PROCEEDINGS

OF THE

TWENTY-NINTH ANNUAL MEETING OF SUBSCRIBERS

TO THE

Geelong Infirmary & Benevolent Asylum,

(INCORPORATED,)

Held at the Town Hall, Geelong, Thursday, January 13th, 1881,

S. V. BUCKLAND, Esq., in the Chair.

THE Secretary read the notices convening the meeting, &c; the minutes of the meeting held January 8th, 1880, were read and confirmed.

The Annual Report for the year 1880 was read, together with the Financial Statement, (duly audited.)

Mr. Buckland proposed, and Mr. R. de B Johnstone seconded the adoption of the Report and Balance Sheet:

Dr. Reid then rose, and made a lengthened statement referring to the clause in the Report with reference to his resignation, as being (in his opinion) incorrect, and commented at length on the conduct of the Committee of Management.

The Chairman, Mr. Buckland, replied also at considerable length, reading copies of the correspondence on the subject referred to by Dr. Reid, &c., with copies of the minutes of the General and House Committees, and a very animated discussion ensued.

Mr. Murray moved an amendment, seconded by W. Cakebread, that that portion of the Report referring to Dr. Reid (being not true) be referred back to the Committee, and that the Report be not adopted. After further discussion, which lasted a long time, the amendment was withdrawn.

The original motion was then carried.

The election of Office-Bearers then proceeded.

Mr. Goodwin proposed, and Mr. Couves seconded, that the Mayor of the Town be President for the ensuing year.

Mr. J. M. Anderson moved, and the Rev. Canon Goodman seconded, that Mr. S. V. Buckland be President.

A ballot being demanded, Messrs. Vines and Hendy were appointed Scrutineers.

The result of the voting gave Mr. Cunningham (the Mayor) 54 votes; Mr. Buckland 50.

The Chairman declared the Mayor as duly elected President of the Institution for the ensuing year, and vacated the chair, which was taken by Mr. Cunningham.

The election of 2 Vice-Presidents then proceeded by ballot, 4 being nominated, viz:—The Ven. Archdeacon Slattery, Messrs. Gillespie, Couves and Lloyd.

Messrs. Shannon and Vines were appointed Scrutineers, the result giving Mr. Gillespie 53 votes; Mr. Couves, 49; Mr. Lloyd, 47; and Dean Slattery, 45.

The two former, viz. Messrs. Gillespie and Couves, were declared duly elected as Vice-Presidents.

Mr. A. R. Reed was elected as Honorary Treasurer.

The Secretary read the letters from Drs. Croker, Walsh, and Wyer, offering their services as Honorary Medical Officers in connection with the Institution for the ensuing year; Dr. Reid's name being added after some discussion.

Mr. Goodwin moved, and Mr. Couves seconded, the election of the four medical gentlemen referred to, which was carried.

The Committee of Management.—The following nominations were then made to fill vacancies:—viz., Messrs. Buckland, Chadwick, Cakebread, Dwyer, Few, Gibson, Lane, Lloyd, Jones, Tully, Upton, and Weber, in the place of the Rev. T. McKenzie Fraser, Messrs. Chadwick, Gibson, Lane, Upton, and Weber retired.

The ballot proceeded, resulting in the election of 6 Members, who were declared duly appointed, viz:—Messrs. Lloyd, 55 votes; Dwyer, 52; Cakebread, 52; Jones, 48; Buckland, 46; Tully, 46.

Messrs. Wheatland and Whitfield were duly elected Auditors for the ensuing year as before.

THE Committee of Management, in submitting their Annual Report to the Governors and Subscribers for the year ending 31st December, 1880, give the following particulars:—During the past year there have been relieved:—

816 In-door patients
147 Inmates of the Benevolent Asylum
2359 Out-door patients

The daily average has been 181½.

Average mortality, slightly less than 7 per cent.

Total number of Inmates remaining 31st December, 1880—170.

Number of Out-door Patients under treatment, 31st December, 1880—308.

The nationalities and religions of those admitted during the past year are reported as follows:—*Birthplaces*—England, 231; Victoria, 266; Ireland, 185; Scotland, 68; Germany, 10; Tasmania, 9; Switzerland, 5; America, 3; China, 3; France, 3; Denmark, 2; Italy, 2; New South Wales, 2; Sweden, 2; South Australia, 2; Austria, 1; Finland, 1; Greece, 1; Holland, 1; Norway, 1; Queensland, 1. Total, 799. *Religions*:—Church of England, 321; Roman Catholics, 256; Wesleyans, 82; Presbyterians, 97; Baptists, 16; Lutherans, 12; Congregationalists, 3; Primitive Methodists, 3; Chinese, 2; No Denomination, 2; Unknown, 2; Calvinists, 1; Disciples of Christ, 1; Greek Church, 1. Total, 799.

The Financial Statement, duly audited, shows a total receipt of £6637 12s. 4d., exclusive of the balance in hand brought forward from the previous year; and expenditure of £5254 4s. for maintenance, as against £4816 4s. 8d. for 1879, with the average number in the house of 168, whilst that for 1880 was over 181. Expenditure for new drains, repairs to building, &c., £229 5s. 4d., the amount spent on building last year being £1347 0s. 11d. The balance in hand in the Bank of Australasia is £1802 9s. 1d.; with that, at the credit of the endowment funds, is £815 in Government debentures.

The Committee have pleasure in acknowledging the following special amounts received:—

£197 9s. from the Hospital Sunday Committee.

£41 8s. Collection in Roman Catholic Churches, per Ven. the Arch-deacon Slattery, D.D.

And other Collections kindly made in various Churches in aid of the general funds.

While there has been a falling off in the private Subscriptions, especially of those in town, the Hospital Sunday collection was larger, and the amounts forwarded from squatters and others in the country have likewise been higher. The desirability of erecting a suitable residence on the hospital grounds for the medical officer in charge was considered by the Committee, and after mature investigation it was deemed not expedient to build such at present. The Committee have had under consideration the advisability of altering the date of the financial year, as likewise the date of the annual meeting of Subscribers, and the date of payment qualifying Contributors to vote. A Sub-Committee was appointed, and information obtained on the questions from other Institutions; a lengthened discussion took place, and several suggestions were made; eventually, after fully considering the matter in all its bearings, it was not deemed expedient to alter the bye-laws hereon. The General Committee adopted the report sent up, and expressed an opinion that it might be desirable at some future date to alter the bye-laws regulating the time for payments of Subscriptions, but not now.

The Committee regret to have to record the withdrawal of Dr. Reid from the Institution, after twenty years' valued services. The Committee, believing that Dr. Reid's resignation was occasioned through misapprehension of their action, delayed accepting it from time to time, and did all in their power to induce him to withdraw it, but ultimately they were compelled to receive the resignation. They did so with great regret, realising fully the very high benefit the public and the Institution have so long enjoyed from his recognised ability and experience. Mrs. Ridley, during the past year, has been appointed as Matron in the place of Miss O'Meagher, superseded. The Committee feel that they are

under great obligation to the ministers of religion and others who have given their valued aid and assistance to the sick and dying in the wards, as well as in the public services held in the building, arranged and set aside specially for such worship.

To those Honorary Medical Officers, who during the whole or part of the past year have given their gratuitous services to the Hospital; to many who kindly remember the Patients by gifts of Books, Periodicals, and Illustrated Papers, forwarded for their use; to the Press for the following papers, gratuitously sent, viz:—*Geelong Advertiser, Geelong Times, Argus, Age, Leader, Ballarat Star, Advocate, Colac Reformer.*

There have been held during the year, 14 Meetings of the General Committee; 53 Meetings of the House Committee; 16 Meetings of the Finance Committee. The attendance of Members will be found elsewhere. The Committee cannot forget the continued kindness of those Ladies specially who, with untiring efforts, have sent weekly contributions of Flowers to the individual Patients; also to all those who, by visiting the Inmates and providing amusement in the way of musical entertainments, have materially assisted in relieving the life of those who have recourse to the Asylum. During the past year attention has been directed to the required and more general use of hot and cold water baths, and it has been decided to carry out such plans as advised, whereby improved bath accommodation will be available for all Patients and Inmates; and other improvements suggested will have the attention of the Committee in the future, in connection with the fence round the building and alterations in the kitchen, &c.

In conclusion, the Committee would earnestly recommend the claims of the charity to the more liberal support of the town and public generally, and would invite inspection at all times to see for themselves the Inmates and working of the Institution, established for the relief of the sick and suffering, as well as a home for the aged and destitute of the district.

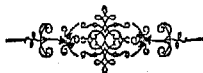
