The FIFTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT of the General Committee of Management.

To the Governors and Subscribers.

Ladies and Gentlemen.

Your Board of Management begs to submit to the Subscribers and the Public their Fifty-fourth Annual Report and Audited Balance Sheet, with an epitome of the Finances of the Institution.

The year has been an uneventful one as far as the number of cases treated is concerned, Typhoid and other epidemic diseases being very few, and of a mild type. The number of cases of contagious disease received was 29.

The Total Number of Patients treat d was 1773. Of these 928 were admitted to

the wards.

Out-Door Patients.—Number admitted, Males, 390; Females, 455; Total, 845. Number of occasions on which they Attended, 3891.

The average Rate of Mortality has been 9.2 for all cases, and 8.7 for Hospital In-door Patients. Five deaths occurred within 24 hours of admission.

The total number remaining in the House on 30th June, 1906, was 131.

The amount to Credit of Endowment Fund is £4164 17/6; and of the Reserve Fund, £2607 11/11. together with £100, part endowment of the Comunn Na Feinne Bed.

The Government Grant was £2440, being £40 more than for the previous year.

Collections in State Schools.—The sum of £16 15/4 was collected. All who assisted are gratefully thanked for their generous aid. It is to be regretted that this welcome source of Income has suffered a considerable diminution during the last years. At one time it amounted to £80 annually. Further on is a list of the Schools that collected. For every £1 subscribed, one In and two Out-Patients' Tickets are given to the Head Teacher of each School forwarding this amount.

Inspector of Charities' Report.-Mr. F. T. Short, visited the Institution during the year. The following are extracts from his Report to the Hon. the Treasurer of Victoria :- " The amount of Municipal Grant is small, the rate for daily average being "only £1 14/8, compared with the mean rate of £4 10/5. The local contributions "were, however, good, the rate for daily average being £14 8/7, compared with the "mean of £12 16/3. The contributions from Patients were satisfactory. The Insti-"tution is managed economically. The cost per bed for the item 'Provisions,' £17 12/-, "compared with the mean cost of £14 11/9, however, appears high. The cost per cent. "of collection was 16 per cent., and the proportion of cost of administration to expension." "diture, 11 per cent. THE NECESSARY DECLARATION AND PARTICULARS in "support thereof were obtained. The average stay of patients during last year was

"24 days for Males, and 27 days for Females, which is not excessive."—(Signed), F. 7 "SHORT, Inspector of Charities."

Average Cost per Head—The daily average in the house has been 155.3, and the cost per head of each person resident, £32 8s. This is 8/4 per head less than last year, and may be considered satisfactory, as the price of some articles of diet has been higher, principally butter, eggs and milk.

Visitors' Monthly Reports.—Each month during the year two Members of the General Committee were appointed to make an inspection of the Institution and Grounds. This they did at unexpected times, and their reports were always of a satisfactory nature. Any suggestions that they made were promptly attended to by the House Committee. The Patients and Immates always expressed themselves as satisfied whenever they were interrogated by the Visitors.

Endowed Beds.—To those who may be disposed to signalise any particular year by giving a special donation, your Committee would commend the maintenance of a bed. The system of endowing a bed in perpetuity in memory of deceased relatives (the names of the donors being inscribed on a tablet at the Hospital), is respectfully,

suggested to your notice.

Infectious Wards.—During the year your Committee has endeavoured in every way possible to further the erection of this much needed addition to your Hospital. Dr. J. Small, who has for years been working to this end, has given much valuable time and thought, and gone to a lot of trouble. Inconjunction with Messrs. Tombs & Durran Architects, he has drawn up a most complete plan, which embraces every modern requirement. The President, Dr. Small, Mr. Tombs, and the Superintendent formed a deputation, and interviewed the Chairman of the Board of Health (Dr. Norris) and his officers in Melbourne. After some minoralterations, the plans were approved and passed by the Board.

On October 8th, 1905, the Hon, the Premier of Victoria visited the Hospital and personally inspected the proposed site, and at a meeting held in the Town Hall on the same afternoon, he promised to give £800 in aid of the Building Fund. Subsequently in a letter to His Worship the Mayor, he said that a grant of £600 had been placed on the Estimates, to be available when £1900 had been expended, and a

contract for £2500 entered into.

Some £1700 promised and in hand is available, which was originally collected to commemorate the Diamond Jubilee of Her Majesty the late Queen Victoria. With this sum assured, your Committee feels confident that there will be no difficulty in

raising the remainder of the money required.

Charge for Drugs to Out-Patients.—A statement was recently made in the Press that pressure was brought to bear upon Patients, to make them contribute towards their medicine and treatment. This is quite untrue, as every care is taken not to render this oppressive, and all who are too poor to pay are exempted. If there is any fault at all, it errs on the side of leniency to the Patients, as the following table will show:—

All are asked to contribute 6d. each, if able, for their Medicine; of these, 744 paid the

required 6d., and 3147 were exempted.

Every New Patient, if their means allow, is also expected to pay I/- Registration Fee. This charge is only made once. The above figures work out the following percentages:—Out of every 100 persons who attended, 19 per cent. paid 6d. for their medicine, and 81 per cent. were exempted; and out of every 100 persons who came up for treatment as new patients, 49.6 per cent. paid the I/- Registration Fee, the remaining 50.4 per cent. satisfying the officials that they could not do so, and no charge was made.

A perusal of these figures should once and for all disprove the idea that poor people must have money in their pockets before they can obtain medical aid.

A certain proportion of those who seek relief are willing and quite able to contribute the small charge asked, and take a pride in being able to partly pay for what they receive. With regard to the In-Patients, the Government has drawn up a declaration, which each one seeking admission must fill in and sign, stating whether they are able to contribute or not. If able to contribute, they are required to state the amount. The proper filling up of this form is obligatory, and a condition on which the Government Grant is made. Each individual case is subsequently reviewed by the House Committee, and inquiry made as to their circumstances. No official is ever allowed to fix what payment or otherwise shall be made. The weekly contributions vary from 2/6 upwards. Out of every 100 In-Patients admitted during the period under review, 45 paid something towards their maintenance; 55 did not. In justice to your Committee and the Officials under them, it should be distinctly understood that this system was not of their seeking, but was insisted upon by the Government, which considers that all who are able should contribute something towards their treatment. The following is the declaration which, by direction of the Government, all persons seeking aid must sign:—

EXTRACT FROM "HOSPITAL AND CHARITIES' ACT, 1890," SECTION 25.

"Any person who, either before or after his admission, makes a statement to the effect that he is in destitute circumstances and unable to pay for his maintenance or relief, and who in consequence of such statement is admitted in the Institution, shall be liable to contribute to his maintenance, &c., according to his means, such costs. &c., to be recoverable in any Court of competent jurisdiction."

I do solemnly and sincerely declare that I am in destitute circumstances, and unable to contribute anything towards my relief at the Hospital.

Hospital Sunday and Saturday.—£426 10/10 was the total sum collected, which is £21 less than the previous year. Your Committee gratefully tenders its sincere thanks to the several Churches that assisted; also to the Geelong Artillery Band, the Geelong Town Band, the St. Augustine's Orphanage and Portarlington Rifle Club Bands, for performances in aid of the Fund.

Included in the above amount is a sum of £21 15/2 collected on the Saturday by Nurses Bertram, Little, Webb, Hill, Curtain, Coate, and Hay Smith, whom your Committee also desires to thank for their arduous work performed so well. Grateful thanks are likewise tendered to the Members of the Salvation Army, who were vigilant throughout the day with their collecting boxes, and to Mr. W. Humble, who lent his fine Motor Car and Chaffeur to transport the nurses from one place to another.

Nurses' Training School.—Nurse A. Fairbairn passed the final examination, and gained her Certificate during the early part of 1905, and Nurse B. Hogg did likewise in December. Nurses Sugden and Little were candidates for their Certificates at the recent examination neld in Melbourne; they have both passed. During the year Nurses Reeves, Shrimpton and Colledge left the Hospital, having finished their three years' training. Misses A. B. Tapp, B. Sewell, M. Anderson and I. Mockridge have been appointed Trainees. Two lectures are now being delivered weekly by the

Hon. Medical Staff, one to the first year Nurses, and one to the Senior Nurses. On the completion of her three years' training, Nurse Hogg was appointed Staff Nurse for a period of three months.

The new time table, which admits of every Nurse leaving the building at Six o'clock one day, and remaining away until Ten o'clock the next night, once every week, is much appreciated by them, and the complete break in the week's duties has done

much to benefit the health of the Nurses.

On the 17th of March, His Excellency the State Governor and Lady Talbot visited the Institution, and went all over the building, staying about an hour and a quarter. The President, Members of Committee, and Hon. Medical Staff received and escorted them.

His Excellency and Lady Talbot conversed with several patients and a number of the old folks.

Subsequently the party partook of Afternoon Tea, which was provided by the President, and His Excellency, speaking on behalf of himself and Lady Talbot, expressed pleasure and approbation on what they had seen.

Operating Theatre.—There has been a large amount of Surgical work done this year. In all, 178 operations have been performed, and of these many have been

major operations.

On account of the difficulty in getting a suitable Trained Nurse for the theatre, it was decided to appoint one of our own Senior Trainees as soon as she had been taught the work. This has been found a very satisfactory arrangement, and has the advantage of giving the Nurse much valuable experience in theatre management. The Committee, at the request of the Honorary Medical Staff, have under consideration the desirability of the purchase of a modern plant for providing perfectly sterile water for operations, with washing basins, etc. This is very necessary, and will be greatly appreciated if installed.

Entertainments in Aid.—A considerable decrease is shown from this source of Income, only £53 2/4 being received. The hope is expressed that more help will be given in this direction during the coming year. To all who have in any way assisted, either as performers, promoters or subscribers, the thanks of the Committee are ten-

dered.

Instruments and Apparatus.—The X-Ray Apparatus, spoken of in last year's report, came duly to hand. It cost about £90 to purchase and fit up. Since its arrival, it has proved a very valuable addition to the Instruments of the Hospital 24 Skiagrams and 24 Screen examinations have been taken. As stated in the preceding paragraph, the Committee of Management are considering the possibility of providing a plant capable of distilling about 100 gallons of water daily. This will cost a considerable sum of money, but the Medical Staff has urged the necessity of its being procured at once, so the position must be faced. Numerous minor instruments have been purchased, including a Tallermann Hot Air Apparatus for the treatment of stiff joints, etc., by the application of superheated air at high temperatures.

Your Hospital is being kept up to date with all the latest and most modern

improvements for the treatment of accident or disease.

Life Subscribers.—Mr. F. Brennan was elected a Life Subscriber on the nomination the 8 House Committee, which donated £20.

Staff.—Dr. C. A. Maxwell, Resident Surgeon, having been recommended by his medical adviser to take a complete rest and change of environment, resigned in October last, and his position was filled by the appointment of Dr. G. R. Darby, who has quite justified his appointment. Mr. E. A. Staker, Dispenser and Assistant House Steward, resigned in February, and Mr. A. J. Fargie was appointed in his stead. Miss J. Davidson, Matron, recently passed the Special Examination held by the Board of the R.V.T.N. Association, for Nursing and Management of Infectious Diseases. She was granted the Special Certificate of the Association, certifying that she is qualified to deal with these cases.

The Hon. Medical Staff still consists of Drs. Newman, Marwood, Kennedy, and McCallum, with Drs. Croker and Small as Honorary Consulting Surgeons, and Drs. McPhee and Elvins as Honorary Anaesthetist and Skiagraphist respectively. With the exception of Drs. Croker and Small, they now retire, but are all eligible for re-election. On behalf of the Subscribers, the Committee's thanks are tendered to these gentlemen for their services and unremitting attention to the patients, and also for the careful teaching they have given in the Training School for Nurses.

Gifts of Ice and Fish.—The grateful thanks of the Committee are tendered to Messrs. W. Humble & Sons, for supplying Ice throughout the year, gratis; also for the free use of their Cool Storage Chamber; to the Queenscliff Fishermen's Union and the Queenscliff Fishing Co., your Committee's sincere thanks are conveyed for their numerous donations of Fish, which have been very acceptable to the patients and inmates.

Best Thanks are hereby tendered to the Ladies' Flower Mission, for supplying Cut Flowers weekly throughout the year; to members of the Y.W.C.A., for sewing 32 Night Caps and to all those Societies or Individuals who have given or promoted Concerts or Entertainments in aid or for the amusement of patients or inmates, or who have in any way assisted the Institution. To the Press the sincere thanks are offered for the manner in which it has at all times assisted and reported the meetings, etc., and to the Proprietors of the following papers, thanks are given for the gratuitous supply of their respective editions:—"Australasian," "Argus," "Age," "Leader," "Geelong Advertiser," "Geelong Times," "Ballarat Star," "Ballarat Courier," "Messenger," "Southern Cross," and "Advocate." For the many and munificent donations of all descriptions received, the Committee desires to express sincere thanks, in which are included the Honorary Solicitor, W. Higgins, Esq., and J. W. Sayer, Esq., both of whom have given much valuable time and trouble in the services of the Institution.

The Xmas Dinner was duly enjoyed by the recipients of the bounty of the generous donors. Officers and Staff vied with each other in trying to make the day a happy one for the Inmates and Patients. All who contributed in any way are hereby gratefully thanked. A detailed list of those whosubscribed in money or kind is given elsewhere.

Board of Management.—Geo. Martin, Esq., J.P., was re-elected President at the last Annual Meeting; J. Nicol, Esq., and C. Shannon, Esq., Vice-Presidents; and J. W. Sayer, Esq., Hon. Treasurer. W. Potter, Esq., resigned, and G. E. England, Esq. was elected by the Managers to fill his seat. In accordance with the By-laws, Mr. England now retires. The following Members of Committee also go out by effuxion of time, having been longest in office:—H. Blomfield Brown, Esq.; E. L. Jullien, Esq.; W. C. Kernot, Esq.; F. J. Leary, Esq.; and Rev. McTaggart Evans. These, with Mr. England, make the statutory six. They are all eligible for election, and offer themselves accordingly.

We have examined the Accounts and Books and verified the Securities and Policies of the Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum (Incorporated) for the year from 1st July, 1905, to 30th June, 1906, and hereby certify that the same are correct, and truly set out the financial position of the Institution, its Income from all sources, and its Expenditure on all accounts.

### EXTRACTS FROM BYE-LAWS.

#### QUALIFICATION, DESIGNATION AND PRIVILEGES OF BENEFACTORS.

Bye-Law No. 5.—The following shall be the qualification, designation, and privileges of Governors, Contributors and Honorary Collectors, viz.: £50 personal contribution in one year—Life Governor; £30 personal contribution in one year—Governor for 5 years, with privileges during that period of a Life Governor; £20 personal contribution in one year—Life Subscriber; £50 bequest under will, first-named or acting executor (bequest under will) under such will—Governor for 5 years, to be entitled to 4 In and 8 Out-Patients annually; £25 bequest under will, first-named or acting executor under such will—Governor for 2 years, to be entitled to 2 In and 4 Out-Patients' tickets annually; £20 Society, Association, or Company collecting or paying in one year (to nominate for each £20 collected or paid)—Life Subscriber; £1 and upwards, Minister of Church or Layman collecting in one year—Honorary Collector; £1 and upwards, yearly subscription—Contributor.

Provided always that no minister, Congregation, Association, Society, Company or Person shall nominate as a contributor or contributors any person or persons, the yearly subscription or subscriptions for whom shall be sought or intended to be paid out of moneys derived from public or private collections for Charitable purposes. Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privileges through one of themselves to be nominated in writing by such firm, and the Trustees or Executors of every Estate subscribing may exercise their privileges through one of themselves being nominated in writing by such Trustees or Executors, and every Public or Corporate body subscribing may exercise their privileges through some person in their employ to be nominated in writing by such Public or Corporate Body. The power of voting by nominees at Annual or Special Meeting; being, limited to three votes for all they represent.

Bye-Law No. 6.—Life Governors will be entitled to recommend 1 In and 4 Out-Patients (always on the books); Governor for 5 years (personal donation)—1 In and 4 Out-Patients always on the books during that times; Governor for 5 years (Executor under will)—4 In and 8 Out-Patients' tickets annually; Governor for 2 years—2 In and 4 Out-Patients' tickets annually; Life Subscriber—1 In and 2 Out-Patients' tickets annually; Contributor—1 In and 2 Out-Patients' tickets annually for each £1 subscribed; Honorary Collector—1 In and 2 Out-Patients' tickets annually for each £1 collected.

Bye-Law. No. 7.—Recommendation shall be made by ticket and shall only be used for the recommendation of persons UNABLE to pay for medical attendance; the reception of such persons shall be subject to the approval of the Committee of Management, and provided that the funds and accommodation of the Institution admit of their reception. When recommendations cannot be acceded to, a ticket in lieu of that used shall be returned to the Subscriber. Tickets will be issued by the Secretary to the Subscribers at the time of payment of subscriptions. Subscribers shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the Secretary, of exchanging Out-Patients for In-Patients; and "vice versa"; One In-Patient's ticket being equivalent to Three Out-Patients'

Bye-Law No. 8.—Subscribers of £1 and upwards shall have full power to vote at all meetings from time of payment, and shall be deemed Annual Subscribers from date of payment.

Bye-Law No. 9.—At all Annual and Special Meetings of the Corporation, Life Governors shall have three votes; Life Subscribers and Annual Governors, two votes; Annual Contributors of £5 5/- and upwards, three votes; £3 3/-, two votes; £1, one vote; Honorary Collectors for whole amount collected in one-year, one-vote.

#### ADMISSION OF PATIENTS INTO THE INFIRMARY.

Bye-Law No. 58.—Accidents and such cases of decided emergency only as in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon cannot be delayed may be eceived in the Infirmary at any time without ticket, provided, however, that should an accident or emergency case remain in the Institution three days or more, an In-Patient's Ticket must then be procured without delay. The admission of patients in ordinary cases recommended by Subscribers' tickets shall be daily (Sundays excepted) between the hours of nine and twelve o'clock in the forenoon, by the Secretary, and the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or in the absence of such Staff, by the Secretary and Resident Surgeon; such admission to be temporary, and subject to the approval of the House Committee at its next meeting.

#### ADMISSION OF PAYING PATIENTS.

Bye-Law No. 59.—Paying Patients may be admitted at the discretion of the House Committee, who shall fix the weekly rate to be charged to each Patient, and in the event of an operation being necessary may fix a fee therefore, and may require the same to be paid in advance; and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the Institution, and able, in the estimation of the Committee, to pay, shall be required to do so at such rate as the Committee may determine. Each admission of a Paying Patient shall be reported to the General Committee at its next meeting, and shall be subject to confirmation.

Bye-Law No. 60.—The General Rules and Regulations of the Institution shall be applicable to and be observed by all Paying Patients.

### PERSONS NOT ADMISSIBLE.

Bye-Law No. 61.—No pregnant temale for the purpose of confinement; no insane person, except on remand for medical examination in the Lunacy Ward; no one having a contagious or infectious disease; no one subject to epilepsy; nor any one who, in the opinion of the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or the Resident Surgeon, might receive equal benefit as an Out-Patient, shall be admitted; and no child under five years of age shall be admitted, except in cases of accident or for a surgical operation; nor except under special circumstances shall Patients be admitted from other districts, where hospitals exist; provided that the House Committee or Officers of the Institution shall have discretionary power to admit such prohibited cases, and shall report upon the exercise of such power to the next General Meeting of the Committee of Management.

#### ADMISSION OF INMATES INTO THE BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

Bye-Law No. 62.—The admission of Inmates into the Benevolent Asylum shall be restricted to those days in each week upon which the House Committee meets, when applications shall be considered and decided upon. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no person insane; no child under twelve years of age; no one having a contagious or infectious disease shall be admitted.

#### PAYMENT OF MAINTENANCE.

All Patients will be expected to pay towards the actual expenses of their maintenance, so far as their circumstances may enable them; and all property found on Patients who may die in the Hospital will be appropriated to defray the expenses of the maintenance and burial. The residue if any, to be handed over to their legal representatives.

The Committee of Management shall appoint a Sub-Committee (with the concurrence of the Surgeon) which shall have power to discharge any Patient in case of his refusal to pay; and shall have the further power to require (if necessary) Patients to make a declaration before a Justice as to their means.
