That it be an instruction to the new Committee, to enquire into the alleged roughness and uncourteous behaviour of the Resident Surgeon to the patients generally, and to the charges made by Dr. Pincott, and more particularly in reference to a written charge by James Wilson, of neglect, and unnecessary abuse; and to report the result of such enquiry, to a Special Meeting of Subscribers, to be called within a month from this date. A vote of thanks was accorded to the Chairman, and the Meeting broke up.

Proceedings of a Special Meeting of Subscribers, held at the Institution, on Friday, 14th February, 1868.

HIS WORSHIP THE MAYOR OF GEELONG,

IN THE CHAIR.

The Chairman explained that the Meeting had been called in accordance with a resolution passed at the Annual Meeting, to hear a Report from the Committee on the result of the investigation of certain charges made by Drs. Day and Pincott against Mr. Reid, the Resident Surgeon.

The Report, after stating how the investigation had been conducted by the examination of witnesses, in support of the charges, and rebutting testimony adduced by Mr. Reid, embodied the following resolution:—

That the Committee are unanimously of opinion that the charges against Mr. Reid have not been substantiated, and your Committee cannot allow this opportunity to pass, without giving expression of their feeling of undiminished confidence in the zeal and ability of Mr. Reid, the Resident Surgeon.

REV. ASTLEY COOPER, moved, and

Mr. HENRY MEAKIN, seconded-

That the report and finding of the Committee be approved and adopted.

After some discussion the motion was put by the Chairman. There being no amendment, he declared the motion carried, by forty-seven voting for it, and none against it.

The Meeting then broke up.

# SIXTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

# COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

OF THE

# Geelong Infirmany and Benevolent Asylum,

1867.

The Committee report that during the past year the Institution has continued to minister relief to a very large number of persons, who have found itnecessary to seek its aid, in a manner which must be satisfactory to all.

There have been admitted during the year, 746 in-patients and 27 inmates of the Benevolent Asylum; which, added to the number remaining at the end of 1866, viz., 91 patients, and 65 inmates, gives a total of cases treated in the House of 929. 1,630 Out-patients also received medical and surgical advice and medicines. In all, 2,559 cases have received the benefits of the Institution during the year. Of the 837 inpatients, 89 died, 748 were discharged cured or relieved, and 89 remained at the end of the year. Of the 92 inmates, 12 died; 35 left of their own accord, and 45 remained. Thus 131 remained in the house on 31st December.

The daily average number in the Home has been 154-25.

The principal cases treated have been—Contusions, 36; Fractures, 48; Typhoid Fever, 26; Consumption, 49; Rheumatism, 102; Opthalmia, 38; Wounds, 33; Phlegmon 28; Pneumonia, 13; Paralysis, 15; Stricture, 15; Bronchitis, 18; Cancer, 15; &c., &c. The deaths have been from—Consumption, 24; Bronchitis, 3; Typhoid Fever, 10; Cancer, 5; Heart Disease, 5; Pneumonia, 2; Fractures, 6; Burns, 2; Congestion of Brain, 2; Dysentery, 3; Wounds, 3; &c., &c.

While mentioning the treatment of cases, the Committee refer with regret to a burden which is imposed on this Institution by residents of other districts where Hospitals exist, coming, or being sent to Geelong for change of air, and finally, when death is certain, being recommended for admission to the Hospital. The Committee have, in their discretion, from time to time refused admission to patients from other districts, but it has been impossible, for humanity's sake, to do so in all cases.

Of the patients admitted during the year, 308 were of the Church of England; 265 Roman Catholics; 109 Presbyterians; 55 Wesleyans; 12 Lutherans; 8 Baptists; 6 Independents; 3 Chinese, 1 Jew, and the remainder unknown.

275 were natives of England; 239 Ireland; 110 Victoria; 82 Scotland; 9 Wales; 8 Germany; 8 Switzerland; 4 Tasmania; 3 Prussia; 3 China; 4 born at sea; 6 France; 2 Newfoundland; 1 Portugal; 1 Norway; 1 Canada; 1 Holland; 1 Jamaica; 1 America; 1 Denmark; 1 Sweden; 1 Austria; 1 Cape of Good Hope.

The receipts from subscriptions have been of the usual satisfactory character, enabling the Committee to claim the whole of the promised Government-grant. But the Committee regret that this latter, owing to the political crisis, has been unavailable, so that it has been necessary to obtain an overdraft from the Bank of Australasia of £1,360 14s. 6d., besides leaving unpaid accounts, amounting to £220 11s. 11d. The Committee have to thank the authorities of the Bank for enabling them to continue to the present time to receive the full compliment of patients. But it is manifestly impossible that this assistance should be much longer continued. There is now £2,000 due by the Government, which would meet the liabilities if it were obtainable.

The new Ward was completed, and occupied at the beginning of the year, and a marked improvement in the facility for treatment of patients with successful results, was the immediate consequence of the doing away with the overcrowding of the wards.

The usual statistical and financial information will be published with this report, and the committee do not think it necessary to add more than that Drs. Shaw, Mackin, and Walshe, have rendered such effectual service, as Honorary Medical Staff, as to entitle them to the thanks of the Committee and the Subscribers. They offer themselves for re-election.

With regard to the Salaried Officers of the Institution, the Committee have but to re-echo the report of last year, which was expressive of the utmost satisfaction at the manner in which the several Officers have discharged their duties.

# GENERAL RULES.

I. That the objects of the Infirmary be to afford Medical and OBJECTS. Surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, for a limited number of paying patients, and for casualties; but that no person who shall meet with casualties, and shall be found able to pay for Surgical aid shall receive further than temporary gratuitous assistance. That the object of the Benevolent Asylum be the reception of the poor and distressed, with a view to afford them consolation and assistance.

II. That a portion of the Building shall be set apart for the Appropriation of the Building. purposes of the Infirmary; and the remainder for the purposes of the Benevolent Asylum, at the discretion of the Committee.

III .- That the Government of the Institution shall be vested in a Institution how President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, a Treasurer, Governors, and Subscribers, as hereinafter described.

#### QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

IV. That every Benefactor of £50 or upwards be a Life Governor, Governors. and every annual Contributor of £20 an Annual Governor, with liberty of having one in-patient, or three out-patients, always on the books of the Institution, subject to the approval of the Committee of Management hereinafter mentioned, and provided that the funds of the Institution admit of the reception of such patients; and any public Institution contributing £50 in one sum shall be entitled to the privilege of a Governor for ten years from the date of such contribution.

V. That the Executor, or if more than one, the first-named Executors, where Executor under any will by which a bequest of £50 or upwards shall be made to the Institution: and every Minister raising by one or Ministers raising more collections in his Church, in any one year, the sum of £20 or apwards; and any other person contributing a similar amount from any other source, shall have the rights and privileges of a governor for one year only, commencing from the January following.

VI. That every Benefactor of £25 or upwards, in one sum, be a Subscribers. Life Subscriber, with liberty of having one in-patient and three out-

patients admitted annually; and every contributor of £1 1s. and upwards annually, an Annual Subscriber, with liberty of having patients admitted as follows: -Annual Subscribers of £1 1s. to have One In-patient's Ticket and Two Out-Patients' Tickets; of £2 2s. Two In-patients and Four Out-patients'; of £3 3s. Three In-patients' and Six Out-patients'; of £5 5s. and so on up to £20, One In-patients' and Two Out-patients' Tickets for every additional £1 1s. mendations for admission to be subject to the approval of the House Committee, and to be made by Tickets only, to be issued by the Secretary or Collector, to Subscribers, at the time of their becoming such, and provided that whenever any recommendation cannot be acceded to, from want of room or other cause appearing to the Committee, the ticket used in such recommendation shall be reclaimable by the Subscriber issuing the same. Subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the Secretary of exchanging out-patients' tickets for in-patients', and vice versaone in-patient's ticket being equivalent to three out-patients'. These tickets shall only be used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for Medical attendance: and shall only be available till 31st January in the year after that in which they are issued.

VII.—That the Annual Subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the first day of January, in each year, and no Governor or Subscriber will be entitled to any privilege until the subscription be paid. And no person shall be qualified to vote at any meeting of Subscribers, unless he shall have been a Subscriber for the space of six months previous to such meeting; provided always, that where a Subscriber shall have paid his Subscription for the year immediately preceding the year in which any public meeting shall take place, the payment of his Supscription for the then current year at any time before such meeting, shall entitle such Subscriber to vote, as required by Act of Council, 24 Vic., No. 116.

Annual Meeting of Subscribers, VIII. There shall be an Annual Meeting of the Subscribers in the month of January in each year, at which all retiring Honorary Officers of the Institution shall be elected for the ensuing year.

Persons not qualified to vote. IX. That no person shall vote at any meeting while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the Institution.

General Laws.

X. That no general law, nor any repeal of, or alteration in, the existing laws shall be valid, unless the same shall have been passed at the Annual or Special Meeting of the Subscribers.

Committee of Management. XI. The Committee of Management shall consist of the President, Vicc-Presidents, Trustees, Treasurer, and Eighteen Governors or Subscribers, to be elected annually; six to form a quorum; and they shall have power to fill up vacancies that may occur in their number during the year, subject to Rule XIV.

XII. It shall be competent at any time for the Committee of Special Meetings Management, at which at least eight members shall be present, or for nine or more Subscribers, by a writing under their hands, to require the Secretary to summon, at the expiration of fourteen days. a Special Meeting of Subscribers, the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such Special meeting, except that for which it shall have been summoned. Every such meeting to be called by the Secretary, by advertisement on one of the public newspapers published in Geelong, within three days of his receiving such requisition. Twelve Subscribers shall be necessary to form a General or Special Meeting.

XIII. That all Meetings of Subscribers be called by the Meetings of Sub-Secretary, by advertisement in one of the newspapers published in Geelong, at least one week before the day of meeting.

XIV. In the event of any vacancy in the office of President, Honorary Officers Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Trustees, or Auditors, the Election of a successor shall take place at a Special Meeting of Subscribers, to be convened by the Committee of Management, which Election shall be by voting tickets, as enjoined by Act of Council, 11 Vic., No. 59, section 9.

XV. And it shall be lawful at all Meetings of Subscribers, for vote by Proxy. any Life-Governor or Life-Subscriber who became such previous to 1861, as enjoined by Act of Council, to Vote by Proxy, such Proxy being also a Subscriber duly qualified; provided that such Proxy shall have his authority in writing, signed by the Governor or Subscriber; and such authority shall only extend to the one meeting especially named therein. No one shall be eligible for the appointment unless he can produce a diploma from a recognised British University, or from one of the Royal Colleges of Surgeons of London, Edinburgh or Dublin, or the Faculty of Physicians of Glasgow, together with a certificate from the Medical Board of Victoria.

Charge of Pa. XXII. The Resident Surgeon shall have the charge of all tients and visit patients admitted; but the Honorary Medical Staff may visit the ing.

Institution at any time, and in case of their observing any neglect of, or inattention to, the patients it shall be their duty to report the same to the House Committee forthwith.

Rotation of duty. XXIII. Two of the Honorary Medical Staff shall attend in weekly rotation, on such days, and at such hours as may be most convenient, for consultation on the treatment of the patients; and they shall arrange the rotation of attendance.

XXIV. The Honorary Medical Staff of the week shall attend for Consultation consultation on all important cases; and should any capital operation be deemed necessary the whole of the Honorary Medical Staff shall be summoned for further consultation (except in cases of emergency) previous to the operation being performed, when, if then decided on, the whole of the Honorary Medical Staff shall be requested to attend.

#### PATIENTS.

#### Admission of Patients into the Infirmary.

XXV. That accidents and such cases of decided emergency only, Admission as in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon cannot be delayed, be received into the Infirmary at any time without ticket; but that the admission of patients, in ordinary cases, be restricted to Monday and Thursday in each week, or at special meeting of the House Committee, and then only on presenting a Subscriber's Ticket.

#### Admission of Paying Patients.

XXVI. The Paying Patients be admitted on the usual days of Patients admission, without ticket, at the discretion of the Committee.

XXVII. That the amount chargeable to each patient shall be at Amount the discretion of the Committee; and shall be paid in advance, or at the discretion of the Committee.

XXVIII. That the general rules and regulations of the Institution Rules applicable shall be applicable to, and strictly observed by, all paying patients received into the Institution.

#### Persons not Admissible.

XXIX. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no Persons admissible. person insane; no one having a contagious or infectious disease: no one subject to epilepsy; nor any one who, in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon, might receive equal benefit as an out-patient, shall be admitted; and no child under five years of age shall be admitted, except from an accident, or for a surgical operation. Provided that the House Committee or Officers of the Institution shall have discretionary power to admit such prohibited cases, and shall report upon the exercise of such power at any time to the next General Meeting of the Committee of Management.

#### Admission of Inmates into the Benevolent Asylum.

RENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

XXX. The admission of Inmates into the Benevolent Asylum is Admission ٥f ordinarily restricted to Monday and Thursday in each week, but a

meeting of the House Committee may be convened at any time to consider authentic cases of utter destitution.

Persons not admissible.

XXXI. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no person insane; no child under twelve years of age, no one having a contagious or infectious disease, shall be admitted.

Ministers of Religion.

XXXII. Ministers of Religion shall have free access to persons of their respective denominations, at such times as shall be appointed by the Committee of Management; and when a patient requests that any minister may be sent for, his wish shall be immediately complied with.

Religious Instruction. XXXIII. That the Instruction of the Patients in the Institution be left to the recognised religious teachers of the various denominations to which the patients belong; and it shall be understood that controversial works be prohibited.

#### SECRETARY.

His duties.

XXXIV. He shall attend all Special, General, and Committee Meetings; he shall take minutes of the proceedings, and transcribe them carefully into books to be kept for that purpose, and he shall carry out the directions of such Meetings in the particulars incident to his department.

Correspondence and Accounts.

XXXV. He shall conduct the correspondence and other clerical business of his department, and he shall enter and keep the accounts of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee.

#### COLLECTOR.

Collect and Pay.

XXXVI. He shall be under the direction of the House Committee, and shall collect subscriptions and donations to the Institution, and pay over the same to the Treasurer, at least once in every week, and render account of the amount received by him since the last payment.

#### ALTERATION OF RULES.

Alteration of Rules. XXXVII. These Rules shall not be altered, except at a Special or General Meeting of Subscribers, due notice of any proposed alterations having been given, in accordance with Rule 12.

### THE INSTITUTION.

#### RESIDENT SURGEON.

- 1. No Candidate shall be eligible for the appointment of Resi-Qualifications. tient Surgeon unless he produces a diploma from either of the Royal Colleges of Surgeons of London, Edinburgh, or Dublin, together with a Certificate from the Medical Board of Victoria.
- 2. He shall reside in the house, and shall not leave it except on Regulations necessary occasions. He shall not be absent more than three hours specting absence. at one time, or after Twelve o'Clock at night, without the express leave of the House Committee. In case of absence, he shall inform the House Steward and Dispenser where he may be found.

N.B.—He and the House Steward and Dispenser shall never be absent at the same time.

3. He shall have the charge of all patients admitted, and shall Charge of the Pareport to the House Committee at its next meeting any patient who may have been disorderly. He shall make a special report to the House Committee on every patient who may have been two months Patients 2 months in the Institution; and he shall also report any case that may, after consultation, be considered incurable by the Honorary Medical Staff, to be dealt with as the Committee may see fit.

4. He shall have the general superintendence of the internal Internal control. affairs of the institution, under the direction of the House Committee.

Servants.

He shall preserve order and sobriety, and in case of insubordination or gross default of duty on the part of any servant, he shall suspend or discharge such servant until the next meeting of the House Committee; and if necessary, he shall provisionally hire a substitute for such servant so suspended or discharged, and he shall report his having done so with the cause of such suspension or discharge, to the House Committee at their next meeting; but he shall in no case absolutely discharge, or permanently hire, any servant of the Institution, without the sanction of the House Committee.

Medicines, mediinventory them.

5. He shall have charge of, and keep the surgical instruments in calinstruments, proper order: and shall be accountable for the medicines, medical charge of them, and surgical instruments, utensils and stores, except such as are in charge of the House Steward and Dispenser, or Matron: and he shall prepare an inventory in the month of December in every year, and at such other times as the Committee may direct, of all furniture, utensils, medicines and stores, under his charge, and such inventory shall be recorded from year to year, in a book to be kept for that purpose.

Books to be kept.

6. He shall enter regularly, in proper books to be kept for such purposes, the names of the patients as they are admitted and discharged, and note the nature and the history of their diseases while under treatment; the receipt, issue, and expenditure, loss or breakage, of medicines, medical Instruments, and other things in his charge, and the disbursement of petty cash; and he shall have such books ready at all times for the inspection of the House Committee; and he shall attend the weekly meetings of the House Attend the week. Committee; and he shall receive all money and other property ly meetings of belonging to patients, and shall account for the same weekly to the House Committee.

7. He shall visit each patient morning and evening, and shall enquire if the treatment prescribed has been attended to, and if any cause of complaint exist. Should any patient have a complaint to prefer, he shall enter it immediately in the Patient's Complaint Book, in the presence of the Wardsman or Nurse of the Ward, and he shall lay such book before the House Committee at each meeting.

Condition of the Wards, &c.

8. He shall on his visits to the Wards, examine their condition with respect to cleanliness, temperature, and ventilation; and he shall observe if the Wardsmen and Nurses have done their duty.

Bed-tickets.

9. He shall affix to the bed of each patient a card, stating the patient's name, age, religion, disease, date of admission, and diet.

10. He shall write, or cause to be written, upon every medicine Medicines, partidispensed by him, or the Dispenser, the name of the patient for whom it is prescribed, and the time at, and the manner in, which it is to be administered, and this however frequently the same medicine may be repeated; and he shall cause the medicines to be administered as directed; and he shall keep, or cause to be kept, a proper supply of the necessary apparatus for cases of accident or emergency, ready for immediate use.

- 11. He shall inspect the diet of the patients, and see that it is Inspect diet, etc. of good quality, and properly prepared and such as is ordered; and that the patients do not partake of food, liquor, or medicines, except that prescribed.

He shall procure such articles in small quantities, in his Topurchase small department, as may be required during the week; but he shall not purchase any article, or enter into any contract for the Institution, exceeding £2, without the sanction of the Committee; and he shall, on the last days of February, May, August and November, prepare List of Medicines and submit to the House Committee, a list of medicines, medical or surgical instruments, utensils and stores, as may be required during the ensuing quarter.

#### HOUSE STEWARD AND DISPENSER.

16. The House Steward and Dispenser shall live in the House, Regulations and shall not leave, except on necessary occasions, and with the consent of the Resident Surgeon. He shall not be absent for more than three hours at one time, nor after ten o'clock at night, without the leave of the House Committee.

- 23. She shall see that the Nurses and Female Servants do their Superintendence duty; and shall report any neglect or disobedience of orders on their part to the House Steward and Dispenser.

- 24. She shall visit each Ward daily, and shall see that the beds, visit and inspect linen, and clothes, of the patients, are clean and in good order; and shall cause such of the bedding, &c., as require it to be replaced by others, and thoroughly cleansed and repaired where necessary.

- 27. She shall personally superintend the Cooking of all food for To superintend the cooking. the inmates; and shall generally discharge the duties of Matron as shall be directed by the Committee.

#### WARDSMEN, NURSES AND SERVANTS.

- 28. The Wardsmen and Nurses shall be constantly in their Attendance Wardsmen and Wards, and regular in their attendance upon the patients. Nurses.
- 29. They shall obey the Resident Surgeon, House Steward and Their deportment; Dispenser, and Matron. They shall behave with tenderness to all the patients, with civility and respect to strangers; they shall withdraw from the Wards when the House Committee enter them, unless particularly requested to remain; and they shall take no presents or gratuity in money or otherwise from their patients, their friends, or strangers, who may visit the Institution, on any pretence whatever. Infringement of the Rule will subject to instant dismissal.

38. They shall be careful to collect and carry to the House Empty phials, &c. Food not used; Steward and Dispenser, all empty phials, gallipots, bandages, &c.; to attend at the Dispensary for and to the Matron any article of diet not consumed by the patients : Medicines. and they shall attend at the Dispensary at the time appointed to receive medicines and instructions.

They shall watch attentively the state and symptoms of the Watch and report patients' state patients, more especially in urgent or uncommon cases, and report and symptoms. these distinctly to the Resident Surgeon, or in his absence to the House Steward and Dispenser; or in case of females to the Matron.

Not more than two visitors will be allowed to see each patient, except on special occasions, and by the leave of the Resident Surgeon, or Secretary.

Special Visits.

54. Visitors may be admitted on special occasions by a written order from a member of the House Committee, addressed to the Resident Surgeon or Secretary.
