Thn Board of Management herewith present to the Subscribers and Friends of the Institution the following Report and Financial State－ ment for the year ending 31st December， 1886.

During the year 1886,2819 cases have received relief，viz．：－
677 Indoor Pationts．
153 Inmates of the Benevolent Asylum． 1989 Outdoor Hospital Patients．
Of the Hospital Cases，

Of the Inmates of the Asylum， 45 were dischaxged，or laft at their own request． 17 died． 91 remained on the 31at December， 1886.

The daily average in the Institntion has been $133 . \frac{1}{2}$ ．
The rate of mortality has been 6 per cent．for all cases，and 4.9 for Hospital In－Patients，which will compare very favourably with other Institutions．
The total number remaining in the Institution，December 31st－135．

Statistical Returns giving the ages and diseases of Patients, \&co. are separately reported; also the attendances of Members of Committee, de., at the Geabral Committee of Management, and Sub-Committees.

With reference to the Financial Statement (duly andited and found correct), it will be observed that the total receipts, including balance on hand (list January, 1886), amount to $£ 51797 \mathrm{~s} .7 \mathrm{~d}$., there being an incresse over the previous year in each of the following sources of Income, viz: :-Private Subscriptions and Donations; Church Collections; Municipal Grants ; and Proceeds of Entertainments, a result which may be regarded with much satisfaction.

The expenditure for Maintenance, \&c., has been $£ 510612 \mathrm{~s}$. 4d, as against $£ 4779$ 12s. 6 d . for 1885 . This increase (viz., $£ 326$ 19s. 10d.) is chiefly owing to a larger outlay for repairs, painting, \&c, which were absolutely necessary.

It will be seen that there is a cash balance to the credit of the Institution of $£ 7215 \mathrm{~s}$. 3 d .

The following amounts received during the past year are specially acknowledged by the Committee, viz.:-£138 from the Hospital Sunday Committee ; $£ 50$ 8s. 9d. from the Ven. Archdeacon Slattery, being collections in Roman Catholic Churches; £54 3s. 7d., collections made in other clurches in town and comntry ; $£ 1010$ s., legacy bequeathed by the late Mr. Isarc Crawcour, and forwarded by the Trustees (Messirs. Joseph and David Crawcour, and Mr. Sydney Abrahan) ; £25 kindly forwarded by the Hon. Jas. Munro's Election Committee; and $£ 5$ 5s. also from Mr. Donaghy's Election Committee; besides amounts received from the various Municipal Councils, as also from landowners and others in the country districts, who have so generously responded to the appeal made to them, by kindly collecting and forwarding donations towards the funds of the Institution.

The Committee sincerely thank those who have kindly rendered special and continued services for the Inmates, in attending to their spiritual wants; to the ladies of the Flower Mission for bouquets, weekly brought ; and to those who so thoughtfully remembered the poor and suffering, by their generous gifts in money and kind, forwarded in abundance at Clristmas and New Year's season, thereby providing good cheer, and gladdening the hearts of Patients in the Hospital and the aged Inmates in the Asslum.

The thanks of the Committee are tendered to the Honorary Medical Staff for their services ; to the press and the proprietors of the various newspapers who have kindly continued to forward, gratis, copies of their raspective papers for the use of the Inmates.

Mr. Le Capelaine, the Inspector from the Central Board of Health in Melbourne, also Capt. Evans, the Inspector of Charities, visited the Institution during the past year, and their inspection was in the highest degree favourable, as reported in each case.

During the past year the House and Finance Committees have been most assiduous in the discharge of their onerous and responsible duties, and have exercised careful economy and supervision in the internal management of the Institution.

In conclusion, the Committee thank the Subscribers for the support given in the past, and sincerely hope such will be continued in the future.

# An AOT for HOSPITALS and CHARITABLTINSTITUTIONB. 

(2ND JUNE, 1864.)<br>ACT OF THE PARLIAMENT OF VIOTORIA, No. 220


#### Abstract

The Sections only of the Act whioh are of present practical importance are hera cited. Of the remaining Sections, 1, 2, and 3, relate to the Mode of Incorporation; Sections 5 and 6 to the First Meeting after Incorporation; Section 10 to the Transfer of existing Trust Property to the New Conporation; Section 16 repeals pro tanto former Acts.

WHEREAS it is expedient to provide for the good government of hospitals and other charitable institutions. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assenbly of Victoria in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows-


4. Every such incorporated institution* as aforessid shall be governed by a committee of not less than seven members, to be elected by the contributors for the time being to such institution; and such committee or any four of them shall have and exercise all the powers and authorities by this Act vested in the corporation; and one-fourth part of such committee or such fractional part as shall be nearest to one-fourth part, but no more, may be honorary medical men on the staff of such institution; and the president, vice-presidents and treasurer of every such institution shall by yirtue of their respective offices be members of such committee.
5. It shall be competent for the corporation of any such institution to make bye-laws for the regulation of its own proceedings, for fixing the number of votes of contributors in proportion to the amount of their contributions, for determining the validity of disputed elections and for conducting such elections, and generally for all matters whatsoever affecting the management of the institution not inconsistent with the laws of this colony ; but no such bye-laws shall be of any force or effect until one month after the same shall have been confirmed by a general meeting of contributors specially convened for that purpose and published in the Government Gazette. Provided that no such bye-lsws shall enable any contributor to exercise more than three rotes.
6. The Governor in Council may at any time revoke any such bye-law ; and every order by which any such bye-law shall be revoked shall be published in the Goverument Gazette, and shall take effect from the time of such publication.

[^0]9. It any contributor to the support of any such incorporated institution as aforesaid shall desire to dispute the yalidity of any such bye-law, and shall pay into the Supreme Court the sum of ffteen pounds as security for the costs of the proceedings hercinafter mentioned, it shall be lawful for such contributor to apply to the said court upon an affidavit of the frets for a rale calling upon the corporation to show cause why such bye-law should not be quashed for the illegality thereof; and the said court may make the same absolute, or discharge it with or without payment of costs as to the court shall seem meet.
11. On the second Thursday in the month of January in every year one-third part of the elected nembers of the committee shall go out of office, but may nevertheless be re-elected : and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.
12. If any member of the committee shall die or resign by letter under his hand, addressed to the chairman of the committee, or become insolvent or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, or misdemeanor, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant; and the remaining members of the committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next anmual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thas temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who by the provisions of this Act are required to go out of office.
13. All notices to any officer or momber of or contributor to any present or future charitable institation whether incorporated or not, which by the charter, statutes, laws or rules (as the case may he) of such institution for the time being are or shall be required to be given, may be served by the same being transmitted through the post directed according to an address in this colony (to be left for that purpose by such officer, member or contributor in writing under his hand at the chief establishment of such institution) in such time as to admit of their delivery in the due course of post at or before such period (if any) as is or shall be prescribed by the charter, statutes, laws or rules (as the case may be) for the time being of such institution for the giving of such notices,
14. In proving such service as aforesaid it shall be sufficient to prove that such notice was so directed as aforesaid, and put into a general post office in such time as aforesaid; but so nevertheless that nothing in this Act contaiued shall be held to render invalid any personal service of any notice, or to render necessary to the effectual service of any notice any further act, matter or thing than would have. been required for the service thereof by the charter, statutes, laws, or rules for the time being of the institution which the same shall concern if this Act had not been passed.
15. No notice of any intended court, board meeting or election slall be required to be served either by post or otherwise on any officer or member of or contributor to any such institution as last, aforesaid who shall not have left an address in the maner at the place and for the purpose hereinbefore mentioned, anything in any such charter, statutes, laws or rules to the contrary notwithsianding.

Objects of Iusti－2．That the objects of the Infirmary be to afford medical and tation． surgical aid to poor persons requiring it ；to a limited number of pajing patients whose admission under special circumstances may be sanctioned by the Committee of Management；and for casualties； bat no person who shall meet with casualties and shall be found able to pay for surgical aid，shall receive further than temporary assist． ance．That the object of the Benerolent Asylum be the reception of the poor and distressed，witle a yiew to afford them consolation and assistance．

## APPROPRIATION OF BULLDINGS．

Appropriation of Brildingg．

3．That a portion of the buildings shall be set apart for the purpose of an Infirmary，and a portion for the purpose of the Benevolent Asylum，at the discretion of the Committee，who siall also be empowered to permit the reception of lunatics，on xemand for medical examination，in a ward erected for that purpose．

## CONSTITUTION．

4．The Corporation shall consist of a President，two Vice－Presi－ dents，Treasurer，Governors，and Contributors．

Every question submitted to a Genemal Meeting, and all elections, shall be decided by a majority of yotes of Governors and Contributors present entitled to vote, and shall he raken by show of hands, unless a ballot shall have been previously demanded by any three persons entitled to vote; in which case the voting shall be by ballot, and for such purpose scrutineers shall be appointed before the ballot is taken.

## COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT,

Constitution of 18. The Institution shall be governed by a Committee, each of Comuittec. whou shall be a subscriber of not less than fl per annum, and shall consist of the President, two Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, and eighteen Governors ar Contributors. The Fonowary Medion Oficers of the Institution may be members of the Committee. Four members of Committee (but not including more than one of the honorary staff) shall form a quorum.

No person shall be considered eligible for election at the anuual meeting unless he or some one duly authorised on his behalf shall have given notice in writing to the secuetary at least four days before the date of such meeting, of his intention to become a caudidate for one or more of the annual offices, but no person shall hold more than one office whereliy a seat at the Board may be vacated. Provided always that in the event of sufficient nominations not being sent in to supply all the offlces, it shall be competent for the annual meeting to dispense with the above condition, and to fill up any vacancies which may exist after the formal nominations have bsen disposed of.

20. The President, Vice-Presidents, Treasurer, Honorary Medi- Annual retirecal Staff, and Auditors, shatl retive anmully from their respective offices at the annual meeting of Contributors, but nevertheless be eligible for re-election; and in the event of the aunual election to fill vacancies from any canse not taking place on the day appointed, they shall hold office until the elections talse place.
21. Whenever any vacancy shall occur in the office of President, the Committee shall appoint one of the Vice-Presidents to fill the same; and if any vacancy shall occur in the office of Vice-President, the Committee shall elect one of their number to the office until the next annual mecting.
22. The Committee shall meet at the Institution on the second Wednesday in every month, and on such other days as they may appoint for the transaction of general business. Special meetings may be convened by order of the President, or upon the request in writing of four members of the Committee. Notice of all meetings shall be sent to cach momber by the Sceretary at least twenty-four hours before the time of meeting, stating any special business to be considered.
23. The President, or in his absence one of the Vice-Presidents, Chatrman and shall preside ; if they also be absent the Committee shall elect its Adjuruments, own Chairman. The Chairman shall have a casting, but not a deliberate vote. If a quorum be not present on any monthly meeting within twenty minutes of the time fixed, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the following week at the same day and hour.

No member of the Committee of Management, or officer Pecuniary intoof the Institution, shall he a contractor or become security for a ccasimal ${ }^{\text {va- }}$ caucles of President, , $\mathbf{r}$ Vice. $\mathrm{P}_{1}$ esidont. contractor, directly or indirectly; but this shall not apply to any member of a company, partnership, or association consisting of more than twenty persons, when such contract shall be entered into for the general benefit of such company, partuership, or association ; but no member of the Committee of Management shall be present at the discussion of, for record his vote upon, any matter in which he shall, by himself, or his partners, have any pecuiary interest.
25. The Committee of Management shall direct the genexal business of the Institution, and frame regulations for its internal management (such regulations not to be repugnant to the Ilospital Statute and Bye-laws) ; they shall appoint and discharge all paid officers and servants of the Institution; and enter into all necessary contracts for the supply of provisions and other articles; and for the repair, alteration, and extension of buildiugs; they shall direot the collection of the funds, and make all necessary payments in connection with the Institution. They shall superintend or give instructions, and make regulations for the admission, discharge, or dismissal of patients aud inmates, in accordance with the objects of the Institution and Bye-laws.
26. The Committee of Management shall, at its first meeting in each year, after the annual meeting of Subscribers, choose from among thenselves two Sub-Committees, each to be composed of five members-three to form a quorum; one to be designated the House Committee, and the other the Finnce Committee, and, when practicable, two or more members of an old may be members of a new Committee. The Committee of Management may also at any time appoint Sub-Committees for any purpose connected wilh the Institution or its management, and may flx and alter the quormon of, and continue, alter, or discontinue such Committees. The President and Vice-Presidents shall be ax oflcio members of all Committees, and the Treasurer shall be ax officio menber of the Finance Committee,

Meetings of Sub Committees.
27. The House, Finance, or other Sub-Committees shall appoint their own Chairman, and meet as directed by the Byo-Laws, or as they may determine, and whenever convened by order of the Chairman. Minutes of their proceedings shall be recorded in a book, and be read to the Committee of Management at each monthly meeting.

Duties \& Powers of House Oommittee.
28. The House Committee shall meet once at the least in each week, and oftener if necessary. They shall have power, subject to the approval of the Committee of Management, to admit patients, and to confirm or otherwise the admission of any cases received during the intervals of their meetings: they shall examine into and report to the Gencral Committee upon all complaints, and be empowered to dismiss patients for misconduct or breach of the rules of the Institution, recording in their minutes reasons for the non-admission or for dismissal ; they may engage and discharge servants, order necessary supplies, call for and inspect the half-yearly tenders, and recommend any to the General Committee for acceptance ; they shall inspect all books connected with the admission and discharge of patients, receipt and issue of stores, medicines, medical instruments, furniture, bedding, and supplies generally ; they, or some of their number, shall weekly inspect the wards, kitchen, and other portions of the Institution; they shall check the tradesmen's monthly bills and other accounts for supplies, and recommend the same to the Finance Committee for payment ; and generally shall supervise and regulate the internal management of the Institution, under the direction of the Committee of Management.

Duties \& powers of Finance Committee.
29. The Finance Committee shall meet at least twice in each month, and shall examine the Secretary's cash and other books of account, and compare same with Treasurer's bank pass-book; they shall also compare the Collector's books, and receipt butts with advertised list of subscriptions and conations, check additions, and see that the totals correspond with each other and with the amounts acknowledged by the Treasurer; they shall give all needful instructions to the Secretary and Collector with reference to keeping books of accounts and collection of subscriptions and donations, and shall monthly prepare an abstract of all accounts for payment, and submit the same to the Committee of Management at their monthly meetings, and shall in conjunction with the President, or a VicePresident and Secretary, be empowered to make necessary special payments in the intervals between the monthly meetings ; they shall see that the vouchers connected with the previous abstract have been properly receipted; and shall also examine the returns prepared for Government, and amnual statements of accounts.

Business at Com- 31. At the monthly meetings of the Committee of Management mittee Meetings the minutes of the previous monthly meeting, and of special meetings during the month, shall be read and conflrmed, no discus.
minuteg. sion being allowed thereon excent as to their accuracy; the minutes and reports of all Sub-Committees shall also be read, and on all
Yoting. questions votes shall be taken by show of hands, each member having one vote only. The Committee shall also from among themselves appoint two members (not being members of the House
Appoint Wisitorn, Committee) to be visitors for the month, who shall at the next monthly meeting report the state of the Institution as found by them at their risits, At the monthly meeting in December of each
year the Committee shall consider and determine the rate of salaries and wages of the officers and servants of the Institution for the Fix Salaries, \&o. ensuing year ; and should vacancies occur, or by giving three months' notice, they shall have power to alter or amend rates of salaries and wages then determined upon.
32. The Committee of Management may suspend any honorary Suspensions. medical officer, or one or more of its own members, on any wellfounded charge, provided that such suspension be approved of by a majority of the members present at a special meeting convened for the consideration of such charge, and provided chat the suspension and cause thereof be reported to a general meeting of Contributors, to be specially convened for that purpose within two weeks after the order of suspension is made, and the House Committee may suspend any paid officer of the Institution, and make arrangements for the performance of the duties by other officer or person, provided the sugpension be reported to the Committee of Management, and a meeting of such Committee be specially convened for the consideration thereof within one week of such suspension. But in any case of intention to suspend, the person proposed to be suspended shall have immediate notice in writing of such intention, and the reasons or causes for such, and shall have the privilege to claim and have as is customary a Roard of Enquiry appointed to hear, consider and record his or her defence, and have witnesses examined for or against him or her.
33. The Committee of Management shall have power to invest Investments. in Government Debentares, contributions specially given for the purpose of endowment, or auy bequests which in the interests of the Institution they consider should be capitalised.
34. The Committee of Management shall present a general Annual Report report of the affairs of the Institution, together with the duly audited and Balance balance sheet, at the annual meeting of Governors and Contribntors, in January of each year, such balance sheet to be published once in one or more of the local papers at least three days before such meeting.
35. No regulation or alteration of any resolution made by the Committee of Management shall be valid (although ad interim the same may be enforced) unless confirmed at the next subsequent monthly meeting of the Committee to that at which it was decided on; and no resolution passed by the Committee shall be resciuded within three months unless one month's notice respecting same shall be first given. Any regulation may be rescinded and altered by the Contributors at the annual meeting in Jannary, or at a Special Meeting.

## COMMON SEAL.

36. The common seal of the Corporation shall be kept in the coumon Smat. iron chest at the Hospital, in a box with two different locks and keys -one of which shall be kept by the President, and the other by the Secretary.
37. The common seal shall not be fixed to any deed or other Authoritytoaffr instrument except by ordor of the Committee of Management.

## TREASURER.

38. All monies received on account of the Institution shall be paid to the Treasurer forthwith, and be deposited without delay to the credit of the Institution in such Bank as the Committee may

Trmasurer. from time to time appoint.

Acquittance,

Payments.

Authority for payments.
39. Upon receipt of any monies from the Secretary or Collector, the Trensurer shall sigu a book, to be kept for the purpose by each, for the amount so paid.
40. All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be, signed by the President or a Yice-President, the Trensurer, and comntersigned by the Secretary.
41. Previous to signing any cheques for payment, the Treasurer shall require a warrant, signed by the President or Chairmau of the Meeting of Conmitiee of Management, at which the accounts were passed, and countersigned by the Secretary; special payments may nevertheless be made during the month in accordance with Bye-Law No. 28-such special payments to be included in the next warrant passed by the Committee.
Vacancy. 42. If any vacancy shall occur in the office of Treasurer, the Committee of Management may appoint another to hold office until the annual meeting in January.

Duties of secretary.

## THE SECRETARY AND SUPERINTENDENT.

43. He shall nttend all general and special meetings of Contributors, and all meetings of the General and Sub-Committees, and take minutes of the proceedings, and shall transcribe them into books to be kept for that purpose; he shall keep the records of the Yustitution, couduct the correspondence, call all mectings, giving proper notice thereof, and bring the business before the same, and carry out the directions given to him by any of the Committee.
Ficep Accounts.
44. He shall be responsible for the conduct of the elerical business of his department, and shall keep the necessary books of account, under the direction of the Finance Committec; and at each monthly meeting of the Committee of Manarement he shall submit the cash-hook and bank pass-book of the Institution, made up to date ; and he shall slso submit a list of subscriptions and a monthly progress balance sheet in the prescribed form, slowing the actual position of the Hospital funds to the and of the previous month.
Prepare returns and apply for Contributious.

He shail compile all needful returns, statements, and reports required by Government and any of the Committees, and shall in every year make application by circular or otherwise to corporate bodies, societies, squatters, and country residents, for contributions to the funds of the Iustitution.
Responsibility as Superintendent.
46. He shall not in any way be engagen in private business; and under the direction of the Committee he shall, as Superintendent, be responsible for tha proper goverament and due observance of all the rules and regulations of the Institution, excepting those relating to the Medical and Surgical departments; he shall comply with the regulations which may from time to time be made with respect to the discharge of the duties of his office.
Give Security.

Suspension Serpants.
47. He shall give security for his faithtulness in all matters of finance for the sum of $£ 250$, of some Guarantee Company, to be approved by the Committee of Management.
48. He shall have power to suspend any warder or nurse, (after consultation with the Resident Surgeon, who shall hare equal power as to Warders and Nurses.) He shall also have power to suspend any other servant of the Institution, such suspension to be reported to the House Committee at their next meeting, and if necessary arrangements be made for the performance of the dutice in the interim.

## AUDITORS.

AUDITORS.
49. Two Auditors shall be appointed at the Annual Meeting of Appointment. Governors and Contributors, in January in each year, and the remuneration to then, if any, shall then be fixed. In default of such appointment, or in the event of any vacancy occurring during the year, the Committee of Management shall make the appointment.
50. They shall have access to all the books and accounts of the Access to Books Institution at any time to check the same; and shall report to the at all times. Committee of Management anything with respect to the finances and accounts which they may deem necessary to bring to notice.
51. They shall in the first week in January in each year Annual Andit. examine the Treasurer's Annual Financial Statement, with all bnoks, accounts and documents relating thereto, and list of Subscriptions and Donations, and shall certify to their correctness, and make any :special report thereon which they consider necessary to the Annual Meeting.

## COLLECTOR.

62. The Collector shall, under the direction of the Finance Committee and Secretary, canvass for subscriptions and donations to the funds of the Institution. He shall give a printed receipt for every sum he receives, and keep a counterpart of such reocipt in a book which shall be provided for that purpose by the Committee. He shall furnish to Contributors, from whom he receives a subscription of $£ 1$ and upwards, the admission tickets (signed by the Secretary) to which they are entitled, and shall also furnish them with a copy of the Annual Report of the preceding year. He shall enter all subscriptions received by him in a book specifying dates of receipt, and once at least in every week he shall copy all entries into a duplicate book to Keep duplicate be kept at the Tnstitution. He shall pay over to the Treasurer, once Books. in every week, and oftener if the receipts exceed $£ 20$, all monies received by him, and shall furnish to the Treasurer a list of the contributions so paid over, and shall obtain the Treasurer's receipt in his book for such payments.
63. The books used by the Collector shall be provided by the Books to be proCommittee, and shall be deemed to be the property of the Institution; and the Collector shall at any time upon demand deliver up his books and butts for examination or retention. He shall. when required, be in attendance at the meetings of the Finance Committee, and shall Attendancewhen act in the discharge of his duties under their instructions. He shall required. give security for the fuithful discharge of his duties in the sum of Give Security. $£ 150$ of some Guarantee Committee, to be approved by the Committee of Management. He shall be paid monthly, in such manner as the Payment. Committee shall determine, and shall be liable to be remored from Removal. office at any time without notice.

## HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

54. The Honorary Medical Staft shall be elected by the Gover- Howordiry nors and Contributors at the annual meeting in January of each year ; and the number to be elected shall be deoided by such meeting, but mlection. shall not exceed four; and should a vacancy occur during the year, then the power of filling the same shall rest with the General Committee of Management.

Qualification.
55. No person shall be eligible for election as an Honorary Physician or an Honorary Surgeon unless he shall be registered as a legally qualified medical practitioner under any Act in force in Victoria relating to medical practitioners, and unless he shall possess (for the office of physician) a degree from some one of the Universities: of the United Kingdom, or of the Australian Colonies, or a Foreign Uniyersity recognised by them, or a Diploma from a College of Physicians in the United Kingdom ; and unless he shall possess (for the office of Surgeon) a degree as Master of Surgery from some one of the aforesaid Universities, or be a member or Licentiate of some: one College of Surgeons in the United Kingdom.
56. The Honorary Medical Staff shall in all respects comply with the Bye-Laws and Regulations of the Institution.

## SURGICAL OPERATIONS, \&

Sargical Opera- 57. No one shall be present at the time of any operation of tions. post mortem examination except such persons as may be connected. with the Institution, or members of the medical profession.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS INTO THE INFIRMARY.
58. Accidents, and such cases of decided emergency only, as in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon cannot be delaved, may bereceived in the Infirmary at any time without ticket: and the admission of patients, in ordinary cases, recommended by Subscribers" tickets, shall be daily (Sundays excepted) between the hours of ning and twaly o'Glock in the forenoon, by the Secretary and the Honorary Medical staff for the week, or in the absence of such Staff by the Secretary and Resident Surgeon ; such admission to be temporary, and subject to the approval of the House Committee at its next. meeting.

## ADMISSION OF PAYING PATIENTS.

59. Paying patients may be admitted at the discretion of the House Committee, who shall fix the weekly rate to be charged to each patient, and in the event of an operation being necessary may fix a fee therefore, and may require the same to be paid in advance; and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the Institution, and able in the estimation of the Committee to pay, shall be required to do so at such a rate as the Committee may determine. Each admission of a paying patient shall be reported to the General Committee at its next meeting, and shall be subject to confirmation.

General Rules to be observed.
60. The General Rules and Regulations of the Institution shall be applicable to and be observed by all paying patients.

## PERSONS NOT ADMISSIBLE.

Persons not admissible.
61. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no insane person, except on remand for medical examination in the Lunatic Ward; no one having a contagious or infectious disease; no one subject to epilepsy ; nor any one who, in the opinion of the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or the Resident Surgeon, might receive equal benefit as an out-patient, shall be admitted; and no child under five years of age shall be admitted, except in cases of accident or for a surgical operation ; nor, except under special circumstances shall patients be admitted from other districts where hospital
exist. Provided that the House Committee or Officers of the Institution shall have discretionary power to admit such prohibited cases, and shall report upon the exercise of such power to the next general meeting of the Committee of Management.

## ADMISSION OF INMATES INTO THE BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

62. The admission of inmates into the Benevolent Asylum shall be restricted to those days in each week upon which the House Committee meets, when applications shall be considered and decided upon. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no person insane; no child under twelve years of age; no one having a contagious or infectious disease shall be admitted.

## OUT-PATIENTS.

63. Persons unable to pay for medicines and medical attendance

Admission to Bc nevolent Asylum. treated as out-patients on producing the recommendation, in proper form, of a Governor or Subscriber.

## IMPOSTORS:

64. In the event of any person in a position to pay for medical Impostors. or surgical advice, or to support himself or herself elsewhere, being detected in the receipt of the charity of the Institution, such person shall be charged as in-patients of the Infirmary or Benevolent Asylum, at the rate of ten shillings per diem from date of admission; or, if an out-patient, ten shillings for each occasion on which either of the Surgeons may have been consulted; and the Committee may order the removal of such person from the Institution, provided the case is not one of emergency.

## RELIGIOUS INSTRUCTION.

65. Ministers of religion shall have free access to persons of Ministors of Ratheir respective donominations at such times as shall be appointed by the Committee of Management; and when a patient requests that any minister may be sent for, his wish shall be immediately complied with.
66. That the instruction of the patients in the Institution be left to the recognised religious teachers of the various denominations to which the patients belong; and it shall be understood that controversial works be prohibited.

## REGULATIONS.

67. Copies of all Bye-Laws and Regulations with respect to the officers or servants of the Institution shall be furnished to them by the Secretary; and with respect to the patients and visitors the regulations affecting them shall be hung up in each ward of the Institution.

## BYE-LAWS.

68. Any alterations, amendments, or additions proposed to be Byo-Laws-Altemade in the Bye-Laws shall be advertised once in one or more newspapers published in Geelong at lenst seven days before the meeting at which the same are to be considered.
