnant female, for the purpose of confinement— missible. no person insane, -- no one having a contagious or infectious disease, -- no one subject to epilepsy, -- nor any one who, in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon, might receive equal benefit as an out-patient, shall be admitted, and no child under five years of age shall be admitted, except from an accident, or for a surgical operation.

26. He shall personally attend all special, general and Committee Meetings; he shall take minutes of the proceedings, and transcribe them carefully into books to be kept for that purpose, and he shall carry out the directions of such Meetings in the particulars incident to his department.

Collect and pay. 27. He shall collect subscriptions and all monies due to the Institution, and pay over the same to the Treasurer once in every week, together with an accurate account of the amount by him received since the last payment.

Correspondence and Accounts.

28. He shall conduct the correspondence and other clerical business of his department, and he shall enter and keep the accounts of the Institution under the directions of the Committees.

REGULATIONS

FOR THE INTERNAL MANAGEMENT

OF THE

Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asplum.

RESIDENT-SURGEON.

SURGBON.

1. The Resident-Surgeon shall live in the house, and shall Regulations renot leave it except on necessary occasions. He skall not be rary absence. absent for more than three hours at one time, nor after 12 o'clock at night, without the sanction of the Acting-Committee. In case of absence he shall inform the Matron, and enter in a book kept for the purpose where he may be found. N.B.—He and the Matron shall never be absent at the same time.

2. He shall have the charge of the patients, and shall charge of the report to the Acting-Committee at the next meeting any the disorderly. patient who may have been disorderly.

3. He shall have the immediate superintendence of the Internal control, Matron, Wardsmen, and Nurses, and the general control of Servants. the Servants of the Institution. He shall preserve order and sobriety, and in case of insubordination or gross default of duty on the part of any Servant, he shall suspend or discharge such Servant until the next meeting of the Acting-Committee, and, if necessary, he shall provisionally hire a substitute for such Servant so suspended or discharged, and he shall report his having done so, with the cause of such suspension or discharge, to the Acting-Committee at their next meeting; but he shall in no case absolutely discharge, or permanently hire, any Servant of the Institution without the sanction of the Acting-Committee.

4. He shall have the charge of and be accountable for the Medicines, medical instruments, furniture, utensils and stores, furniture, except such as are in the charge of the Matron, and he shall charge of them; inventory of them; inventory of them; make an Inventory of them in a book to be kept for that lists of them for purpose, in which he shall regularly enter the receipt, loss, the ensuing quaror breakage of each article; and he shall, on the last day of the months of February, May, August and November of each year, prepare and submit to the Acting-Committee a list of

medicines, medical instruments, and furniture, utensils and stores required during the ensuing quarter; and he shall re-Patients' money. ceive all money belonging to the patients, and account for it to the Acting-Committee.

Books to be kept.

5. He shall enter regularly, in proper books to be kept for such purposes, the names of the patients as they are admitted and discharged, and note the nature and history of their diseases while under treatment; the receipt, issue, expenditure, loss, or breakage of medicines, medical instruments, and other things in his charge, and the disbursement of petty

Attend the weekly cash; and he shall have such books ready at all times for the meetings of the inspection of the Acting-Committee, and he shall attend the A. Committee. weekly meetings of the Acting-Committee.

Visit each natient; Complaints.

6. He shall visit each patient every morning and evening, and shall inquire if the treatment prescribed has been attended to, and if any cause of Complaint exist. Should any patient have a complaint to prefer, he shall enter it immediately in the patients' Complaint-book, in the presence of the Wardsman or Nurse of the ward, and he shall lay such book before the Acting-Committee at each meeting.

Condition of the wards, &c.

7. He shall, on his visits to the wards, examine their condition with respect to cleanliness, temperature, and ventilation; and he shall observe if the Wardsmen and Nurses have done their duty.

Bed-lickets.

8. He shall cause to be affixed to the bed of each patient, the patient's name, age, disease, the date of admission, and the name of the subscriber by whom recommended.

Medicines; particulars

9. He shall write upon every medicine dispensed by him written on them, the name of the patient for whom it is prescribed, and the time at and the manner in which it is to be administered, and this, however frequently the same medicine may be repeated; and he shall cause the medicines to be administered as directed; and he shall keep a proper supply of the necessary

Inspect diet, &c.

10. He shall inspect the diet of the patients, and see that it is of good quality and properly prepared, and such as is ordered; and that the patients do not partake of any food, liquor, or medicine, except that prescribed.

He shall procure such articles as may be required in his department in small quantities during the week, but he shall not purchase for the Institution exceeding £5, nor enter Articles purchased during the into any contract on account of the Institution exceeding that week not to exsum in amount, without an order from the Acting-Committee. ceed £5.

MATRON.

MATRON.

12. The Matron shall live in the house, and shall not leave Regulations re-It except on necessary occasions, and with the consent of the specing tempo-Resident-Surgeon. She shall not be absent for more than three hours at any one time, nor after ten o'clock at night, without the leave of the Acting-Committee. N.B.—She and the Resident-Surgeon shall never be absent at the same time.

13. She shall see that the Nurses and Servants do their Superintendence duty; and she shall enforce personal cleanliness, neatness and servants; report obedience to orders on their part. In case of any misbehavour, any failure to the disobedience, or neglect of duty by any of them, she shall at once report the same to the Resident-Surgeon.

14. She shall visit each ward every day, and ascertain if it Visit and inspect the wards daily. and the beds, bedding and clothes of the patients be clean and neat, causing such of the beds, bedding and clothes as require it to be replaced by others, and thoroughly cleansed.

15. She shall have the charge of and be accountable for the Things in her invenbedding, linen, glass, cutlery, cooking and kitchen-utensils, tory; lists of arand she shall make an Inventory of the same in a book to be ticles required, when to be prekept for the purpose, in which she shall regularly enter the pared. receipt, loss, or breakage of each article; and she shall, on the last day of the months of February, May, August and November in each year, prepare and submit to the Acting-Committee a list of articles of the above description as may be required for the ensuing quarter.

16. WARDSMEN, NURSES AND WARDSMEN, NURSES, AND SERVANTS.

SERVANTS. 17. The Wardsmen and Nurses shall be constantly in their and wards, and regular in their attendance upon the patients. Attendance Wardsmen Nurses.

Theirdeportment: when to withdraw from the wards: not to receive presents or gratuity.

18. They shall obey the Resident-Surgeon and Matron as their master and mistress; they shall behave with tenderness to all the patients, with civility and respect to strangers; they shall withdraw from the wards when the Acting-Committee enter them, unless particularly requested to remain; and they shall take no presents or gratuity, in money or otherwise, from the patients, their friends, or strangers, who may visit the Infirmary, on any pretence whatever.

Permission for 19. No Wardsman, Nurse, or Servant shall leave the temporary Institution without permission from the Resident-Surgeon. sence.

Personal cleaniiness; by what time in the morning wards to be cleansed and dirt &c. removed.

20. The Wardsmen and Nurses shall be particular to observe personal cleanliness; they shall have their respective wards swept and thoroughly cleansed, and all dirt and rubbish removed from them by 7 o'clock in the morning in summer, and before 8 o'clock in the morning in winter.

Breakfast.

21. They shall serve up breakfast to the patients at 8 o'clock in the morning.

22. They shall have the several chamber-utensils scalded every morning, and scoured as often as may be necessary, and kept out of the wards during the day, unless specially required.

23. They shall pay great attention to the bedding of the patients, and have the mattresses thoroughly aired and dried when necessary, and the sheets, blankets, and counterpanes renewed as often as occasion may require.

cloanliness.

24. They shall not allow clothes to be hung, nor dirt or any thing to be thrown out of the windows.

Medicines.

25. They shall administer to the patients at the times directed the medicines and diet prescribed, and they shall not suffer them to take any which are not prescribed, and they shall be careful to explain to the patients the instructions of the Resident-Surgeon.

26. They shall not permit patients to receive from Visitors Regulations respecting medicines, victuals, or liquor of any kind; nor allow any portion of medicine or diet, nor any other thing to be removed WARDSMEN, from the wards by the patients or visitors, without an order Servants. from the Resident-Surgeon.

27. Any patient having any cause of complaint shall make the same known to the Resident-Surgeon, whose duty it shall be to enter such complaint immediately in the presence of the nurse or wardsman of the ward, in a book kept for that purpose, which book shall be laid before the Acting-Committee at each meeting.

Rmployment of 38. Patients judged by the Resident-Surgeon sufficiently tients.

38. Patients judged by the Resident-Surgeon sufficiently convalescent to be able to assist in the work of the Institution shall be so employed.

Regulations respecting relations and sitting up.

39. Patients shall not sit up after 8 o'clock in the winter, or 9 o'clock in the summer; and all patients considered by the Resident-Surgeon able to do so, shall rise by 7 o'clock in the summer, and before 8 o'clock in the winter.

Venereal stients. 40. No venereal patient shall be admitted a second time, having been once under treatment and cured.

Patients offending against the above Regulations Regulations to be will be discharged for irregularity.

VISITORS.

VISITORS.

When admitted; visits limited to one hour.

42. Visitors are admitted into the Institution on Sunday and Thursday in each week, between the hours of 3 and 5 o'clock in the afternoon, but no visitor is allowed to remain more than one hour.

Special visits.

43. Visitors may be admitted on special occasions by a written order from a member of the Acting-Committee, addressed to the Resident-Surgeon or Matron.

Regulations

44. Visitors will not be allowed to go into any ward without the leave of the Resident-Surgeon or Matron, and every visitor must retire when requested.

45. They will not be permitted to give to or leave with any patient any medicine, food, or liquor of any kind, nor any other thing, without the express sanction of the Resident-Surgeon.

Visits.

- 46. No Visitor shall give to any Servant of the Institution Not togive money any money or gratuity of any kind.
- 47. Visitors are requested not to interfere with the Wards-Not to interfere, men or Nurses, and not to disturb the patients by loud talking or unnecessary noise.
- 48. Any Visitor violating any of the Regulations of the Respecting v. Institution, or behaving with impropriety, will be compelled glations, or beto retire, and will not be re-admitted without special leave having improfrom the Acting-Committee.

The above Regulations, having been attentively considered seriatim, were ratified at a Meeting of the Management held at the Institution, on the 5th and 6th of January, 1853.
