The Chairman called upon the Secretary to read the advertisement calling the meeting, and this having been done, the Thirteenth Annual Report and Financial Statement of the Committee of Management was read.

## THIRTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

or the
COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT
or min

For the Year 1864.

Is presenting the Thirteenth Amnual Record of the Operations of the Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum, the Committee of Management desire to specially note the following particulars:-

During the past year the Institution has afforded relief to 685 in-patients, 94 inmates of the Benevolent Asylum, and 2110 outpatients : in all 2889 persons. Of the in-patients, 568 were discharged cured, or relieved, 45 died, and 72 remained in the Institution at the end of the year; 36 left the Benevolent Asylum, 5 died, and 53 remained, making 124 who remained in the House at the end of the year. The daily average number of patients and inmates has been 125 .

Many deaths have occurred within a few hours after the admission of the patients; but, notwithstanding this, the Committee are giad to be able to report that a less number of deaths has to be recorded than in any previous year, although there has been an increase in the number of patients. Bearing in mind the fact that consumption and other incurable diseases are admitted, and cannot, be transferred to any other Institution, the average rate of mortality may be considered very favorable. Last year the average was less than that of any other similar Institution in the colony.

Of those admitted to the House during the year, 274 were of the Church of England, 120 Roman Catholics, 85 Preslyterians, 31 Wesleyans, 12 Lutherans, 4 Baptists, 6 Calvinists, 1 Quaker, and 1 Jew . It is not known to what persuasion the remainder belonged. 241 were natives of England, 211 of Ireland, 65 of Scotland, 59 of Victoria, 11 of Wales, 9 of Switzerland, 7 of Tasmania, 3 of Sweden, 5 of Prance, 2 of Jersey, 2 of Jamaica, 4 of Denmark, 3 of Schleswig Holstien, 2 of South Australia, 5 of New South Wales, 2 India, 1 Norway, 1 China, 1 Guernsey, 2 Germany, 1 New Brunswick, 2 Holland, 1 Isle of Man, 1 United States, and the remainder are not known.

The receipts from all sources have been $£ 67764$ s. 5d., and the expenditure $: 6020$ 15s. 9 d ; leaving a balance in hand of $£ 255$ 8 s .8 d . But for an expenditure of $\mathfrak{E} 678 \mathrm{I} 3 \mathrm{~s}$. 10 d . on the erection of the new building, recommended in the last report, the expenditure would have been less than in 1863.

The erection of the new building referred to was completed some time since, and it will be found to be of most important service. It has been determined to erect a propor Bath-room and appurtenances, which will absorb about $\mathscr{\$ 3 6 0}$ of the balance in hand. Estimates and plans have been agreed to, and instructions to call for tenders given.

With a view to increase the usefulness of the Institution, and to make relief more easily obtainable by the sick and destitute, the Committee have had the Rules under consideration, and suggest alterations in the 6th and 29th; the adoption or rejection of which will form a part of the business of the Annual Meeting.

In closing their Report, the Committee desire to acknowledge, with thankfulness to God, the large amount of public support which the Institution has enjoyed during the past yenr ; and also to express their high satisfaction with the attention and zoal displayed by the various officers of the establishment.

Surgical aid to poor persons requiving it, for a limited number of paying patients, and for casuabties; but that no persons who shall meet with castalties, and shall be found able to pay for Surgical aid, shall receive further than temporary gratuitous assistance. That the object of the Benerolent Asylum be the reception of the poor and distressed, with a view to afford them consolation and assistance.
II.-That a portion of the Butalding shall be set apart for the pur- Appropriation of poses of the Infirmary; and the remainder for the purposes of the Be- the Jsuiding. nevolent Asylum, at the discrotion of the Committee.
III.-That the Goverment of the Institution shall be rosted in a Institution, how President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, a Treasurer, Governors, and Subscribers, as hereinafter described.

QUALIEICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERSS.
IV.-That every Bencfactov of :EEO or upwards be a Lifo-Goremor, and every ammal Contributer of 820 m Anmul Covornor, with liberty of having one in-paticnt, or three out-patients, always on the books of the Instration, subject to tho approval of tho Committeo of Management heroinafter mentioned, and provided that tho funds of the Institution adenit of the reception of such patients ; and any public Institution contributing 550 in one sum shall be ontitled to the privilego of a Govemor for ten years from the date of such contribution.
V.-That the Executor, of if more than one, the first named Execr" Executors, where tor under any will by which a bequest of 850 or upwards shall be made bequasts of $£ 50$.
to the Institution : and every Minister raising by one or more collections in his Chureh, in any one ycar, tho sum of £20 or upwards ; and any other person contributing a similar anount from any othor source, shall have the rights and privileges of a Govornor for one year only, commencing from the Jamary following.
VI.-That every Benofuctor of ees or upwards, in ono sum, be a Subseribera. Life-Subscriber, with liberty of laning one in-patient and thee outpatients admitted ammally; and overy contributor of iel 1s. and upwards ammally, an Annual Subscribor, with liborty of Jnaving
pationts admitted as follows:- Amunal Subscribers of $£ 1 \mathrm{Is}$, to have One In-patient's Ticket and Two Out-patients' TioFets; of $£ 22_{8}$., Two In-patients and Four Out-patients; of $E 33 \mathrm{~s}$., Three In-patients and Six Out-patients; of $£ 55 \mathrm{~s}$., Four In-patients and Eight Out-patients; of $£ 1010 \mathrm{~s}$., Eight In-patients and Tight Out-patients. Rocommendations for admission to be subject to the approval of the Honse Committee, and to be mado by Tickets only, to be issued by the Secretary or Collector, to subseribers, at the time of their becoming such, and provided that whenever any rocommendation camot be acceded to, from want of room, or other cause appearing to the Committee, the ticket used in such recommendation shall be reclaimuble by the Sub. scriber issuing the same. Subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the Secretary, of exchanging out-patiens' tiekets for in-patients', and vice versa-one in-patient's ticket being equivalent to three out-patients'. These tickets shall only be used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for Medical attiondance: and shall only be available till 31st Jamuny, in the year after that in which they are issucd.

XII.-It shall be competent at any time for the Committee of Management, at which at least eight members shall be prosent, or for nino or more Subscribers, by a writing under their hands, to require tho Secretary to summon, at the expiration of fourtcon days, a Special Meeting of Subscribers, the ocension of colling such meoting being stated in the requisition; and no businoss shall be transacted at such Special Meeting, except that for which it shall have been summoned: Erery such meeting to be called by the Secretary, by advertisement in one of the public newspapers, published in Gcelong, within three days of his receiving such requisition. Twelve Subscribers shall be necessary to form a General or Special Meeting.
XIII.-That all Mcetings of Subscribers be called by the Seeretary, by advertisement in one of the newspapers published in Geelong, at least one weel before the day of meeting.
XIV.-In the event of any vacancy in the offce of President, VicePresidents, Treasurer, Trustees, or Auditors, the Election of a successor shall take place at a Specind Meeting of Subscribors, to he convoned by the Committce of Management, which Dlection shall be by votingtickets, as enjoined by Act of Oouncil, 11 Vic., No. 59, section 9.
XV.-And it shall be lawful at all mootings of Subseribers, for any Life-Governor or Lifo-Subseriber who bemme such provious to 1861, as enjoinod by Act of Council; to Voto by Proxy, auch Proxy being also a Subscriber duly qualified ; provided that auch Proxy suall havo his authority in writing, signed by tho Govemor or Subseriber ; and such authority slall only extend to the one moeting especinlly named therein. Governors to have threo votes; Life Subseribors three votes; Annual Subseribers of $£ 10$ 10s. threo votes; $£ 5$ 5s. two votes; of $£ 1$ 1s. and upwards to $£ 55$. 5 one vote.

## COMMLITET OF MANAGTMENT.

XVI.-The Committee of Management shall direct the general busi* ness of the Institution ; shall framo Bye-Laws for its internal vegulation, the same not being repugnant to the Genoral Rules; shall have power to enter into all necessary contracts on behalf of the Institution,

Committea of Mre nagement. and direct payments to bo mado; and appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the Institution. Thioy shall meet at the Institution on the first Wodnosday in every montil, and on such other days as they may appoint. They shall have power to admit pationts, and to make regulations respecting them. The Chairman of Committoe, in case of my equality of volos, to have a casting voto, but no doliborative rote.

Members ex-afficio.
XVII.-The President, Vice-Presiconts, Trustees, and Treasurer, shall be Members ex-afficio of the Committee, provided they be qualified by snbscriptions.

House Committee XVIII.-The Committee of Management shall choose, from among themselves, a House Committee of five, three to form a quorum, who shall meet on Mondiay and Thureday in each week, at 4 o'dock, p.m., andl oftener if necessary; and who shall have power to admit patients, to examine and pass and pay the house accounts, to engage and dis. charge servants, and to regulate the internal management of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee of Management.

Annual Report. XIX.-The Committee of Managemont shall present a General Report of the affirs of the Institution at the Annual Meeting of the Subscribers.

Acoountswhen to XX .-The Accomats of the Institution shall be Audited once in be Audited. erery yenr, and presented at the Ammual Mceting of Subscribors.

## HONORARY MEDIOAL STAFT.

Their qualifica- XXI.-The Honorary Medical Staff shall consist of fom duly qualition. fied general practitioners, to be elected annually. No ona shall be eligible for the appointment unless he can produce a Diploma from a recognised British Uuiversity, or from one of the Royal Colleges of Surgeons of London, Edinburgh, or Dublin, or the Tacully of Physicinns of Glaggow, togother with a certificate from the Medical Bonrd of Victorin.

Charge of Pa- XXII.-The Resident Surgeon shall have the charge of all patients tionts and visit-
fng. any time, and in case of their observing any neglect of or inatitention to the patients it shall be their duty to report the same to the House Committice forthwith.

Rotation of duty. XXIII.-Two of the Honorary Medical Staff shall attend in weolly rotation, on such days, and at such houss as may bo most conveniont, for consultation on the treatment of the patients: and they shall arange the rotation of attendance.

Consultation to XXIV.-The Honorary Medical Staff of tho weok shall attend for be held. consultation on all important cases; and should any capital operation be deomed necessary the whole of the honorary medical staff shall be summoned for further cousultation (except in cases of omergenoy) previous to the oporation being performed, when, if then decided on, the whole of the honorary modical staff shall be requested to attencl.

## ADMISSION OF PATIENTS INTO THE INFIRMARY.

Patients.
XXY.-That accidents and such cases of decided emergency only as Admission into in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon camot be delayed, be received the Infirmary. into the Tnfumary at any time without ticket, but that the admission of patients, in ordinary cases, be restricted to Monday and Thursday in ench week, or at special meetings of the House Committee, and thon only on presenting a Subscriber's Tlicket.

## ADMISSTON OF PAYING PATIENTS.

XXVI.-That Paying Patients be admitted on the usual days of Patients to beadndmission, without tickets, at tho discretion of the Committee.
XXVII.-That the anount chargeable to each pationt shall be at the Amount to be discretion of the Committee; and shall be paid in adrance, or at the discretion of the Committee.
XXVIII.-That tho gencral rules and regulations of the Institution Rules applicable shall be applienble to, and strictly observed by, all pnying patients to paying Pareceived into the Tuslitution.

## PIRRSONS NOT ADMISSABLE.

XXIX.-No pregnant female for tho purpose of confinement; no Persons not adperson insane; no one lunving a contagious or infectious disease; no one subject to epilepsy; nor mny one who, in the opinion of tho Resident Surgeon, might recoive equal benoflt as an out-pationt, shall be admitted; and no child mudar fivo years of ago shall be admitted, except from an aceident, or for a surgical operation. Provided that the Houso Committeo or Officers of the Lnstitution shall havo diseretionary power to admit such prohibited cases, and shnil report upon the exorcise of such power at any tino to the next General Meoting of the Committeo of Managoment.

## ADMISSION OF INMATES INTO THE BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

 Asylem.ission of $\operatorname{In}$. mates. ordinarily restricted to Monday and Thursclay in each week, but a meeting of the House Committee may be convened at any time to consider authentic cases of utter destitution.
XXXI.-No pregnant female for tho purpose of confinement; no Persons not ad person insane; no child under twelve years of age; no one haring a missable. contagious or infectious disense shall be admitted.

XXXIT.-Ministers of Religion shall have freo access to persons of their respective denominations, at such times as shall be appointed by gion. the Commiltee of Management ; and when a patient requests that any minister may be sent for, his wish shall be inmedintely complied with.

Relligions In $\quad$ XXXIII.-That the Instruction of the patients in the Institution br struction. left to the recognised religious teacher of the various denominations $t_{1}$ which the patients belong; and it shall be understood that controver sial works be prohibited.

## SECRETIARY.

Secretary. XXXIV.-He shall attend all Special, General, and Committoe Meetings; be shall tale minutes of the proceedings, and transeribe them carefully into books to be kept for that purpose, and ho shall curry out the directions of such Meetings in the particulars incident to his department.

Correspondence and Accounts.
XXXV.-He shall conduct the corrospondence and other clecical business of his department, and he shall enter and keep the accounts of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee.

## COLLEOTOR.

Collect and pay. XXXVI.-He slall be under the direction of the House Committee, and shall collect subscriptions and donations to the Institution, and pay over the same to the Treasurox, at least once in overy weels, and render account of the amount received by him since the last payment.

## ALTERATION OF RULISS.

Alteration of Rules.
XXXVII.-Mhese Rules shall not be altered, except at a Special or General Mecting of Subscribors, due notice of any proposed alterations having been given, in accordanco with Rule 12.

## RESTDENT SURGEON.

I.-No Cmalidato shall be eligible for the nppointmont of Residont Qualifialions. Surgoon miess he produces a diploma from eithor of the Royal Colleges, of Surgeons of London, Edinbuygh, or Dublin, togothor with a Certificate from the Medienl Bowd of Vietoria.
2.-He shall reside in the house, nad shall not leave it axeept on Regulations renecessary occasions. He shail not bo absent moro than throo hours at spocting absemece. one time, or after Twolye o'eloak at night, without the express leave of the House Committee. In case of absonce, he shall inform the House Stoward and Dispeneor, and shall onter in a book kept for the purpose whare he may bo found.
A.B.--He and the Houso Steward and Disponser shall never be absent at the samo time.
3.- He shall lave the charge of all patients admitted, and shall Charge of the Pan report to the Housc Committee at its noxt meeting any patient who tionts; report may lave been disordorily. Ho bhall mako a special report to the House Committee on orery patient who may have been two months in Pationts 2 montha the Institution ; and ho shall also roporit any caso that may afler conn in Ingtitution sultation be considored incurable by tho Monomy Medical Stuff, to be ynourabo enges dealt with as the Committeo mony seo fit.

Internal control 4.-He shall have the general superintendance of the internal affuirs of the Tnstifation, under the direction of the Eonse Committee. He shall preserve order and sobricty, and in case of insubordination or

## Servants,

 gross default of duty on the part of any servant, ho shall suspend or discharge such servant until the next mecting of the Honse Committee; and, if necessary, he shall provisionally hire a substitute for such servant so suspended or discharged, and he shall report his having done so with the cause of such suspension or discharge, to the House Committee at their next meeting; but ,he shall in no caso absolvately digcharge, or permanently hire, any servant of the Institution, without the sanction of the House Committee.Medicines, mediaalinstruments farniture, etc.; charge of them,
inventory of them.
5.-He shall have charge of, and keep the surgical instruments in proper oxder ; and shall be accountable for the medicines, medical and surgical instruments, utensils and stores, except such as are in charge of the House Steward and Dispenser, or Matron ; and he shall prepare an Inventory in the month of December, in every year, and at such other times as the Committec may direct, of all furniture, utensils, medicines, and stores, under his charge, and such Inventory shall bo recorded from year to year, in a book to be kept for that purpose.

Books to be lept. 6.-Ho shall enter regularly, in proper books to bo kept for such purposes, the names of the pationts as they nre admitted and dis. changed, and note the nature and history of their disenses while undor treatmont; the recoipt, issue, and oxpenditure, loss or breakage, of medioines, modical instruments, and other things in his churgo, and the disbursement of petty cash; and he shall have such books ready ati all
Attend the weok- times for the inspection of the House Committee; and ho shall attend ly meetings of the weekly meetings of the House Committee; and he shanli receive all mittee,
Patienta' money. money aud other property belonging to pationts, and shall account for - the same weekly to the House Committee.

## Visit each patient -complaints.

7.-Ho shall visit each patient morning and evening, and shall inquire if the treatment prescribed has boon attended to, and if any cause of complaint exist. Should any pationt have a complaint to prefer, ho shall enter it immediately in the Patients' Complaint Book, in the presence of the Wardsman or Nurse of the Ward, and he shall lay such book before the House Committeo at cach meating.

Fondition of the Wards, etc.
8.-He sholl, on his visits to the Wards, examino their condition with respect to cleauliness, temparature, and ventilation ; and ho shall observe if the Wardsmen and Nurses have done their duty.

Bed-ticketg.
9.-IIo shall affix to tho bod of ench pationt a card, stating tho pationt's name, nge, roligion, disense, dnto of admission, diet, and tho name of the subseriber lyy whom recommonded.
10.-He shall write, or cause to bo written, upon every medicine $\begin{gathered}\text { Medionnes, parti- } \\ \text { culars }\end{gathered}$ dispensed by him or the Dispenser, the name of the patient for whom it
culars to be
written on them is prescribed, and the time at, and the manner in, which it is to be administered, and this however frequently the same medicine may be repeated; and he shall causo the medicines to be administered as Supply for aceldirected; and he shall lreep, or catuse to be kept, a proper supply of the necessary apparatus for cases of accident or emergency, ready for immediate use.
11.-He shall inspect the diet of the patients, and see that it is of Inspect diet, ete. good quality, and properly prepared, and such as is ordered; and that the patients do not partake of food, liquor, or medieines, except that prescribed.
12.-He shall procuro sutch articles in small quantities, in his depart- Topurchasesmall ment as may be required during the week; but ho shail not purchase any article, nor enter into any contract for the Institution, oxceeding $\mathfrak{e 2}$, quantitios of any article required. withont the sanction of tho Committee; and he shall, on the lest days of February, May, August, and November, prepare and submit to the House Committee, a list of medicines, medical or sturgical instruments, utensils and stores, as may be required during the ensuing quarter.

List of Medicines, eto, required to be prosented to House Committoo.
18.-He shall regularly consult with the Honorary Modical Staff on Consultation in any important caso, in accordance with 24 of Gencinl Rules. And ho important cases. shall afford thom overy facility for examining and for offering opinion on the treatment of all cases admitted; and shall record tho result of Re-Consultationes erery consultation in the Case Book.

14- He shall give due notice in writing to the Fonorary Medical Notico of ConsurStaff, when a consultation is to be hold or an operation performed, and consult their desires with regard to the porformance of capital operatations to be given. tions.
15.-The Committee of Management shall have power at any time to Private practice. requive the Resident Surgeon to give up private practice, should he have any.

## HOUSE STEWARD AND DISPENSER.

16.-The House Steward and Dispenser shall livo in the House, and Regulations reshall not leave except on necessary ocensions, and with the consent of the Rosident, Surgeon. He shall not be absent for more than three hours at one timo, nor after ten o'clock at night, without the leare of the House Cormmitteo.
N.B.-He and the Matron shall never bo absent at the same time.

Superintendence of the Matron. Nurses andServants; report any failure to the Resident surgeon.
17.-He shall haye the immediate superintendance of the Mation, Wardsmen, Nurses, and Servants, and shall see that they do their duty; nud he shall enforce order, sobriety, personal clemuliness, neatness, and obedience to orders on their part. In case of any misbehaviour, tisobedience, or neglect of draty, by any of them, he shall at once report the same to the Resident Surgeon or House Committec.

Wards, ete., to be keptin a proper state of clennilimess and order.

Things in his chates, jnventory : list of articles in charge of Wardsmen, to Nurses, ote.
18.-Ho shall sce that the Wards, and all othor parts of the Honse, and the grownds, are lept in a proper stato of cleanliness and order.
19.-He shall have the charge of, and be accomntablo for, the furniture, bedding, linen, glass, cutlery, cooking and kitchen utensils, medicines and stores; and he shall make an inventory of the same in a book to be kept for that purpose, in which he shall regularly onter the receipt, loss, or breakage of any article; and he shall, on the last days. of Jume and December in each yenr, and at such other times as the House Conmittec may require, propare and submit to tho Committeo an Inventory of everything under his charge; and he shall prepare an Inventory of everything placed under the charge of any Wardamen, Nurse, or Servant; and shall on either of them leaving the Institution, require thom to give an account of all that they may have had meder their care.

Receivestores and supplies; and dispense tho con sumption, amd amount in a book. Oversight of provisions, stores and utensils.
20.-He shall receive the stores and supplies furmished by the Contractors and Iradesmon, and he shall see that they corvespond in dhscription, quality, and quantity with the tonders and ordors; and in case thoy do not, ho shall report accordingly to tho Honse Committee, at its next meeting ; and ho shall weigh and measuro out tho provisions and other necessaries required for the day's consumption, and he shall entor the mount regularly in a book to be legpt for that purpose; and he shall attend to the cutting up and distribution of food to the patients when cooked; and ho shall not suffer any of the provisions, utensils or stoves, to be wasted or carried away; and he shall propare the usnal monthly returns of diets, receipt and issue of stores, \&c., and accounts as may be required by the Committee; and he shall have the clothes of all pationts clennsed on admission, if requisite, and he shall malre out an Inventory of the same.
21.-He shall dispense the Prescriptions of the Resident Surgeon, and shall carry out the instructions of the Rosident Surgeon in the Surgery, and otherwise fulfil the dutios of Dispenser.

## MATRON

Absence.
22.-She shall be subject to the same regulations, respecting living in the house and absence therefrom, as the House Steward and Disponser.
N.B.-She and the House Stoward and Dispenser shall never be absent al the same time.
23.-She shall see that the Nurses and Femnle Servants do their Superintendenes duty; and ehall report any neglect or disobedience of ordors on their of Nurses nid part to the House Stowayd and Dispensor.
24.-Sho shall visit each Ward daily, and shall see that the beds, Visit and inspect linen, and clothes of the patients, are clem and in good order; and shall canso such of the bedding, \&c., as require it to be replaced by othors and thoroughly cleansed and repaired where necessary.
25.-She shall superintend the Laumdry, and shall be accountablo to the wards dails.
the Houso Stewned and Disponser for the return from the Laundry of all clothes sent to be washed or cleansed, leeping an account of overything taken to the Laundry and receivod therefrom.
26.-Whe shall, seo that all pationts' clothes, as they are admitted, wre cleansed and pat carefully away; and shall cater in a book a list of all patients' elothes as thoy are received, and procuro the receipt of ench patient for their clothes when they leave. And shall not permit any of the patients' clothes to bo removed from the store but in her presence.
27.-She shall personally superintend the coolcing of all food for the To Superintend inmates; and shall generally discharge the dutios of Matron as shan be directed by tho Committeo.

## WARDSMEN, NURSESS AND SERVANTS.

28.-The Wurtsmon and Nunsos ahnll bo constantly in their Wards, and regular in their attendenco upon the pationts.
attenumene of Wardsmen and Nurses.
29.-They shall obey tho Residenti Surgeon, House Steward and Dispenser, and Matron. They elall belewo with tenderness to all tho pationts, with civility and respect to strongers; thoy shall withdraw from the Wards when the House Cormnittee onter them, unless paticularly requested to romaitin ; and they shall take no presents or gratuity in money or othorwise from their patients, their friends, or atrangers, who may visit the Institution, on any protence whatevor. Infingement of the Rule will subject to instant clismissal.
30.-No Wardsman, Nurse, or Sorvant, shall leave the Tnstitution Pormission for without permission of the Rosidont Surgeon or House Stoward and hir deportment when to withdraw from the Ward; not to receivepresents or gratuity, Dispensor.
31.-The Wardsmen and Nurses shall be particular to obscrve per- Personal eleanisonal elemlinoss; they shall have their respective Wards swept and thoroughly clewased, and all dirt and rubbish removed from them by 7 o'elock in the morning in the summer, and before 8 o'elock in the morn* ing in winter. moming.

Details to. 33.-They shall have the several chamber utensils sealded every
promote morning and scoured as often as may be necessary, and kept out of the wards during the day, unless speoially required.

34.-Whey shall pay great attention to the bedding of the patients, and have the mattrasses thoroughly aired and dried when necessary, and the sheets, blankets, and countorpanes renowed as often as required.
35.-They shall not allow olothes to be hung, nor dirt, or anything to be thrown out of the windows.

Medicines, diets
36.-They shall administer to the patients at the times directed, the medicines and the diet prescribed, and they shall not suffer thom to take any which are not prescribed, and they shall be careful to explain to the patients the instructions of the Resident Surgeon.

37.-They shall not permit patients to receive from Visitors, medicines, victuals, or liquor of any kind; nor allow any portion of medicine
or diet, or any other thing to be removed from the wards by the patients or visitors, without an order from the Resident Surgeon.

Emptyphials, etc. 38.-They shall bo careful to colloct and carry to the Resident; Surgeon all ompty plials, gallipots, bandages, \&ce; and to the Matron any article of dict not consumed by the pationts; and thoy shall attond at the Dispensary at tho timo appointed, to receive medicines and instruc. tions.

Watoh andreport 39.-They slaall watch attentively the stato and symptoms of the palients' state and symptoms. distinctly to the Resident Surgeon, or in his absence to the Houso Steward and Dispenser ; or in case of females to the Mation.

Admission of strangers.

Wardsman or Nurse on night
duty.
40.-They shall not aclmit any stranger into any ward without the permission of the Resident Surgeon or the Secretary.
41.-One Wardsman or Nurse in rotation shall be on duty from 8 o'clock every night to 6 o'clock the following morning, and shall visit each ward onco in every two hours, or more frequently if nocessary, and shall pay due attention to such patients as may require it, and, should there be occasion, shall communiente with the Resident; Surgoon.
42.-All Wartsmen, Nurses, and Servants shall be obedient to tho Regulations of the Institution, and they shall report inmediately to the Resident: Surgeon, House Steward and Dispenser, or Matron, any impropriety of conduct or infringemont of them by any pationt, risitor, or other porson; and if suoh complaint be not properly attonded to, they slall report the sume to the Houso Commiltee at its next meeting.

## PATIENTS.

43.-Patients shall conduct themselves orderly, and shall strictly Conduct; observo observe all the directions of the Resident Surgeon, House Steward and Dispensar, Matron, Wardismen, and Nurses.
44.-They shall take their medicinos at the time directed, and they $\begin{gathered}\text { Medicines and } \\ \text { diet. }\end{gathered}$ shall take no other medicines than those prescribed; and thoy sholl not conceal nor put away any portion of the medicine or diet administered to them.
45.-No one shall his or her ward, and go into another ward or Details rospecting apartment, nor leave the house, nor remain out for a longer time than is granted, nor shall introduce visitors, nor receivo medicines, victuals, liquors, or anything, without express leave of the Rosident Surgeon or liberty to leave the Wards, absince, visitors, etc. Secretary.
46.--They shall not play at cards or dice, nor gamble or smoke, nor Details respeoting spit on the floor, nor deface or injure any part of the ward, nor any cleanliness and conduct. furniture, bedding, or clothing therein, nor sing, blaspheme, or use rude or indecent language.
47.-No patient shall give reward or gratuity to any of the Wardsmen, Nurses, or other sorvants.

48.-Any pationti having any cause of complaint shall make the same reguintions re-

50.-Patients shall not sit up after $80^{\circ}$ clock in the winter, or nine o'clock in tho summer ; and all pationts considered by tho Rosidont; Regulations ro${ }_{\text {Regulations }}^{\text {rising }}$ and sitîng up. Surgeon able to do so, shall riso by 7 o'clock in the summer, and before $80^{\text {oclock in the winter. }}$
51.-No penereal pationts shall bo admitted a second time, having Venerealpatients. been once under treatmont and curod.
52.-Every patient offending against the abovo rogulations will bo Patients offendr discharged for inregularity.

## VISITORS.

When admitted; visits limited to one houl.
53.-- Visitors are admitted into the Institution on Sunday and Thuw day in each week, between the hows of 3 and 5 o'olock in the afternoon but no visitor is allowed to remain more than one howr. Not more than two visitors will be admitted to see each patient, except on special ocen sions, and by the leave of the Resident Surgeon or Secretary.

Special yisits. 54,-Visitors may be admitted on special occasions by a writter order from a member of the House Committee, nddressed to the Resi dent Surgeon or Secretary.

Regulations re- 55.-Wisitors will not be allowed to go into any wavd withont thit - specting visits, leave of the Resident Surgeon or Secretary; and every visitor mus retire when requested.
56.-Thoy will not be parmitted to give to, or leave with any pation any money, medicines, food, or liquor of any kind, nor any other thing without the express sanction of the resident Surgcon. Any one doing so will not be again admitted.

Not to interfere, 58.-Visitors aro requested not to interfere with the Wardsmon on eto.; quictness. Nusess, and not to disturb the pationts by loud talling or unnecessary noise.

tors violating 59.-Any Visitor violating any of the Regulations of tho Tnstilution tors violating or beharing with improprioty, will be compelled to retire, and will no or behaving be re-admitfed without special learo from the House Committee.
