THE THIRTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
G E E L O N G
Infirmiry and Benevolent Asylum,
(Incorporated.)

THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT have pleasure in laying their Thirty-seventh Annual Report before the Governors and Contributors to the Geelong infirmary and Benevolent Asylum.

The Subscribers may be congratulated on the Institution during the past year, having, in the good providence of Almighty God, been increasingly useful, and having rendered effective aid to a very large number of the sick and distressed.

The following general statement shows the number of those under treatment during the year ended 30th June, 1889, the total number having received relief being, 2685, viz.:—

816 Indoor Patients.
166 Inmates of the Benevolent Asylum.
1703 Outdoor Patients.

Of the Hospital Cases :

683 Were Discharged, cured or relieved.
74 Died.
59 Were still under treatment, 30th June, 1889.

Of the Inmates of the Asylum :

43 Were discharged or left at their own request.
26 Died.
97 Remained on 30th June, 1889.

The daily average in the Institution has been, 160.

The rate of mortality has been 10 per cent. for all cases, and 9·6 for Hospital In-patients, which will compare very favorably with other Institutions.

Comparing the Returns of the past year with those of previous years, a large increase will be observed in the number of In-patients who received treatment. This increase is partly accounted for from the large number of those suffering from typhoid fever, 134 cases of which were received but out of these only eight proved fatal. There were—

In 1886 (twelve months) 830 patients admitted.
1887-88 (eighteen months) 1331 patients admitted.
1888-89 (twelve months) 982 patients admitted.

From the Financial Statement (as audited) it will be observed that the total receipts, from all sources, during the year 1888-89, has been £6550 4s. 5d., with an expenditure of £5974 6s. 4d. for maintenance, repairs to buildings, etc., showing a debit balance of £58 19s. 1d.

The total amount to the credit of the Endowment Fund remaining as last year, £2426 13s.

The Committee feel thankful to the Clergy and Ministers of the various Christian denominations in the town and country, for their kind and successful exertions on Hospital Sunday and other occasions, on behalf of this and other local charities. It is therefore, with pleasure they acknowledge the receipt of the following amounts :—

The system of charging a registration fee of One Shilling for out-door patients (unless absolutely indigent,) inaugurated some few years since, continues to work most satisfactorily; thus proving an important addition to the general revenue, without pressing heavily upon the recipients of the benefits conferred.

During the past year Dr. D. B. Reid has been elected an Honorary Consulting Medical Officer, in accordance with the Bye-laws (as amended.)

Mrs. Ridley, who has been for nine years Matron of this Institution, having sent in her resignation which the Committee accepted with regret, Miss Stitt, of Melbourne, was elected (from 25 Candidates) as her successor.

During the past year there have been held 13 meetings of the General Committee of Management; 52 of the House Committee; and 14 of the Finance Committee. Details of the attendances of Members will be found elsewhere.

The Committee desire to express their sincere thanks to the Honorary Staff for their valuable services rendered, as also to many who have manifested such a kindly interest in the welfare of the Institution, and who have done so much to alleviate the hard lot of many a poor sufferer.

They would also tender their thanks to the Ministers of religion and others, who by their ministrations have brought comfort and consolation to the sick and dying; and to the many who have also interested themselves in the well-being of the various inmates.

Moreover they would thank the several Members of the Committee, for providing a substantial and most enjoyable repast for the male and female Benevolents, in February last.

Grateful acknowledgments are also due to those numerous friends for acts of kindness to the patients, and especially to those who conduct the operations of the Flower Mission, for their self-denying and most acceptable labors, which tend greatly to cheer the solitude of the sick wards.

The sincere thanks of the Committee are also tendered to the Press and the proprietors of the various Newspapers for their papers supplied to the inmates.
