Geelong Infiquary and Benevolent Asylum,

Held at the Institution, Tuesday, 23rd January, 1867.

THE Chairman called upon the Secretary to read the advertisement calling the Meeting; and this having been done, the Fifteenth Annual Report and Financial Statement of the Committee of Management was read.

That the Report and Financial Statement now read be adopted and printed, under the direction of the Committee of Management, together with the usual Statistics, Lists of Subscriptions, Rules, &c. (Carried.)

Geelong Infiquary and Benevolent Asylum,

The term of their appointment having expired, the Committee of Management of the Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum, in accordance with the rule, present a report of their proceedings for the past year; and have great pleasure in meeting the Subscribers to do so, as they can refer with much satisfaction to the success which, under God's blessing, has attended the operations of the Institution during the year.

As was anticipated in the last Annual Report, there has been a considerable increase in the number of Patients and Inmates during the year. The daily average number increased from 134 in 1865, to 155 in 1866. The daily average number of Out-patients has remained about the same as it was. In-patients and Inmates, and 1682 Out-patients have received the benefits of the Institution during the year. Of the 793 In-patients treated, 637 were discharged cured or relieved, 65 died, and 91 remained at the end of the year. Of the 112 Inmates of the Benevolent Asylum, 8 died, 40 were discharged or left of their own accord, and 65 remained. It will be observed that the number of Inmates of the Benevolent Asylum has increased from 87 in 1865, to 112 during the past year; and that the number remaining is much larger than it was. was expected; and the number is likely to increase still more There are now 155 persons in the House. for a time.

Of the In-patients admitted, 269 were Natives of England; 210, Ireland; 77, Scotland; 89, Victoria; 15, Switzerland; 12, Germany; 1, Hanover; 2, Nova Scotia; 1, Newfoundland; 3, Tasmania; 3, America; 3, Iudia; 2, China; 1, Schleswig; 3, Denmark; 2, Aboriginal; and the remainder unknown.

There were admitted, 304 Episcopalians; 215, Roman Catholics; 75, Presbyterians; 51, Wesleyans; 11, Baptists; 3, Independents; 19, Lutherans; 3, Calvinists; 3, no religion; and the remainder unknown.

The principal cases treated have been Fractures, 50; Contusions, 44; Wounds, 38; Rheumatism, 92; Consumption, 37; Bronchitis, 24; Ophthalmia, 27; Disease of Heart, 22; Pneumonia, 15; Cancer, 15; Simple Fever, 14; Ulcer, 20; Burns, 11; Hydatid, 7; Dehrium Tremens, 8; Phlegmon, 22; Paralysis, 27; Stricture of Urethea, 15; Dislocation, 5; and so on, as per list attached.

The Receipts from all sources have been £8734 8s. 1d., and the payments £8080 15s. 11d., leaving an apparent balance of £653 12s. 2d.—An apparent balance, because there are liabilities on uncompleted contracts in connection with the building amounting to nearly the whole of the balance in hand. Of the amount expended, £1618 3s. 7d. has been in connection with new buildings and alterations, to meet the necessity for increased accommodation. The Committee have exercised a vigilant and careful supervision over the expenditure; and they take credit to themselves for a successful result. On the average of the year, some of the principal necessaries have been, as is well known, at an unusually high rate, which has prevented the average cost per head for maintenance being much reduced, but there is still a favorable result.

At the beginning of the year the Committee were compelled to make arrangements to relieve the overcrowding of the main building, by the construction of a temporary ward under the shed at the rear; and this having been done, efforts were made to get a suitable grant from the Government for the erection of additional buildings. Finally a grant of £1200 was obtained; and although the Committee did not get quite as much as they could have wished, they have, on the whole, reason to be satisfied with the action of the Government in the matter. Great assistance in urging the claims of the Institution was given by the Members of the district, particularly by Messrs. Richardson and Cunningham.

But the £1200 grant was conditional on a certain amount of private contributions being given, and the Committee had, therefore, to make a special appeal to the public. This appeal was met by a most liberal, warm, and gratifying response; and any trouble and anxiety the Committee had was amply compensated for by the way in which contributions were so freely A sum of £1049 3s. 4d. was collected, and the Committee were thereby enabled to complete the splendid ward in which the Annual Meeting will be held; and which will give accommodation to 50 inmates. The Town Collections were made by the Committee; and numerous friends of the Institution undertook the Country Collections. The Committee warmly thank those friends, and also the Contributors in Town and Country, for the warm interest evinced by them in the success and prosperity of the Institution.

It is gratifying to note, also, that the subscriptions for maintenance have increased, which, indeed, was and will be necessary, in consequence of the increased number of Patients. The Committee point with great pride to the usual and special Subscription Lists attached.

The usual Financial Statement and Statistical Information will accompany this Report; and the Committee hope that the operations of the year will be viewed with as much satisfaction by the Subscribers as they have been by themselves.

Drs. Shaw and Walshe have again rendered efficient service as Honorary Medical Officers, and the Committee beg to tender them their warm thanks for their liberal assistance.

In concluding, it is due to Mr. Reid, the Resident Surgeon, to state that in his department the Institution has fully maintained the reputation of being one of the most successful of the kind in the Colony. Moreover, the Committee desire to express their sense of satisfaction at the way the Secretary, Mr. Middlemiss, has continued to discharge his duties during the year, which has made unusual demands on his zeal and assiduity.

GENERAL BILLES.

T. That the objects of the Infirmary be to afford Medical and OBJECTS. Surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, for a limited number of paying patients, and for casualties: but that no person who shall meet with casualties, and shall be found able to pay for Surgical aid. shall receive further than temporary gratuitous assistance. That the object of the Benevolent Asylum be the reception of the poor and distressed, with a view to afford them consolation and assistance.

II. That a portion of the Building shall be set apart for the Appropriation of purposes of the Infirmary; and the remainder for the purposes of the Renevolent Asylum, at the discretion of the Committee.

TIT. That the Government of the Institution shall be vested in a Institution, governed. President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, a Treasurer, Governors, and Subscribers, as hereinafter described.

QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND STIBSCRIBERS.

IV. That every Benefactor of £50 or upwards be a Life-Governor, Governors. and every annual Contributor of £20 an Annual Governor, with liberty of having one in-patient, or three out-patients, always on the books of the Institution, subject to the approval of the Committee of Management hereinafter mentioned, and provided that the funds of the Institution admit of the reception of such patients; and any public Institution contributing £50 in one sum shall be entitled to the privilege of a Governor for ten years from the date of such contribution.

V. That the Executor, or if more than one, the first named Executors, where Executor under any will by which a bequest of £50 or upwards shall be made to the Institution: and every Minister raising by one or Ministers raising more collections in his Church, in any one year, the sum of £20 or upwards; and any other person contributing a similar amount from any other source, shall have the rights and privileges of a Governor for one year only, commencing from the January following.

VI. That every benefactor of £25 or upwards, in one sum, be a Subscribers. Life-Subscriber, with liberty of having one in-patient and three out-

patients admitted annually; and every contributor of £1 1s. and unwards annually, an Annual Subscriber, with liberty of having patients admitted as follows :-- Annual Subscribers of £1 1s. to have One In-patient's Ticket and Two Out-patients' Tickets; of £2 2s. Two In-patients and Four Out-patients'; of 23 3s. Three In-patients' and Six Out-patients'; of £5 5s. and so on up to £20, One In-patient's and Two Out-patients' Tickets for every additional £1 1s. Recommendations for admission to be subject to the approval of the House Committee, and to be made by Tickets only, to be issued by the Secretary or Collector, to Subscribers, at the time of their becoming such, and provided that whenever any recommendation cannot be acceded to, from want of room or other cause appearing to the Committee, the ticket used in such recommendation shall be reclaimable by the Subscriber issuing the same. Subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the Secretary. of exchanging out-patients' tickets for in-patients', and vice versaone in-patient's ticket being equivalent to three out-patients'. These tickets shall only be used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for Medical attendance; and shall only be available till 31st January in the year after that in which they are issued,

That the Annual Subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the first day of January, in each year, and no Governor or Subscriber will be entitled Subscribers enti- to any privilege until the subscription be paid. And no person shall be qualified to vote at any meeting of Subscribers, unless he shall have been a Subscriber for the space of six months previous to such meeting: provided always, that where a Subscriber shall have paid his Subscription for the year immediately preceding the year in which any public meeting shall take place, the payment of his Subscription for the then current year at any time before such meeting, shall entitle such Subscriber to vote, as required by Act of Council, 24 Vic., No. 116.

Vice-Presidents, Trustees, Treasurer, and Eighteen Governors or Subscribers, to be elected annually; six to form a quorum; and thev shall have power to fill up vacancies that may occur in their number during the year, subject to Rule XIV.

XII. XVI. The Committee of Management shall direct the general Committee of Mabusiness of the Institution; shall frame Bye-Laws for its internal regulation, the same not being repugnant to the General Rules; Their duties and shall have power to enter into all necessary contracts on behalf of the Institution, and direct payments to be made; and appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the Institution. They shall meet at the Institution on the first Wednesday in every month,

and on such other days as they may appoint. They shall have power o admit patients, and to make regulations respecting them. The Chairman of Committee, in case of any equality of votes, to have a casting vote, but no deliberative vote.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

Their qualifica-

XXI. The Honorary Medical Staff shall consist of four duly qualified general practitioners, to be elected annually. No one shall be eligible for the appointment unless he can produce a diploma from a recognised British University, or from one of the Royal Colleges of Surgeons of London, Edinburgh, or Dublin, or the Faculty of Physicians of Glasgow, together with a certificate from the Medical Board of Victoria.

Charge of Pa. XXII. The Resident Surgeon shall have the charge of all tients and visit patients admitted; but the Honorary Medical Staff may visit the Institution at any time, and in case of their observing any neglect of, or inattention to, the patients it shall be their duty to report the same to the House Committee forthwith.

Rotation of duty. XXIII. Two of the Honorary Medical Staff shall attend in weekly rotation, on such days, and at such hours as may be most convenient, for consultation on the treatment of the patients; and they shall arrange the rotation of attendance.

XXIV. RESIDENT SURGEON.

1. No Candidate shall be eligible for the appointment of Resi- Qualifications. dent Surgeon unless he produces a diploma from either of the Royal Colleges of Surgeons of London, Edinburgh, or Dublin, together with a Certificate from the Medical Board of Victoria.

2. He shall reside in the house, and shall not leave it except on Regulations renecessary occasions. He shall not be absent more than three hours specting absence, at one time, or after Twelve o'Clock at night, without the express leave of the House Committee. In case of absence, he shall inform the House Steward and Dispenser, and shall enter in a book kept for the purpose where he may be found.

N.B.—He and the House Steward and Dispenser shall never be absent at the same time.

3. He shall have the charge of all patients admitted, and shall Charge of the Pareport to the House Committee at its next meeting any patient who may have been disorderly. He shall make a special report to the House Committee on every patient who may have been two months Patients'2 months in the Institution; and he shall also report any case that may, after consultation, be considered incurable by the Honorary Medical Staff, Incurable cases to to be dealt with as the Committee may see fit.

He shall have charge of, and keep the surgical instruments in cannertuments, proper order; and shall be accountable for the medicines, medical charge of them, and surgical instruments, utensils and stores, except such as are in inventory of charge of the House Steward and Dispenser, or Matron; and he shall prepare an inventory in the month of December in every year. and at such other times as the Committee may direct, of all furniture, utensils, medicines and stores, under his charge, and such inventory shall be recorded from year to year, in a book to be kept for that purpose.

He shall enter regularly, in proper books to be kept for such purposes, the names of the patients as they are admitted and discharged, and note the nature and the history of their diseases while under treatment; the receipt, issue, and expenditure, loss or breakage, of medicines, medical Instruments, and other things in his charge, and the disbursement of petty cash; and he shall have such books ready at all times for the inspection of the House Committee; and he shall attend the weekly meetings of the House Attend the week- Committee ; and he shall receive all money and other property ly meetings of the House Com- belonging to patients, and shall account for the same weekly to the Patients' money. - Visit each patient -complaints. 7. He shall visit each patient morning and evening, and shall enquire if the treatment prescribed has been attended to, and if any cause of complaint exist. Should any patient have a complaint to prefer, he shall enter it immediately in the Patients' Complaint Book, in the presence of the Wardsman or Nurse of the Ward, and he shall lay such book before the House Committee at each meeting.

Condition of the Wards, &c.

8. He shall on his visits to the Wards, examine their condition with respect to cleanliness, temperature; and ventilation; and he shall observe if the Wardsmen and Nurses have done their duty.

38. They shall be careful to collect and carry to the House to attend at the Steward and Dispenser all empty phials, gallipots, bandages, &c.; and to the Matron any article of diet not consumed by the patients; and they shall attend at the Dispensary at the time appointed to receive medicines and instructions.

39. They shall watch attentively the state and symptoms of the and symptoms, patients, more especially in urgent or uncommon eases, and report these distinctly to the Resident Surgeon, or in his absence to the House Steward and Dispenser; or in case of females to the Matron.

Any patient having any cause of complaint shall make the Regulations respecting com. same known to the Resident Surgeon, whose duty it shall be to enter plaints. such complaint immediately, in the presence of the Nurse or Wardsman of the Ward, in a book kept for that purpose, which book shall be laid before the House Committee at each meeting,

49. Patients judged by the Resident Surgeon sufficiently convalescent to be able to assist in the work of the institution shall be so employed.

50. Patients shall not sit up after Eight o'clock in the winter. or Nine o'clock in the summer; and all patients considered by the Resident Surgeon able to do so, shall rise by Seven o'clock in the summer, and before Eight o'clock in the winter.

Venereal patients

51. No venercal patients shall be admitted a second time, having been once under treatment and cured.

52. Every patient offending against the above Regulations will ing against the be discharged for irregularity.

VISITORS.

When admitted; visits limited to one hour.

53. Visitors are admitted into the Institution on Sunday and Thursday in each week, between the hours of three and five o'clock in the afternoon, but no visitor is allowed to remain more than one hour. Not more than two visitors will be admitted to see each patient, except on special occasions, and by the leave of the Resident Surgeon, or Secretary.

Special visits.

54. Visitors may be admitted on special occasions by a written order from a member of the House Committee, addressed to the Resident Surgeon or Secretary.

Regulations specting visits.

55. Visitors will not be allowed to go into any ward without the leave of the Resident Surgeon or Secretary; and every visitor must retire when requested.

56. They will not be permitted to give to, or leave with any patient any money, medicines, food, or liquor of any kind, nor any other thing without the express sanction of the Resident Surgeon. Any one doing so will not be again admitted.

Not to give money or gratuity.

57. No Visitor shall give to any servant of the Institution any money or gratuity of any kind.

Not to interfere, &c.; quietness.

58. Visitors are requested not to interfere with the Wardsmen or Nurses, and not to disturb the patients by loud talking or unnecessary noise.
