SEVENTH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF SUBSCRIBERS TO THE

Geelong Instrmary and Benebolent Asplum,

Held at the Institution, on the 26th January, 1859.

VERY REV. DEAN HAYES.

In the Chair.

THE Secretary, Mr. JOHN MIDDLEMISS, read the Report and Financial Statement of the Committee of Management for 1858, and the following Resolutions were passed:—

Moved by Ven. Archdeacon Stretch. Seconded by J. R. Morris, Esq.

1. That the Report now read be adopted, and printed under the direction of the Committee of Management, together with a List of the Office Bearers of the Institution for 1859; Abstract of Accounts; List of Subscriptions; List of Diseases treated during 1858; and the Rules of the Institution.

2. That the thanks of the Subscribers are due and are hereby given to the Committee of Management for the past year, and that the following gentlemen be appointed Office Bearers for the year 1859:—President, His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, K.C.B.; Vice-Presidents, Hon. The amount of Subscriptions must of necessity exceed those of last year, otherwise a portion of the Grant will lapse, and the operations of the Institution be limited for want of funds, and its general efficiency be impaired, instead of, from the increasing demands of the District, being placed in a position to collarge its sphere of usefulness, and extend its blessings to a larger number of our fellow creatures.

SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

OF THE

Geclong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum,

1858.

TO THE SUBSCRIBERS.

According to annual custom, the Committee of Management appointed by the Subscribers at the last Annual Meeting, now desire to make a brief statement of the operations of the Institution during their year of Office; and in doing so, are thankful to state that, with the blessing of Almighty God, the Institution has continued to increase in efficiency and usefulness in fulfilling the objects for which it was founded.

One thousand One hundred and Sixty-nine persons have obtained the aid of the Institution during the year. Of this number, 559, including those who remained at the end of last year, were in-patients, or inmates of the Benevolent Asylum; and 610 received medical advice and medicines as out-patients. The attendances on out-patients have been 2,515. It will be remembered that at the end of last year, 53 persons remained in the Infirmary, and 23 in the Benevolent Asylum; so that the admissions to the House have been 462 during the year. Of the 559 thus treated in the House, 69 died in the Infirmary, and 4 in the Benevolent Asylum; 396 were discharged cured from the Infirmary, and 13 left

the Benevolent Asylum on their own accord; 78 remained in the House on 31st December last—49 in the Infirmary, and 29 in the Benevolent Asylum.

As usual, the number of deaths appear large; but it is not really so, when it is considered that cases known to be incurable are admitted, and persons even on the point of death are frequently received. Subscribers have been entreated to avoid recommending patients who are known to be dying, but the practice still continues, and seems unavoidable. It might, however, be a question whether the funeral expenses incurred in such cases should not be ensured to the Institution by those recommending them. Some have died a few minutes after admission, some in a few hours, and many suffering from consumption and other diseases beyond recovery, have only been admitted to linger out a brief period of existence.

The diseases which have proved most fatal are, Consumption, 14; Colonial Fever, 7; Dysentry, 7; Dropsy, 4; and Delirium Tremens, 4.

Out of 14 cases of Compound Fracture, and 22 cases of Simple Fracture, there have been three deaths.

The most prevalent diseases were—Colonial Fever, 40; Rheumatism, 33; Consumption, 18; Dysentry, 17; Diseases of the Lungs and Respiratory Organs, 23; Delirium Tremens, 11; Disease of the Heart, 5. 36 Fractures, 10 Wounds, and 23 cases of Ulcer have been admitted.

The religious Denominations to which Patients have stated they were attached are—Church of England, 222; Roman Catholics, 158; Presbyterian, 47; Wesleyan, 35; Baptist, 5; Lutheran, 8; Hebrew, 2; and Israelite, 1; Five professed no religion.

Patients still continue to be received from Ballarat and neighbourhood. It is hoped, however, now that Institutions receiving equal support from the Government with this Institution exist in that district, that this Institution will be relieved from providing aid for cases from Ballarat.

The Accounts have been audited, and a Statement accompanies this Report. A statement of every item of expenditure, in detail, has also been prepared for the inspection of the Subscribers.

Including the balance from last year, the receipts have been from all sources, £7,020 11s. 4d., and the expenditure, £6,156 15s. 2d.; the expenditure for maintenance being £5,112 19s. 4d., leaving a balance of £863 16s. 4d.

The amount liberally voted by the Legislature for 1858 has been received, the conditions attached to the Vote having been complied with, and a sum of £4,500 has been voted for 1859. But the Committee cannot quit office without warning the public, that unless their contributions be more liberal than during the past year, the amount voted will not be received; and as it is only through receiving the large Government Grant for last year that the Committee has been enabled to meet the expenditure of the Institution, it is evident that the whole amount voted will be again required, seeing that the operations of the Institution are on the increase.

The Committee have used every exertion to economise the Funds, and they are glad to be enabled to state that the average cost of maintenance has been less during the past year than in the former.

the last Annual Meeting Mr. Whittenbury held the office of Resident Surgeon to the Institution; that gentleman left, to go into private practice, at the end of June, and was succeeded by Mr. Patterson, who only remained for three months. It was alleged that Mr. Patterson's resignation arose from something disagreeable in the working of the rules, referring to the Honorary Medical Staff and Resident Surgeon, which the Committee, in their report, had stated to be working well.

As the Subscribers are aware, a Special Meeting was called to take these allegations into consideration, and a resolution was adopted relieving the Honorary Medical Officers from blame in the working of the Rules; and also suggesting

that the Rules should be taken into consideration for alteration if necessary. Accordingly, another Meeting was held, and after much discussion, the Rules were referred to a Sub-Committee for consideration. That Committee have presented their Report, and you are aware of the result.

On Mr. Patterson's resignation, Mr. Henry Julian was appointed Resident Surgeon. No other changes have taken place.

The Honorary Medical Officers and the Committee retire this evening, but are eligible for re-election; the Subscribers will, therefore, have to exercise their privilege in electing a Committee and Honorary Medical Staff. The retiring Committee and Staff have been ever anxious to promote and increase the welfare of the Institution, and trust that their efforts have met with the approbation of the Subscribers. Their aim has been to carry out the objects of the Institution to the fullest extent, for the benefit of those requiring its aid, at the same time, to guard it from abuse; they hope they have been successful. Before concluding their Report, the Committee of Management feel it necessary to speak in the highest terms of praise of the efforts of the House Committee. The nature of their duties may be known, when it is remembered that they meet twice a week, and many of their Meetings last for hours This is no slight tax upon the time of the gentlemen composing the Committee; but it has, nevertheless, been cheerfully and constantly attended to.

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GENERAL RULES.

I. That the objects of the Infirmary be to afford Medical and Surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, for a limited number of paying patients, and for casualties; but that no person who shall meet with casualties, and shall be found able to pay for Surgical aid, shall receive further than temporary gratuitous assistance. That the object of the Benevolent Asylum be the reception of the Poor and Distressed, with a view to afford them consolation and assistance.

OBJECTS.

II. That a portion of the building be set apart for the purposes of Appropriation of the Infirmary; and the remainder for the purposes of the Benevolent the Building. Asylum, at the discretion of the Committee.

III. That the Institution shall consist of a President, two Vice- Institution, how Presidents, five Trustees, a Treasurer, four Honorary Medical Officers, a Secretary, Governors, and Subscribers, as hereinafter described.

QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

IV. That every Benefactor of £50 upwards be a Life-Governor, and Governors every Annual Contributor of £20, an Annual Governor, with liberty of having one in-patient, or three out-patients, always on the books of the Institution, subject to the approval of the Committee of Management hereinafter mentioned, and provided that the funds of the Institution admit of the reception of such patients.

V. That the Executor, or if more than one, the first named, Executors, where Executor, under any will by which a bequest of £50 or upwards shall be made to the Institution; and every Minister raising by one or more Ministers raising collections in his Church, in any one year, the sum of £20 or upwards; and any other person, contributing a similar amount from any other source, shall have the rights and privileges of a Governor for one year only, commencing from the January following.

VI. That every Benefactor of £25 or upwards, in one sum, be a Subscribers. Life-Subscriber, with liberty of having one in-patient and three outpatients admitted annually; and every Contributor of £1 1s. and upwards annually, an Annual Subscriber, with liberty of having patients

admitted as follows:—Annual Subscribers of £1 1s., to have four Outpatients' tickets; of £2 2s., one In-patient and two Out-patients; of £3 8s., two In-patients and four Out-patients; of £5 5s., four In-patients and eight Out-patients; of £10 10s., eight In-patients and eight Out-patients. Recommendations for admission to be subject to the approval of the House Committee, and to be made by Tickets only, to be issued by the Secretary or Collector to Subscribers, at the time of their becoming such, and provided that whenever any recommendation cannot be acceded to, from want of room, or other cause appearing to the Committee, the ticket used in such recommendation shall be reclaimable by the Subscriber issuing the same. These tickets shall only be used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for Medical attendance; and shall only be available till 31st January, in the year after that in which they are issued.

Subscriptions, when due. VII. That the annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the first day of January in each year, and no Governor or Subscriber will be entitled to any privilege until the subscription be paid, if demanded.

Annual Meeting of Subscribers.

VIII. There shall be an annual meeting of the Subscribers in the month of January in each year, at which all Honorary Officers of the Institution shall be elected for the ensuing year.

Persons not qualified to vote.

IX. That no person shall vote at any meeting while he is a salaried officer, or pupil of the Institution; nor any new Subscriber, unless his subscription shall have been paid for one month preceding.

General Laws.

X. That no general law, nor any repeal of, or alteration in, the existing laws shall be valid, unless the same shall have been passed at an annual or special meeting of the Subscribers; and at least eight days' notice of such alteration having been given.

Committee of Management.

XI. The Committee of Management shall consist of the President, Vice-President, Trustees, Treasurer, Honorary Medical Officers, and Eighteen Subscibers, to be elected annually; six to form a quorum; and they shall have power to fill up vacancies that may occur in their number during the year, subject to Rule XIV.

Special Meetings of Subscribers.

XII. It shall be competent at any time for the Committee of Management, at which at least eight members shall be present, or for nine or more Subscribers, by a writing under their hands, to require the Secretary to summon, at the expiration of fourteen days, a Special Meeting of Subscribers, the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such

Special Meeting, except that for which it shall have been summoned. Every such meeting to be called by the Secretary, by advertisement in one of the public newspapers published in Geelong, within three days of his receiving such requisition. Twelve subscribers shall be necessary to form a General or Special Meeting.

XIII. That all Meetings of Subscribers be called by the Secretary, by Meetings of Subadvertisement in one of the newspapers published in Geelong, at least one week before the day of meeting.

XIV. In the event of any vacancies in the office of President, Vice- Honorary Officers Presidents, Treasurer, Trustees, Auditors, or Honorary Medical Officers, the Election of a successor shall take place at a Special Meeting of Subscribers, to be convened by the Committee of Management, which Election shall be by voting-tickets, as enjoined by Act of Council, 11 Vic., No. 59, section 9.

XV. And it shall be lawful at all meetings of Subscribers, for any vote by Proxy. Subscriber duly qualified to Vote, to Vote either in person or by Proxy, such Proxy being also a Subscriber duly qualified; provided that such Proxy shall have his authority in writing, signed by the Subscriber; and such authority shall only extend to the one meeting especially named therein. Governors to have three votes; Life-subscribers three votes; Annual Subscribers of £10 10s. three votes; £5 5s. two votes; of £1 1s. and upwards to £5 5s. one vote.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

XVI. The Committee of Management shall direct the general business Committee of Maof the Institution; shall frame Bye-Laws for its internal regulation, the same not being repugnant to the General Rules; shall have power to Their duties and enter into all necessary contracts on behalf of the Institution, and direct payments to be made; and appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the Institution. They shall meet at the Institution on the first Wednesday in every month, and on such other days as they may appoint. They shall have power to admit patients, and to make regulations respecting them. The Chairman of Committee, in case of any equality of votes, to have a casting vote, but no deliberative vote.

XVII. The President, Vice-Presidents, Trustees, Treasurer, and Members ex-officio Honorary Medical Officers, shall be Members, ex officio, of the Committee, provided they be qualified by subscription.

XVIII. The Committee of Management shall choose, from among House Committee themselves, a House Committee of five, three to form a quorum, who

shall meet on Monday and Thursday in each week, at 4 o'clock p.m. and oftener if necessary; and who shall have power to admit patients, to examine and pass the house-accounts, to engage and discharge servants. and to regulate the internal management of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee of Management.

Annual Report. XIX. The Committee of Management shall present a General Report of the affairs of the Institution at the Annual Meeting of Subscribers.

XX. The Accounts of the Institution shall be Audited once in every Accounts when to be Audited. year, and presented at the Annual Meeting of Subscribers.

XXII. They shall regulate the division and Classification of Patients; Cases, and at- and shall take care that proper attention is paid to them as to food, medicines, cleanliness, and attendance, and everything connected with their comfort and recovery; and in case of any neglect, shall report the same to the House Committee.

XXIII. Two of the Honorary Medical Officers, one Physician and one Surgeon, shall attend daily for one week, between the hours of Two p.m. and Four p.m., beginning with Monday. The Medical Officers for that week shall take the charge of the in-patients admitted during that week, and direct their treatment onwards daily, at the same hours, until discharged.

Capital operations to be performed bγ.

XXIV. They shall perform all Capital Surgical Operations. Capital Operation shall be performed without a previous consultation of the whole of the Medical Staff, except in cases of emergency. And they shall regularly consult in all cases of importance, or protracted continuance in the house.

Admission of Patients into the Infirmary.

That accidents, and such cases of decided emergency Admission into the Infirmary, as in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon cannot be be received into the Infirmary at any time without ticket, but that the admission of patients, in ordinary cases, be restricted to Monday and Thursday in each week, and then only if recommended by a Subscriber's ticket.

ADMISSION OF PAYING PATIENTS.

XXVI. That Paying Patients be admitted on the usual day of Patients to be adadmission, without tickets, at the discretion of the Committee.

XXVII. That the amount chargeable to each patient shall be at the Amount to be discretion of the Committee; and that any patient, on being admitted, must pay to the Treasurer the amount chargeable for one month in Deposit. advance, and also give a guarantee from some responsible person to reimburse the Committee any further expense that may be incurred on Guarantee. behalf of such patient.

XXVIII. That the general rules and regulations of the Institution Rules applicable shall be applicable to, and strictly observed by, all paying patients received into the Institution.

PATIENTS NOT ADMISSABLE.

XXIX. No pregnant female, for the purpose of confinement; no person Persons not adinsane; no one having a contagious or infectious disease; no one subject to epilepsy; nor any one who, in the opinion of the Honorary Medical Officer or Resident Surgeon, might receive equal benefit as an out patient, shall be admitted; and no child under five years of age shall be admitted, except from an accident, or for a surgical operation.

Admission of Innates into the Benevolent Asylum.

BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

XXX. The admission of inmates into the Benevolent Asylum is Admission of Inordinarily restricted to Monday and Thursday in each week, but a meeting of the House Committee may be convened at any time to consider authenticated cases of utter and present destitution.

XXXI. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no persons not admissable. person insane; no child under twelve years of age; no one having a contagious or infectious disease, shall be admitted.

XXXII. Ministers of Religion shall have free access to persons of Ministers of Relitheir respective denominations, at such times as shall be appointed by the Committee of Management; and when a patient requests that any minister may be sent for, his wish shall be immediately complied with.

Religious Instruction.

XXXIII. That the Instruction of the patients in the Institution be left to the recognised religious teachers of the various denominations to which the patients belong; and it shall be understood that controversial works be prohibited.

XXXIV. He shall attend all Special, General, and Committee Meetings; he shall take minutes of the proceeding, and transcribe them carefully into books to be kept for that purpose, and he shall carry out the directions of such Meetings in the particulars incident to his department.

Correspondence and Accounts. XXXV. He shall conduct the correspondence and other clerical business of his department, and he shall enter and keep the accounts of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee.

XXXVI. He shall be under the direction of the House Committee, and shall collect subscriptions and donations to the Institution, and pay over the same to the Treasurer at least once in every week, and render account of the amount by him received since the last payment.

They shall obey the Resident Surgeon and House Steward and Dispenser as their masters; they shall behave with tenderness to all the patients, with civility and respect to strangers; they shall withdraw from the Wards when the House Committee enter them, unless particularly requested to remain; and they shall take no presents or gratuity, in money or otherwise, from the patients, their friends, or strangers, who may visit the Institution, on any pretence whatever.

Permission for temporary absence. 30. No Wardsman, Nurse, or Servant, shall leave the Institution without permission of the Resident Surgeon or House Steward and Dispenser.

Personal cleanlianes; by what and Surses shall be particular to observe personal time in the cleanliness; they shall have their respective Wards swept and thoroughly morning Wards cleansed, and all dirt and rubbish removed from them by 7 o'clock in the and dirt, etc., morning in summer, and before 8 o'clock in the morning in winter. removed.

Breakfast.

32. They shall serve up Breakfast to the patients at 8 o'clock in the morning.

Details to promote 33. They shall have the several chamber ntensils scalded every morning and scoured as often as may be necessary, and kept out of the wards during the day, unless specially required.

comfort and cleanliness.

- 34. They shall pay great attention to the bedding of the patients, and have the mattresses thoroughly aired and dried when necessary, and the sheets, blankets, and counterpanes renewed as often as required.
 - 35. They shall not allow clothes to be hung, nor dirt, or anything to be thrown out of the windows.

Medicines, diet, 36. They shall administer to the patients at the times directed, the medicines and diet prescribed, and they shall not suffer them to take any which are not prescribed, and they shall be careful to explain to the patients the instructions of the Honorary Medical Officer or Resident Surgeon.

Regulations specting tors, etc re. 37. They shall not permit patients to receive from Visitors, medicines, visit victuals, or liquor of any kind; nor allow any portion of medicine or diet, or any other thing to be removed from the wards by the patients or visitors, without an order from the Resident Surgeon.

Empty phials, etc. 38. They shall be careful to collect and carry to the Resident Surgeon foo and tused; all empty phials, gallipots, bandages, &c., and to the Matron any articles Dispensary for of diet not consumed by the patients; and they shall attend at the Dismedicines.

pensary at the times appointed, to receive medicines and instructions.

- 39. They shall watch attentively the state and symptoms of the patients Watch and report patients' more especially in urgent or uncommon cases, and report these distinctly and symptoms. to the Resident Surgeon, or in his absence the House Steward and Dispenser; or in the case of females, to the Matron.
- 40. They shall not admit any stranger into any ward without the Admission permission of the Resident Surgeon or the Secretary.
- 41. One Wardsman or Nurse in rotation shall be on duty from 8 Nurse on night o'clock every night to 6 o'clock the following morning, and shall visit each ward once in every two hours, or more frequently if necessary, and shall pay due attention to such patients as may require it, and, should there be occasion, shall communicate with the Resident Surgeon.
- 42. All Wardsmen, Nurses, and Servants shall be obedient to the Wardsmen, Nurses Regulations of the Institution, and they shall report immediately to the Resident Surgeon, House Steward, and Dispenser, or Matron, any impropriety of conduct or infringement of them by any patient, visitor, or other person; and if such complaint be not properly attended to, they shall report the case to the House Committee at its next meeting.

and Servants to be obedient to the Regulation; report impropriety and infringement.

PATIENTS.

- 43. Patients shall conduct themselves orderly, and shall strictly observe Conduct; observe directions. all the directions of the Honorary Medical Officers, Resident Surgeon, House Steward and Dispenser, Matron, Wardsmen, and Nurses.
- 44. They shall take their medicines at the time directed, and they shall Medicines and diet. take no other medicines than those prescribed; and they shall not conceal nor put away any portion of the medicine or diet administered to them.
- 45. No one shall leave his or her ward, and go into another ward or Details respecting liberty to leave the Wards, abapartment, nor leave the house nor remain out for a longer time than is granted, nor shall introduce visitors, nor receive medicines, victuals, sence, visitors, etc. liquors, or any thing, without the express leave of the Resident Surgeon.
- 46. They shall not play at cards or dice, nor gamble or smoke, nor spit Details respecting cleanliness and on the floor, nor deface nor injure any part of the ward, nor any furniture conduct. bedding, or clothing therein, nor sing, blaspheme, or use rude or indecent language.
- 47. No patient shall give reward or gratuity to any of the Wardsmen, Notto give reward or gratuity. Nurses, or other servants.
- 48. Any patient having any cause of complaint shall make the same Regulations reknown to the Resident Surgeon, whose duty it shall be to enter such complaints. plaint immediately, in the presence of the nurse or wardsman of the ward,

in a book kept for that purpose, which book shall be laid before the House Committee at each meeting.

Employment of convalence to patients.

- 49. Patients judged by the Resident Surgeon sufficiently convalescent to be able to assist in the work of the Institution shall be so employed.
- Regulations respecting rising o'clock in the summer; and all patients considered by the Resident Surgeon able to do so, shall rise by 7 o'clock in the summer and before 8 o'clock in the winter.
- Venereal patients. 51. No venereal patients shall be admitted a second time, having been once under treatment and oured.
- Patients offending 52. Every patient offending against the above regulations will be disagnist to be charged for irregularity.

 discharged.

VISITORS.

- when admitted, visits limited to in each week, between the hours of 3 and 5 o'clock in the afternoon; but no visitor is allowed to remain more than one hour. Not more than two visitors will be admitted to see each patient, except on special occasions, and by the leave of the Resident Surgeon.
 - Special visits. 54. Visitors may be admitted on special occasions by a written order from a member of the House Committee, addressed to the Resident Surgeon or Secretary.
- Regulations respecting visits. of the Resident Surgeon; and every visitor must retire when requested.
 - 56. They will not be permitted to give to, or leave with any patient, any money, medicine, food, or liquor of any kind, nor any other thing without the express sanction of the Resident Surgeon. Any one doing so will not be again admitted.
- Not to give money or gratuity. 57. No Visitor shall give to any Servant of the Institution any money or gratuity of any kind.
- Not to interfere, 58. Visitors are requested not to interfere with the Wardsmen or etc.; quietness. Nurses, and not to disturb the patients by loud talking or unnecessary
- Respecting visitors violating the regulations or behave with impropriety, will be compelled to retire, and will not be
 or behaving imre-admitted without special leave from the House Committee.
