# Geelong Insigmany and Benevolent Asylum, 1868.

By way of report on the operations of the Institution for the past year, the Committee deem it unnecessary to do more than refer to the statistics which follow, which bear ample testimony to the great benefits rendered by the Institution, under the good providence of Almighty God, during the year.

Two thousand seven hundred and sixty-two persons have received the benefits of the institution during the year, viz.:—

Out-Patients ... ... 1791

--- 2762

An increase of 42 in-patients and 161 out-patients. 741 were discharged cured or relieved, 65 died, and 159 remained in the House on 31st December, 1868.

The average rate per cent. of deaths being under seven is a gratifying record.

The daily average number of patients in the House has been 157.

The principal cases treated were—Rheumatism, 87; Fracture, 53; Consumption, 49; Ophthalmia, 38; Bronchitis, 22; Cancer, 25; Contusions, 31; Debility and old age, 26; Abscess, 12;

Fever, 28; Stricture, 11; Sprain, 15; Tumor, 9; Wounds, 32; Paralysis, 19; Disease of Heart, 11; Pleurisy, 23; Pneumonia, 9; and so on, as per list attached. Operations have been numerous, and some of them of a very serious nature. The results have been most satisfactory. The Committee, however, regret to state that for the first time for eleven years a death occurred from the inhalation of chloroform, preparatory to an operation being performed.

The Committee regret to have again to report that numerous cases continue to be sent from other districts; and, unfortunately, they are generally very urgent; so that, for humanity's sake, it is almost impossible to refuse admission. It is pleasing to know that the fame of the Institution, as a curative establishment, continues; but it should not be expected to take more than a fair share of cases from other districts; and this is entirely in the hands of the Subscribers who recommend for admission.

Of the patients, 336 were of the Church of England, 273 Roman Catholics, 109 Presbyterians, 111 Wesleyans, 25 Lutherans, 13 Baptists, 9 Congregationalists, 4 Jews, 2 Chinese, and the others unknown.

There were 300 natives of England, 243 of Ireland, 123 of Victoria, 96 of Scotland, 11 of Germany, 5 of Prussia, 6 of Wales, 5 of New South Wales, 9 of Switzerland, 3 of India, 2 of China, 2 of Denmark, 3 of America, 2 of Tasmania, 2 of New Zealand, 3 of France, 2 of Italy, 1 of Norway, 3 of Sweden, 1 of Austria, 1 of Mauritius, and others unknown.

The Subscription List is larger than usual; and, notwithstanding the expenditure has been large, in consequence of so much having been left undone in 1867, because of the non-receipt of the Government Grant at the usual time, the debit balance against the Institution does not exceed £100. The balance appears to be £1,574, but there is a sum due from the Government on account of the year of £1,500. The Financial Statement is appended.

A new Morgue has been erected, and many other necessary \_\_\_\_ improvements effected.

The Committee have, by visitation and vigilant examination of every feature of the management throughout the year, endeavoured to discharge the duty entrusted to them in a satisfactory manner; and they think they may unhesitatingly refer to the general results, which cannot but meet with the approval of the Subscribers.

Drs. Shaw, Mackin, and Walshe have continued to afford valuable assistance as Honorary Medical Officers. They retire in accordance with the Rules, and offer themselves for re-election.

The paid Staff of the Institution have continued to perform their respective duties in a manner which merits the approbation of the Committee and the Subscribers.

### GENERAL BILLES.

I. That the objects of the Infirmary be to afford Medical and OBJECTS. Surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, for a limited number of paying patients, and for casualities; but that no person who shall meet with casualities, and shall be found able to pay for Surgical aid shall receive further than temporary gratuitous assistance. That the object of the Benevolent Asylum be the reception of the poor and distressed, with a view to afford them consolation and assistance.

II. That a portion of the Building shall be set apart for the Appropriation of purposes of an Infirmary; and the remainder for the purpose of the the Building. Benevolent Asylum, at the discretion of the Committee.

III. That the Government of the Institution shall be vested in a Institution President, two Vice-Presidents, five Trustees, a Treasurer, Governors, and Subscribers, as hereinafter described.

#### QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

IV. That every Benefactor of £50 or upwards be a Life Governor. Governors. and every annual Contributor of £20 an Annual Governor, with liberty of having one in-patient, or three out-patients, always on the books of the Institution, subject to the approval of the Committee of Management hereinafter mentioned, and provided that the funds of the Institution admit of the reception of such patients; and any public Institution contributing £50 in one sum shall be entitled to the privilege of a Governor for ten years from the date of such contribution.

V. That the Executor, or if more than one, the first-named Executors, where Executor under any will by which a bequest of £50 or upwards shall be made to the Institution: and every Minister raising by one or Ministers raising more collections in his Church, in any one year, the sum of £20 or upwards; and any other person Contributing a similar amount from any other source, shall have the rights and privileges of a governor for one year only, commencing from the January following.

VI. That every Benefactor of £25 or upwards, in one sum, be a Subscribers. Life Subscriber, with liberty of having one in-patient and three outpatients admitted annually; and every contributor of £1 1s. and upwards annually, an Annual Subscriber, with liberty of having patients admitted as follows :- Annual Subscribers of £1 1s. to have One In-patient's Ticket and Two Out-Patients' Tickets; of £2 2s., Two In-patients' and Four Out patients'; of £3 3s., Three In-patients' and Six Out-patients'; of £5 5s., and so on up to £20, One In-patients and Two Out-patients' Tickets for every additional £1 1s. Recommendations for admission to be subject to the approval of the House Committee, and to be made by Tickets only, to be issued by the Secretary or Collector, to Subscribers, at the time of their becoming such, and provided that whenever any recommendation cannot be acceded to, from want of room or other cause appearing to the Committee, the ticket used in such recommendation shall be reclaimable by the Subscriber issuing the same. Subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the Secretary of exchanging out-patients' tickets for in-patients', and vice versaone in-patient's ticket being equivalent to three out-patients.' These Tickets shall only be used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for Medical attendance, and shall only be available till 31st January in the year after that in which they are issued.

VII. That the Annual Subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the first day of January, in each year, and no Governor or Subscriber will be entitled Subscribers enti- to any privilege until the subscription be paid. And no person shall be qualified to vote at any meeting of Subscribers, unless he shall have been a Subscriber for the space of six months previous to such meeting; provided always, that where a Subscriber shall have paid his Subscription for the year immediately preceding the year in which any public meeting shall take place, the payment of his Subscription for the then current year at any time before such meeting, shall entitle such Subscriber to vote, as required by Act of Council, 24 Vic., No. 116.

VIII. There shall be an Annual Meeting of the Subscribers in of Subscribers, the month of January in each year, at which all retiring Honorary Officers of the Institution shall be elected for the ensuing year.

Persons not qualified to vote.

IX. That no person shall vote at any meeting while he is a salaried officer or pupil of the Institution.

General Laws.

X. That no general law, nor any repeal of, or alteration in, the existing laws shall be valid, unless the same shall have been passed at the Annual or Special Meeting of the Subscribers.

XI. The Committee of Management shall consist of the President, Committee of Ma-Vice-Presidents, Trustees, Treasurer, and Eighteen Governors or nagement.

Subscribers, to be elected annually; six to form a quorum; and they shall have power to fill up vacancies that may occur in their number during the year, subject to Rule XIV.

XII. It shall be competent at any time for the Committee of Special Meetings Management, at which at least eight members shall be present, or for nine or more Subscribers, by a writing under their hands to require the Secretary to summon, at the expiration of fourteen days, a Special Meeting of Subscribers, the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in the requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such Special Meeting, except that for which it shall have been summoned. Every such meeting to be called by the Secretary, by advertisement in one of the public newspapers published in Geelong, within three days of his receiving such requisition. Twelve Subscribers shall be necessary to form a General or Special Meeting.

Accounts when to be Audited.

XX. The Accounts of the Institution shall be Audited once in every year, and presented at the Annual Meeting of Subscribers.

#### HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

Their qualification.

XXI. The Honorary Medical Staff shall consist of four duly qualified general practitioners, to be elected annually. No one shall be eligible for the appointment unless he can produce a diploma from a recognised British University, or from one of the Royal Colleges of Surgeons of London, Edinburgh, or Dublin, or the Faculty of Physicians of Glasgow, together with a certificate from the Medical Board of Victoria.

Charge of Patients and visiting.

XXII. The Resident Surgeon shall have the charge of all patients admitted; but the Honorary Medical Staff may visit the Institution at any time, and in case of their observing any neglect of, or inattention to the patients it shall be their duty to report the same to the House Committee forthwith.

Rotation of duty.

XXIII. Two of the Honorary Medical Staff shall attend in weekly rotation, on such days, and at such hours as may be most convenient, for consultation on the treatment of the patients; and they shall arrange the rotation of attendance.

XXIV. The Honorary Medical Staff of the week shall attend for Commitation consultation on all important cases; and should any capital operation he deemed necessary the whole of the Honorary Medical Staff shall be summoned for further consultation (except in cases of emergency) previous to the operation being performed, when, if then decided on the whole of the Honorary Medical Staff shall be requested to attend.

#### Admission of Patients into the Infirmary.

- 2. He shall reside in the house, and shall not leave it except on Regulations respecting absence. necessary occasions. He shall not be absent more than three hours at one time, or after Twelve o'Clock at night, without the express leave of the House Committee. In case of absence, he shall inform the House Steward and Dispenser where he may be found.

N.B.—He and the House Steward and Dispenser shall never be absent at the same time.

38. They shall be careful to collect and carry to the House Steward and Dispenser, all empty phials, gallipots, bandages, &c.; Dispensary for and to the Matron any article of diet not consumed by the patients; and they shall attend at the Dispensary at the time appointed to receive medicines and instructions.

39. They shall watch attentively the state and symptoms of the patients' state patients, more especially in urgent or uncommon cases, and report these distinctly to the Resident Surgeon, or in his absence to the House Steward and Dispenser; or in case of females to the Matron.

- 47. No patient shall give reward or gratuity to any of the Not to give reward or gratuity. Wardsmen, Nurses, or other Servants.
- 48. Any patient having any cause of complaint shall make the Regulations respecting same known to the Resident Surgeon, whose duty it shall be to enter complaints. such complaint immediately, in the presence of the Nurse or Wardsman of the Ward, in a book kept for that purpose, which book shall

be laid before the House Committee at each meeting.

Employment convalescent patients.

49. Patients judged by the Resident Surgeon sufficiently con. valescent to be able to assist in the work of the Institution, shall be so employed.

50. Patients shall not sit up after Eight o'clock in the winter or Nine o'clock in the summer; and all patients considered by the Resident Surgeon able to do so, shall rise by Seven o'clock in the summer, and before Eight o'clock in the winter.

51. No venerial patients shall be admitted a second time, having been once under treatment and cured.

#### VISITORS.

When admitted: visits limited to one hour.

53. Visitors are admitted into the Institution on Sunday and Thursday in each week, between the hours of three and five o'clock in the afternoon, but no visitor is allowed to remain more than one Not more than two visitors will be allowed to see each patient, except on special occasions, and by the leave of the Resident Surgeon, or Secretary.

Special Visits.

54. Visitors may be admitted on special occasions by a written order from a member of the House Committee, addressed to the Resident Surgeon or Secretary.

Regulations pecting visits.

55. Visitors will not be allowed to go into any ward without the leave of the Resident Surgeon or Secretary; and every visitor must retire when requested.

56. They will not be permitted to give to, or leave with any patient any money, medicines, food, or liquor of any kind, nor any other thing without the express sanction of the Resident Surgeon. Any one doing so will not be again admitted.

Not to give money or gratuity.

57. No visitor shall give to any servant of the Institution any money or gratuity of any kind.

Not to interfere. &c., quietness.

58. Visitors are requested not to interfere with the Wardsmen or Nurses, and not to disturb the patients by loud talking or unnecessary noise.

59. No Male Visitor shall visit the Wards for females without the leave of the Resident Surgeon or Secretary, and shall then only be permitted to remain a quarter of an hour.
