TWENTY-THIRD ANNUAL MEETING OF SUBSCRIBERS
TO THE
Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum,
(INCORPORATED,)

Held at the Town Hall, on Thursday, 14th January, 1874.

G. F. BELCHER, ESQ., PRESIDENT,

IN THE CHAIR.

THE Chairman called on the Secretary to read the Notice of Meeting; after which the Minutes of the previous Meeting of Subscribers were read and confirmed.

The Secretary then read the Annual Report of the Committee of Management, also the Financial Statement, duly audited.

The Chairman moved the adoption of the Report and Balance Sheet for 1874, and remarked that due reference had been made in the report just read to the liberality of those who had greatly contributed to the funds of the Institution. Especial reference was made to the Hospital Sunday Movement. He referred to certain legacies left during the year to the funds, and hoped many who had made their fortunes in the colony would remember the claims of the Hospital in their Bequests.

Mr. R. de B. Johnstone seconded the adoption of the Report, which was carried.

The following gentlemen were then elected as Office-bearers for 1875:—

President, W. Upton, Esq. Vice-Presidents, Charles Andrews, Esq., and S. V. Buckland, Esq. Hon. Treasurer, A. R. Reed, Esq. Hon. Medical Officer, E. J. Walshe, Esq. Geo. Thomas, Esq. and M. L. Dennys, Esq., were re-elected Auditors for the year.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

The following new members of Committee to fill vacancies were elected by ballot:—

Votes of thanks were accorded to the General Committee and House Committee; to the retiring President, as also to Dr. Reid and Officers of the Institution, and the meeting terminated.

TWENTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT

THE Committee of Management, in laying before the Subscribers a brief report of their proceedings during the past year, have much pleasure in testifying to the continued efficiency and usefulness of the Institution. The total number of those who have received aid has been 3,244, viz.:— 852 In-Patients, (including 29 Lunatics on remand, awaiting medical enquiry), 157 Inmates of the Benevolent Asylum, and 2,206 Out-Door Patients. The Religion of those admitted during the year has been— Church of England, 331; Roman Catholic, 257; Presbyterian 113; Wesleyans, 85; Primitive Methodists, 7; Lutheran, 17; Independents, 6; Baptists, 4; Bible Christians, 2; Jews, 1; Pagan, 1; total, 824; and the admissions have been from the following Countries—England and Wales, 300; Ireland, 231; Scotland, 90; Victoria, 157; New South Wales, 6; South Australia, 3; Germany, 11; Tasmania, 11; America, 3; Switzerland, 2; East Indies, 2; China, 1; Norway, 1; Sweden, 1; Prussia, 3; Russia, 1; Isle of Man, 1; total, 824.

By a reference to the Financial Statement for the year, (duly audited) it will be seen the receipts, including a balance of £594 os. 8d., have been £6,769 14s. 6d. There are unpaid accounts for December, 1874, amounting to £436 17s. 3d. The total expenditure for maintenance (including payments of outstanding accounts of 1873) has been £6,636 13s. 3d.; the purchase of Government Debentures, £171 3s. 1d., leaving a balance in hand of £398 15s. 5d. The sum of £4,250 has been appropriated by the Government as a Grant-in-aid to this Institution for 1874-5.

The Committee have specially to acknowledge the sum of £202 9s. from the Hospital Sunday Committee, and they avail themselves of this opportunity publicly to thank those gentlemen, both Clergy and Laity, who took such an active part in this movement, whereby so large an amount was received in collections in the various Churches, as well as through the "Employers' Subscription Lists," which were distributed among the different mercantile and other firms in the Town and Country. They also desire to express their appreciation of the special efforts of the Rev. J. D. Robertson, the Hon. Secretary to this movement.

In addition to the above the handsome sum of £63 was received from the Ven. Archdeacon Slattery, being Collections

made in the Roman Catholic Churches on Hospital Sunday, and is gratefully acknowledged.

The thanks of the Committee are also specially recorded to the Geelong Amateur Ethiopian Troupe for the large amount of £65, the net proceeds of their Entertainment given in the Mechanics' Institute; also to the Committees at Camperdown and Morrison's for the successful Entertainments given in aid of the general funds.

It is gratifying to find that the Institution (comprising under its management an Hospital for the sick and suffering, as well as a home for the aged and destitute) continues to be held in high esteem by the various Borough Councils, &c., throughout the Districts, as evidenced by the continued contributions granted by them.

The following bequests have also specially to be acknowledged, viz. :—

£99 7s. 6d. from the late A. McGillvray, Esq., of Scotland.

£53 14s 2d. from the late Mr. Hyam Moses.

Which amounts have been capitalised.

During the year application was made to the Government for the Crown Grant of Land (5 acres) on which the buildings of the Institution are erected, and such has recently been received on payment of the fee for registration thereof.

The Committee take this opportunity of sincerely thanking Mr. Raddenberry for his kindness in superintending the laying out of the grounds on the eastern and western sides, and also for his contributions of trees and plants.

The Management have to report that some months since their Collector, Mr. Harty, was seriously indisposed, and after a lengthened illness died in October last. In the following month Mr. Matthew Wright received the appointment, which it is believed will give general satisfaction to the subscribers.

They have to acknowledge, with thanks, the receipt throughout the year of the local newspapers, the "Advertiser" and "Evening Times," as also copies of the "Argus," "Age," "Leader," "Ballarat Star," &c. Likewise the kind donations of Books and Periodicals, Fruit and Flowers, contributed by many for the inmates, which are at all times most acceptable.

Monthly and weekly visitations of the General Committee and House Committee have been continued during the year, and it is a matter for congratulation that there has been almost an universal expression of satisfaction and gratitude on the part of the patients.

The Committee inform the public that every precaution is taken to give gratuitous relief only to those who are really deserving, and in the distribution of tickets they depend on subscribers giving to those only who, in their opinion, are unable to provide medical assistance for themselves.

In conclusion, the Committee would most earnestly submit the claims of this important charity to the continued support of the Subscribers and the Public generally.
