Thur Committee of Management have the honor to submit the 32nd Annual Report of the Institution, together with the Audited Statement of Receipts and Expenditure for the year ending 31st December, 1883.

During the year 1883 the following persons have received relief, 2808, viz:-

685 In -door Patients, (of whom 154 were accident cases.)
120 Inmates of the Benevolent Asylum.
2044 Outdoor Patients.
Of the Infirmary Patients,
623 wore discharged.
00 did.
62 wore under treatment Duo. 31.st, 1888.
Of the Benovolont Inmates, 16 wore digoharged, or loft of their own accord. 28 died. 85 remained in tho House.

The average mortality, 11.5 per cent.

The tntal receipts from all sources amount to 85625 2s. 6 d ., with an expenditure of $\mathfrak{E A} 440$ 4.s. 6d. for genoral maintenance; $£ 372$ 14s 4.d. for repairs to Building, Furniture, $\& \mathrm{c}$. $\{20210 \mathrm{~s}$. has been placed to the credit of the Endowment Fund, and there is a credit balance of $£ 147$ 1s. 1ld. in the Bauk of Australasia, besides $£ 375$ due from the Government for the half-year ending 31st December, 1883.
The following amounts received during the year are spocially acknowledged with thanks :- 2125 10s. from the Hospital Sumday Fund; $\mathbb{E}^{2} 2$ from the Roman Catholic Churches, yer Venemble Archdeacon Slattery ; $£ 100$ Legacy from the late Mrs. Elizabeth Wilson; £94 Legacy from the late Mr. John Wallace; $£ 50$ from Mr. W. Branch ; £20 from Mr. George Grecian ; £39 10s net Proceeds of Entertainment by the Thursday Half-Holiday Association, per Mr. Rush ; \&23 1.0s, from the Geelong Ethiopim Troupe, per Mr. Begley.

While the private subscriptions received have been somowhat less than the previous year, the total sum, including Luegrecies, \&e., received, shows an increase of over 5200 .

It will be seen that the financial position of the Institution is highly satisfactory.

There have been held during the yoar, 15 mootings of tho General Committee, 56 meetings of the House Commititeo, 21 meetings of the Finance Committees, (besides othor Sub-Committees.) The attendance of Mombers will be found elsewhero.

The sincere thanks of the Committee aro tonded to the Honorary Medical Officers for their gratuitous and much valuod sorvices to the Hospital, to the various Ministors of Religion and others who have conducted public worship in the room set apart for that purpose, to those who haverregularly supplied Daily and Illustrittod Papers, \&c., for the gifts of Flowers generously distributed weakly to the Inmates, who greatly appreciate this kindness, and to all who have given their aid and help in promoting the comfort of those who by adverse circumstances have become the recipients of the benefits of the Institution,

The Bye-Laws have been amended during the year, and the Committee earnestly trust that the alterations will prove conducive to the satisfactory working of the Institution.

The House and Finance Committees have been unromitting in the discharge of their duties, and the general state and management; of tho Institution are such as, the Committeo hope, will be commended by the Governors and Contributors.

# AN ACT FOR HOSPITALS AND CHARITABLE INSTITTUTIONS. 

(2ND JONE, 1864.)

ACT OF THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORTA, No. 220.
The $S_{c c t i o n s ~ o n l y ~ o f ~ t h e ~ A c t ~ w h i c h ~ a r e ~ o f ~ p r e s e n t ~ p r a c t i c a l ~ i m p o r t a n c e ~}^{\text {a }}$ are here cited. Of the remaining Sections, 1, 2, and 3 relate to the Mode of Inconporation; Sections 5 and 6 to the First Meeting after Incorporation; Section 10 to the Transfer of existing Trust Property to the New Corporation; Section 16 repeals pro. tanto former Acts.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the good government of hospitals and other chaxitable iustitutions. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows-
4. Every such incorporated institution* as aforesaid shall be governed by a committes of not less than seven members, to be elected by the contributors for the time being to such institution; and.such committee or any fom of them shall have and exercise all the powers and anthorities by this Act vested in the corporation; and one fourth part of such committee or suoh fractional part as shall be nearest to one fourth part, but no more, may be honorary medial men ou the staff of such institution; and the president, vice-presidents and treasmrer of every such institution slanll by virtue of their respective offices he members of such committee.
7. It shall be competent for the corporation of any such institution to make bye-laws tor the regulation of its own proceedings, for fixing the number of votes of contributors in proportion to the amount of their contributions, for determining the validity of disputed elections and for condineting such elections, and geuerally for all matters whatsoever affecting the management of the institution not inoonsistent with the laws of this colony; but no such bye-laws shall be of any fore or effeot until one month after the same shall lave been confirmed by a genoral meeting of contributors specially convened for that puxpose and published in the Govermment Gazette. Provided that no such bye-laws shall enable any contributor to exercise more than three votes.
8. The Governor in Council may at any time revoke any suoh byelaw; and every order by which any suoh bye-law shall be revoked shall be published in the Government Gazette, and shall take effect from the time of such publication.

[^1]9. If any contributor to the support of any such incorporated institution as aforesaid shall desire to dispute the validity of any such bye-law, and shall pay into the Supreme Court the sum of fifteen pounds. as security for the costs of the proceedings hereinafler montioned, it shall be lawful for such contributor to apply to the said court upon an. affidavit of the facts for a rule calling upon the corporation to sloow cause why such bye-Iaw should not be quashed for the illegality thereof; and the said court may make the same absolute, of discharge it with or without payment of costs as to the court shall seom meet.
11. On the second Thursday in the month of January in every year one-third part of the elected members of the committee shall go out of office, but may nevertheless be re-elected; and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.
12. If any member of the committee shall die or resign by letter under his hand, addressed to the chairman of the committee, or become insolvent or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felonr, or misdemeanox, or be nbsent for four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant; and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who by the provisions of this Act are required to go out of office.
13. All notices to auy officer or member of or contributor to any present or future charitable institution whether incomporated or not, which by the charter, statutes, laws or rules (as the case may be) of such institutien for the time being are or shall be required to be given, may be served hy the same being transmitted through the post directed according to an address in this colony (to be left for that purpose by such officer, member or contributor in writing under his hand at the chief establishment of such institution) in suoh time as to admit of their delivery in the due course of post at or before such period (if any) as is or shall be prescribed by the charter statutes, laws or rules (as the case may be) for the time being of such institution for the giving of such notioes.
14. In proving such service as aforesaid it shall be sufficient to prove that such notice was so directed as aforessid, and put into a general post office in such time as aforesaid; but so nevertheless that nothing in this Act contained shall be held to render invalid any personal service of any notice, or to render necessary to the effectual service of any notice any further act, matter or thing than would have been required for the service thereof by the charter, statutes, laws or rules for the time being of the institution which the same shall concern if this Act had not been passed.
15. No notice of any intended court, bonrd meeting or election shall be required to be served either by post or otherwise on any officer or member of or contributor to eny such institution as last aforesaid who shall not have left an address in the manner at the place and for the purpose hereinbefore mentioned, anything in auy such charter, statutes, laws or rules to the contrary notwithstanding.

The following are the BYE-LAUS of THE GEELONG INFIRMARY AND BENEVOLENT ASYLUM, (Incorporated,) made by the Contributors thereof, on the 11 th day of April, 1883, and confirmed by a General Meeting of Contributors specially convened for that purpose on the $20 t h$ day of April in same year, and ${ }^{*}$

## BYE-LAWS.

1. All Bye-Laws made prior to the date of making these Bye- Bye-Lnws, Laws are hereby repealed, provided always that any regulations made or agreements entered into under Bye-Laws now in force shall be taken to have been made under these Bye-Laws, until the same is amended or rescinded.

## OBJECTS

2. That the objects of the Infirmary be to afford medical and Objects of Instisurgical aid to poor persons requining it; to a limited number of tution. paying patients whose admission under special oireumstances may be samotioned by the Committee of Management; and for casualties; but no person who shall meet with casualties and shall be found able to pay for surgical aid, shall receivefurther than temporary assistance. That the object of the Benevolent Asylum be the reception of the poor and distressed, with a view to afford them consolation and assistance.

## APPROPRIATION OF BUILDINGS.

3. That a portion of the buildings shall be set apart for the Appropriation of purpose of an Infirmary, and a portion for the purpose of the Buildings. Benevolent Asylum, at the discretion of the Committee, who shall also be empowered to permit the reception of lunatice, on remand for medical examination, in a ward erected for that purpose.

OONSTITUTION.
4. The Corporation shall consist of a President, two Vice-Presi- Constitution. dents, Treasurer, Governors, and Contributors.

Tickets will be issued by the Secretary to Subscribers at the time of payment of subscriptions; but in cases where the payment is made after the 31st of July in any year, the subscriber shall have the option of taking tickets for that or the following year. Thickets shall only be available till the B1st January in the year after that for which issued. Subseribers shall also have the privilege at any timo, on application to the Socretary, of exchanging out-patients' tickets for in-patients', and vice versa, one in-patient's tioket being equivalent to three out-patients'.

## GENERAL MEETINGS.

12. An Annual Meeting of the Contributors shall be held on the second Thursday in the month of January in every year for the following pturposes:-
(1) To recoive the report of the Committee of Management for the preceding year, and audited statemonts of recoipts and expenditure.
(2) For the election of President; Vice-Presidents, and Treasurer, Honorary Medical Staff, and Auditors, for the ensuing year.
(3) The election of Members of the Committee of Management to fill vacancies.
(4) For the transaction of any business of which notice has been given, or that may arise at such meeting.conneoted with the Iustitution.
13. If required by the Committee of Management, or upon the Special Meetings. requisition in writing of six members of the Committee or of ten Contributors, the Secretary shall, without dolay, convene a special meeting of Contributors, the oconsion of calling such meating being stated in such requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting except that for which it shall have been summoned.
14. All meetings of Contributors shall be called by the Secretary Meetings to bo by advertisemont in one or more newspapers published in Geelong, for at least one weel previous to such meeting.
15. At all meetings of Contributors, the President, or in his Chairman of absence one of the Vice-Presidents, shall take the chair ; but in their Meetings. absence the meeting shall chooge its owa shairman, who shall have $a$ casting vote only.
16. Ten contributors entitled to vote shall constitute a quorum Quorum. at all mestings of Contributors, nud as soon as a quoyum be present the chair shall be taken; but if no quorm is presont within half-muhour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjouroed for the following week at the sume day and hour.
17. Every question sumitted to a Genoral Moeting, and all Mode of Foing. elections, shall be decided by a majority of votes of Governors and Contributors present extitled to vote, and slull bo taken by show of hands, muless a ballot shall havo been previonsly demanded by any three persons entitiod to vote; in which case the voting shall be ly ballot, and for such purpose sorutineers shall bo appointed before the ballot is taken.

## COMMITTEE OF MANAGTMENT.

18. The Institution shall be governed by a Committoe, each of Constitution of Whom shall be a subseriber of not less than $\notin 1$ per annum, and shall Committee. consist of the President two Viee-Presidents, Treasurer, and eighteen Governors or Contributors, The Honorary Medical Officers of the Institution may be members of the Committee. Four members of Committee (but not including more than one of the honorary staff) shall form a quorum.
19. The names of candidates for any offices shall be adyertised in Names of Candione or more uewspapers pablished in Geelong, three clear days before the date of meeting for election. No persou shall be considered oligible for dates to be advortised. election at the anmual meeting, unless he or some ous duly anthorised on his behalf shall have given notice in writing to the Secretary at least four days before the date of such meeting, of his intention to become a candidate for one or more of the amual offices, bat no person shall hold more than one office whereby a soat at the Board may be pronted. Provided always that in the ovant of sufficiont nominations not being sent in to supply all the offees, it shall be competent for the annual meeting to disponso with the above condition, and to fill up any vacancies which may exist after the formal nominations have heon disposed of.

The President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Honorary Medimonts. cal Staff, and Auditors, shall retiro ammally from their respective offices at the anuual meeting of Contributors, but nevertholess bo eligible for re-election; and in the event of the annunl election to fill vacancies from any cause not taking place on the day appointed, they shall hold office wutil the elections take place.

Notice of all moetings shall be sent to each member by the Secretary at least twenty-four hours before the time of meating, stating any spocial busizess to be considered. contractor, directly or indireclly; but this shanl not mpply to any member of a company, partnership, or associatiou oundisting of more than twenty persons, when such contract shall bo ontered into for the general benefit of such company, partnership, or association; bat no member of the Committeo of Mruagement shinll loo present at the *discussion of, nor record his voto upon, any matter in whioh he shall, by himself or his partnexs, have any pecuniny intorest.

Powers of Committee.
25. The Committee of Managemont shall direst the genoral business of the Institution, and frame regulations for its intormal management (such regulations not to be repugnant to tho Elospital Statute and Bye-Iaws); they shall appoint and disoharge all paid offlcers and servants of the Lustitution; and enter into all necossary contracts for the supply of provisions and other artiolos; and for the repair, alteration, and extension of buildings; they shall direct the collection of the funds, and make all necessary payments in connection with the Institution. They shall superintend or give instructions, and make regulations for the admission, discharge, or dismissal of patients and inmates, in accordance with the objects of the Institution and Bye-Laws.
Sub-Committees 26. The Committes of Management shall, at its first meeting in to be appointed, each yoar, after the amual meeting of Subsoribors, choose from among themselves two Sub-Committees, ench to be composed of five members-three to form a quornm; one to be designated the fouse Committee, and the other the Finance Committee, nad, when practicable, two or more members of an old may be members of a new Committee. The Committeo of Maxagement may also at any time appoint Sub-Committees for any purpose conneoted with the Institution or its management, and may fix and alter the quorum of and continue, alter, or discoutinue, such Committees. The President and Viee-Presidents shall be ex afficio members of all Committees, and the Treasurer shall be ex officio member of the Finance Oommittee,
27. The House, Finance, or other Sub-Committee shall ap- Meetings of Sub. point their own Chairman, and meet as directed by the Bye-Laws, or Committes. as they may determine, and whenever convened by order of the Chairman. Minutes of their proceedings shall be recorded in a book, and be read to the Committee of Management at each monthly meeting.
28. The House Committeo shall meet once at the least in each Duties \& pawers weel, and oftener if necessary. They shall have power, suljeot to the approval of the Committee of Management, to admit patients, and to confirm or otherwise the admission of any cases received during the intervals of their meetings ; they shall examine into and report to the General Committee upon all complaints, and be ompowered to dismiss pationts for misconduct or breach of the rules of the Institution, recording in their minutes reasous for the non-admission or for dismissal; they may engage and disoharge servants, order necessary supplies, call for and inspect the half-yearly tenders, and recommend any to the General Committee for accoptance; they shall inspect all books conneeted with the admission and discharge of patients, receipt and issue of stores, medicines, medicois ingtruments, furniture, bedding, and supplies genorally; they, or some of their number, sholl weekly inspect the wards, Fitahen, and other portions of the Institution; they shall check the tradesmen's monthly bills and other accounts for supplies, and recommend the same to the Finance Committee for pryment; and generally shall supervise and regulate the internal management of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee of Maragement.
29. The Finance Committee shall meet at least twice in each Dnties \& powers month, and shall examine the Secretary's cash and other books of of Finmeo Comaccount, and compare same with Tronsurer's banls pass-book; they mittee. shall also compare the Collector's books, and receipt butts with adyertised list of subscriptions and donations, choek additions, sud see that the totals correspond with ench other and with the amonnts acknowledged by the Treasurer; thay shall give all needful instruotions to the Secretary and Collector with reference to keeping books of accounts and collection of subseriptions and donations, nnd shall monthly prepare an abstract of all accounts for payment, and submit the same to the Committee of Management at their monthly meetingg, and shall in conjunction with the President, or a VicePresident and Secretary, be empowered to make neoessary speoial payments in the intervals between the monthly meetings; they shall see that the vouchers connected with the previous abstract have been properly recoipted; and shall also examine the returns prepared for Government, and annuil statements of acoounts.
30. In all cases where books or vouchers are checked by the Verifying Books. House or Finance Committee, the signature of some member thereof and Accounts. shall be appended, with the date of examimation.
31. At the monthly meetings of Committee of Mauagement, Business at Com: the minutes of the previous monthly meeting, and of special meetings during the month, shall be read and confirmed, no disoussion being allowed thereon except as to their accuraoy; the minutes and reports of all Sub-Committees shall also be read, and on all questions votes shall be takion by show of hande, each member Voting. having one vote only. The Committee shall also from among themselves appoint two members (not being members of the House Committee) to be visitors for the month, who shall at the next Appoint Fistoxs, monthly meeting report the state of the Institution as found by them at their risits, At the monthly meeting in December of eaoh
year the Committee shall consider and determine the rate of salariós and wages of the officers and servants of the Institution for the ensuing year; and should vacanoies ocour, or by giving three months'
Fix Salaries, sc. notice, they shall have power to alter or amend rates of salaries aud wages then detormined upon.

Suspensions.

32. The Committee of Management may suspend any honorary medical offecr, or one or more of its own members, on any wellfounded charge, provided that such susponsion be approved of by a majority of the members present at a special meeting convened for the consideration of such charge, and provided that the suspensjon and cause thereof be reported to a general meeting of Contributors, to be specially convened for that purpose within two weeks after the order of suspension is made; and the House Committee may suspend any paid officer of the Institution, and make arrangements for the performance of the duties by other officer or person, provided the suspensiou be reported to the Committee of Management, and a meeting of suoh Committee be spedially convoned for the consideration thereof within one weels of such suspension. But in any case of intention to suspend, the person proposed to be suspended shanl have immediate notice in writing of such intention, and the reasons or causes for such, and shall have the privilege to claim and have as is customary a Board of Enquiry appointed to hear, consider and record his or her defence, and have witnesses examined for or against him or her.
33. The Committee of Manngement shall have power to invest in Government Debentures, contributions spocially given for tho purpose of endowment, or nuy bequests which in the interests of tho Institntion they consider should be capitalised.

Common seal. 36. The common seal of the Corporation shall be lrept in the Custody. iron chest at the Hospital, in a box with two different looks and lroys -oue of which shall be kept by the President, and the other by the Secretary.

37. The common saal shall not be fixed to any deod or other instrument, except by order of the Committee of Management.

## TREASURER.

38. All monies received on account of the Institution slall be paid to the Treasurer forthwith, and be deposited without delay to tho credit of the Institution, in suoh Bauls as the Oommittee may from time to time appoint.
39. Upon receipt of any monies from the Secretary or Collector, Acquittance, the Treasurer shall sign a boold, to be kept for the parpose by eroh, for the amount so paid.
40. All payments shall be made by oheques, which shanl to Payments. sigued by the President or a Vice-President, the Treasurer, und countersigued by the Secretary.
41. Previous to signing any cheque for payment the Treasurer Authonity for shall require a warrant, signed ly the President or Ohairman of the prymouts. Meeting of Committee of Management at which the acoounts were passed, and countersigned by the Secretary; special payments may nevertheless be rande during the month in accordance with Bye-Law No. 28-such special payments to be inoluded in the next wrirant passed by the Committee.
42. If any vacancy shall oceur in the office of Troasurer, the Vnenncy. Committee of Manngenent may appoint nnother to hold office until the annual meeting in January.

## THE SEORETARY AND SUPERINTENDENX.

48. He shall attend all general and special moetings of Contributors, and all metings of the General and Sub-Committees, and take minutes of the proceedings, and shall transcribe them into books to be kept for that purpose; he slall keep tho rocorde of the Institution, conduct the correspondence, call all meotings, giving proper notice thereof, and bring the business betore the same, and carry out the directions given to him by any of the Committoe.
49. He shall be responsihle for the conduct of the olerionl Kocp Accounte. business of his department, and shall keep the necensary books of acoount, under the directions of the Financo Cornmitteo; nind at onoh monthly meeting of the Committoe of Managemunt he shall snbmit the eash-book and bank pass-book of the Institution, mako up to dnte; and he shall also submit a list of subseriptions and a monthly progress balance sheet in the prescribed form, हhowing the netunl position of the Hospital funds to the end of the previous month.
50. He shall compile all needful returns, statements, and reports Propnra roturas required by Government and any of the Committees, and shall in every year make applioation by circular or otherwise, to corporate and nuply for bodies, sosiaties, squatters, and country residents, for contributions to the funds of the Institution.
51. He shall not in any way be engaged in private business; Responsibulty as and under the direction of the Committee he shall, as Superintendeat, suporintondont. be responsible for the proper government and due observance of all the rules and regulations of the Iustitution, excepting those relating to the Medicni and Surgical departments; he shall comply with the regulations which may from time to time be made with respect to the discharge of the duties of his office.
52. He shall give seourity for his frithfulness in all matters of Give Security. finance for the sum of 6250 , of some Guarantes Company, to be approved by the Committee of Management.
53. He shall have power to suepend any warder or nurse, (aftor Susponelon of consultation with the Resident Surgoon, who ghall have equal power: Sorvants, as to Warders and Nurses.) He shall also have power to suspend any other Servant of the Institution, such suspension to bo reported to the House Committee at their next meeting, and it necessary arrangements be made for the performanoe of the dutios in the interim.

## AUDITORS.

49. Two Auditors shall be appointed at the Annual Meeting of Governors and Contributors in January in each year, and the remaneration to them, if any, shall then be fixed. In defnult of such ap. pointment, or in the event of any vaconcy ocourring during the year, the Committee of Management shall make the appointment.
50. They shall have acoess to all the books and nocounts of the Institution at any time, to check the same; and shall report to the Committee of Management anything with respect to the finances and accounts which they may deem necessary to bring to notice.
51. They shall, in the first week in January in each year,

 examine the Treasurer's Annual Financial Statement, with all books, accounts and documents relating thereto, aud List of Subscriptions and Donations, and shall certify to their correctness, and make any special report thereon which they consider necossary to the Annuad Meating.
## OOLLEOTOR.

52. The Collector shall, under the direction of the Finance Committee and Seoretary, canvass for subscriptions and donations to the funds of the Institution. He shall give a printed receipt for every sum he receives, and keep a comterpart of suoh receipt in a book which shall be provided for that purpose by the Committee. He shall furnish to Contributors from whom he receives a subscription of $£ 1$ and upwards the admission tiokets (sigued by the Sucretary) to which thoy are entitled, and shall also furnish them with a copy of the Anuinal Roport of the preceding year. Ho slatl enter all sabscriptions re. ceived by him in abook specifying datos of receipt, and once at lenst
Keep duplicate Books.

Pay to Treasurer in every weelr he shat copy all enhies into a duphicate book to bo kept at the Institution. He shall pay over to the Treasurer, onoe in every week, and oftener if the recaipts exceed $\pm 20$, all monies ruceived by him, and shall furnish to the Treasurer a list of the contributions so paid over, and shall obtain the Treasurer's receipt in his book for such payments.
53. The books used by the Collector shall be provided by the

Committee, and shall be deemed to be the proparty of the Ingtitution -and the Collector shall at any time upon demand, deliver up his books and butts for examination or retention. He shall, when re. Attendancewhon quired, be in attendance at the meetings of the Finance Committee, required.

He shall give security for the faithful discharge of his duties in the sum of $£ 150$ of some Guarantee Company, to be approved by the Committee of Management. Ho shall be paid monthly, in such manner as the Committee shall determine, and shall be liable to be removed from offioe at any time without notice.

## HONORARY MEDICAL STATF.

HONORABY STAFF.

Election.
54. The Eonorary Medical Staff shall be elocted by the Gover nors and Contributors at the annual meeting in Jnunnery of each yoar; and the number to be eleeted shall be decided by such meeting, but shall not exceed four; and should a vacancy occur during the yeat then the power of filling the same shall rest with the General Committee of Management.
55. No person shall be eligible for election as an Honorary Qualification. Physioian or an Honorary Surgeon unless he shall be registered as a legally-qualified medical practitioner under any Act in force in Victoria relating to medioal practitioners, and unless he shall possess (for the office of physician) a degree from some one of the Universities of the United Kingdom, or of the Australian Colonies, or a Foreign University recoguised by them, or a Diploma from a College of Physicians in the United Kingdom; and unless he shall possess (for the office of Surgeon) a degree as Master of Surgery from some one of the aforesaid Universities, or be a member or Licentiate of some one College of Surgeons in the United Kingdom.
56. The Honorary Medical Staff shall in all respects comply with the Bye-Laws and Regulations of the Institution.

## SURGIOAT OPERATIONS, \&c.

57. No one shall be present at the time of any operation or surgical operpost mortem examination, except such persons as may be conneeted ations. with the Institution, or members of the medical profession.

## ADMISSION OF PATIENTS INTO THE INFIRMARY.

58. Aocidents, and such cases of decided emergency only, as in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon cannot be delayed, may be received in the Infirmary at any time withoat ticket; and the admission of patients, in ordinary cases, recommended by Subscribers tickets, shall be daily (Sundays excepted) between the hours of nine and twelve o'Clock in the forenoon, by the Secretary aud the Houorary Medical Staff for the week, or in the absence of such Stafi by the Secretary and Resident Surgeon; such admission to be temporary, and subject to the approval of the House Committoe at its next meeting.

## ADMISSION OF PAYING PATIENTS.

59. Paying pationts may be admitted at the discretion of the House Committee, who shall fix the weekly rate to be charged to eaoh patient, and in the event of an operation being necessary may fix a fee therefor, and may require the same to be paid in advance; and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the Institntion, and able in the estimation of the Committee to pay, shall be required to do so at such a rate as the Committee may determine. Each admission of a paying patient shall be reported to the General Committee at its next meeting, and shall be subject to confirmation.
60. The General Rules and Regulations of the Institution shall General Rules to be applicable to and be observed by all paying patients.

## ADMISSION OF INMATES INTO THE BENEVOLENT ABYLUM.

Admission to Be . nevolent Asylum.
62. The admission of inmates into the Benevolent Asylum shall be restricted to those days in each weel upon which the Honse Com. mittee meets, when applications shall be considered and decided apon. No preguant female for the purpose of confinement; no person insane; no child under twelve years of age; no one having a contagious or infectious disease shall be admitted.

## OUT-PATIENTS.

Oct-Patients.
63. Persons uafle to pay for medioines and medical attendance (or for either) but not requining admission to the house, shall be treated ass out-pationts on producing the recommendation, in proper form, of $\Omega$ Governor or Subseriber.

## IMPOSTORS.

Impostors.
64. In the event of any person in a position to pay for metical or surgical advice, or to support himself on herself elsewhere, being detected in the recaipt of the charity of the Institution, such person shall be oharged as in-patients of the Infirm@ry or Benevolent Asylum, at the rate of ten shillings per dien from date of admission; or, if an out-patient, ten shillings for each nceasion on which either of the Surgeons may have been consulted; and the Commitites may order the removel of such person from the Institution, provided the case is not one of emergency.

## RELIGIOUS INSTRUOTION.

Ministers of Ro- 65. Ministers of religion shall have free aecoss to persons of ligion. their respective denominations, at such times as shall he rupeointed by the Committee of Management ; mid when a patient requests that any minister may be sent for, his wish shall be immediately complied with.
Religions In- 66. That the instruction of the patients in the Institution be struction. left to the recognised religions teachers of the varions denominations to which the patients belong; and it shall be understood that controversial works be prohibited.
