The FIFTY-FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT of the General Committee of Management.

To the Governors and Subscribers.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

Your Board of Management begs to submit to the Subscribers and the Public their Fiftyfifth Annual Report and Audited Balance Sheet, and other matters of importance and interest.

Nothing of special importance has occurred during the year, so far as the actual numbers or exceptional cases of disease are concerned. Epidemic diseases have been fortunately practically non-existant and have given no trouble. The total number of contagious diseases treated was 17

The total number of Patients passing through the Institution was 1849. Of these

910 were admitted to the wards.

Out-Door Patients.—Number admitted, Males, 446; Females, 493; Total, 939. Number

of occasions on which they Attended, 4412.

The average Rate of Mortality has been 9.1 for all cases, and 7.5 for Hospital In-door Patients, which is very low for a General Hospital. Eight deaths occurred within 24 hours of admission, had these been eliminated the death rate would have been lower.

The total number remaining in the House on 80th June, 1907, was 151.

The amount to Credit of Endowment Fund is £4,089 15s. 6d. and of the Reserve Fund. 12,949 10s. 8d. together with £100, part endowment of the Comunn Na Feinne Bed. The

Government Grant was £2,400.

Collections in State Schools.—The sum of £8 15s. 3d. was collected. Collectors and Teachers are gratefully thanked for their disinterested kindness. For every £1 collected, one In and two Out-Patients' Tickets are given to the Head of the School. Below is a list of Schools that collected :--

Visitors' Monthly Reports.—Two members of the General Committee have each month been appointed during the year to inspect the Institution. Their visits were made without notice being given to the Officers or Staff and at unexpected times. Their reports were always of a satisfactory nature, and call for no comment.

A number of very complimentary letters from patients have been received during the period, expressing thanks and appreciation for the nursing and medical skill they have received.

Infectious Wards.—These wards so long talked of, will shortly be opened for the reception of patients, and will be of great benefit to the community. The building contract, originally let for £2,475, has increased to some £2,850 through unforseen circumstances. A large part of the extra expense has been incurred through complying with the requirements of the Central Board of Health which have been stringent, and although no doubt necessary, are very expensive to carry out. The £800 promised by the Hon, the Premier of Victoria in aid of the Building Fund was subsequently reduced to £600 which has been received. Your Committee does not intend to let the matter rest at this, and on the return of the Hon the Premier a deputation will wait upon him with a view of urging that further assistance be granted, or at least that the sum of £200 already promised be made available. £1,705 was handed over by the Mayor of Geelong, being the money originally collected for the purpose at the late Queen Victoria's Jubilee.

In reply to a request by the Secretary, the Trustees of the Edward Wilson Argus Fund

very generously gave £100 as a Special Grant to the fund. Several other generous subscribers

have helped, and the total amount received to date towards paying for the buildings is £2,410. It is estimated that to pay off the remaining debt on the building account, and provide furnitute bedding, etc., will absorb a further sum of £800.

An effort is being made to raise this by means of Collecting Cards, which the Ladies of the Town and District have very kindly taken in hand. They are also organising a Ball in aid.

and the Geelong Musical Society has promised to give a Concert later on.

It is sincerely hoped that the Public will come to the Committee's assistance and subscribe sufficient money to start the wards free of debt. If this is done it may be safely promised that the further appeals need be made to maintain the wards, as they will be managed with the same

economy and efficiency as the rest of your Institution is.

Inspector of Charities' Report.—The following are extracted from the Inspector of Charities' Report to the Hon. the Treasurer of Victoria commenting on his official visits:—"The "amount of Municipal Grant was poor, the rate for daily average being only £1 17s. 8d. compared "with the mean rate of similar Institutions in other districts of £3 16s. 5d. The receipts from patients contributions were large. The Institution closed the year with a credit balance of £3, "after allowing for payment of accounts due at close of Financial year. The Institution is "managed economically. The cost per cent. of collection was 16 per cent. and the proportion of cost of administration to expenditure on maintenance was 10 per cent. THE NECESSARY DECLARATION AND PARTICULARS in support thereof, connected with the admission of patients were obtained. The average stay of hospital cases was 22 days for Males, and 27 days "for Females, which is not excessive."

Municipal Grants.—It will be noticed that the Inspector again draws the Hon. the Treasurer's attention to the fact that the Municipal Grant is small, being far below the mean of other municipal districts. Calculated on the number of occupied beds daily, it only amounted to £1 17s. 3d. compared with the mean rate of £8 16s. 5d. over the whole of Victoria. In a wealthy and prosperous district such as Geelong is, this complaint should not be allowed to continue by the various Shires and Councils, unless they favor the idea that has been frequently suggested to the Government, of compelling the municipal bodies to strike a poor rate for the support of their own

sick poor, and workers too old or helpless to work.

The Geelong Town Council has very generously led the way, by increasing their annual grant from £50 to £65, and they are hereby thanked by your Committee. It is hoped that the other Councils will follow their example, and in future vote a more adequate amount to this deserving and dual Institution. It should always be remembered that other centres of the importance and population of Geelong, to take for instance Ballarat and Bendigo, support a separate Hospital and Benevolent Asylum respectively, with a separate and distinct staff for each. It can be readily understood that this system is a far more expensive one than that which obtains in your Institution, as the Asylum and Hospital are here under one management which reduces the cost of administration to a great degree.

Financial and General.—The revenue for the past year has on the whole been well maintained and the receipts from patients show a substantial increase, viz.:—£844 6s 8d agains £696 17s 9d for the previous year. The Government Grant was £2400, being £40 less than the year before. The stay of In-Patients was 24 days for all cases, which is within the limit prescribed

by the Government.

The Expenditure on Maintainence calls for no special comment, the cost of administration being less than 10 per cent. of the total which so eminent an authority as Sir Henry Burdett maintains, is as low as it should reach in a well-managed General Hospital. The cost per occupied bed has been reduced from £82 8s. of the previous year to £32 8s. The daily average of patients and inmates has been 155.5.

During the year, a plant costing £110 has been erected for distilling all water used at operations and for surgical purposes. This precludes all danger of septic trouble arising from contaminated water, which the modern surgeons states will occur, no matter how carefully it is boiled. The basins actuated by mechanical means were also purchased and fitted up for £60, and installed in the Operating Theatre. The operating surgeon can now turn on as much hot or cold distilled water as he wants, by pressing a lever with his foot, and by pressing another lever

adjoining, also with his foot, the basin is turned upside down and emptied. This is done to prevent him getting his hands contaminated by handling taps or basins after they are once sterile. These appliances have brought the operating room up-to-date which can now compare favourably for its size with any in the metropolis.

The amount to credit of the Reserve Fund has been increased by a legacy of £341 18s. 9d

left by the late W. G. Cakebread.

A considerable sum of money has had to be expended during the year in Painting and Repairs. The whole of the walls and ceilings of main hall and passages have been stripped of the paper they were covered with, and painted with three coats. The Institution's permanent painter and carpenter have also been kept busily employed. The age of the building makes it much more expensive to keep in repair than others of more recent birth.

Hospital Saturday and Sunday. \$\preceq\$\£376 12s. 11d. was collected. This is \$\pmecep50 10 less than

the previous year, which was also £21 less than its predecessor.

It is sincerely hoped that this valuable source of revenue is not going to diminish as the years go on, as in these days of decreased Government assistance, it is more than ever necessary that private subscriptions should take the place of what we have lost from this source of revenue,

which amounts to about £700 per year.

To the Churches that assisted with collections, your Committee takes this opportunity of tendering their sincere thanks, also to the Geelong Artillery Band, and to the Geelong Town Band, both of which gave performances in aid. Included in the collection above is an amount of £21 15s 5d collected in the Town on the Saturday by Nurses E. Bertram, E. Sewell, R. Parry, Z. Parry, M. V. Anderson, I. Mockridge and L. Hill, to whom your Committee is grateful for the zeal and energy they displayed.

The Salvation Army officers also did loyal service for this collection, and they are hereby

gratefully thanked for their help in the aid of charity.

In connection with the decreased receipts received by the Hospital from the Hospital Sunday Fund during the last two years, it is instructive to note that while your Hospital has to deplore the diminution of the amount it has received, the Ladies' Benevolent Association in their Annual Report for 1906, announce that the sum they received during that year showed an increase. The actual money they were given by the Geelong Protestant Churches was £55. Leaving out the Roman Catholic Church which has a Ladies' Benevolent Society of its own, and yet gives the whole of its Sunday Fund collection to the Hospital, the Geelong Protestant Churches forwarded to the Hospital in 1906, £169 4s. 6d. as its share of the Hospital Sunday collections. It will surprise many to learn that the Ladies' Benevolent Association were thus awarded 33½ per cent. of the total collections taken up in Geelong for the Hospital Sunday Fund.

Your Committee hold, and have always held, that it is unfair for a non-medical charity, such as the Ladies' Benevolent Association is, to participate in a special collection that was instituted to help Hospitals only, and which is under the distinctive name of Hospital Sunday Fund. Think of it, nearly one-third of the money given on Hospital Sunday by the Protestant

Churches of Geelong never comes to the Hospital.

All the expenses of printing, advertising, and organisation are born by the Hospital, and the Ladies' Benevolent Association steps in and absorbs one-third of the proceeds. Far be it from Committee to attempt to injure or decry the splendid work done by the Society, but we most emphatically do say, that if they want to have a collection made by the Churches, then they should have a distinct and separate day set apart from that on which Hospital Sunday collections are taken up.

Your Committee hopes that the authorities of the various Churches will in future make it plain to their congregations, that all money received on Hospital Sunday will be given to that

Institution only.

The Old Age Pension Scheme which has now been in force for some years, should have lightened the strain upon the funds of the Ladies' Benevolent Association, and made it unnecessary for them to ask or expect help from the Hospital fund. It cannot be too widely known that this does not in any way work in the same direction for the Hospital, When a recipient of the Society's bounty becomes either too ill or too infirm for the ladies to give further relief, then it is that the unfortunate one is brought to the Hospital which opens its doors and gives that careful and kindly

nursing which if it does not cure, (and in many cases the advanced age of the patients preclude

this) at any rate smooths and softens the last stage of many a weary traveller.

Entertainments in Aid.—All who have in any way assisted either as performers, promoters or subscribers, are thanked for their kindness. The sum of £31 5s. 6d. was received under this heading. With such a large population as your Institution ministers to, it is disappointing to see such a small amount received annually from this easily tapped source of revenue.

Special Donations have been received from the Executors of the Edward Wilson "Argus" Charitable Fund £150, and the Felton Bequest Committee £45. The valuable help received from the Trustees of these Estates is of inestimable benefit to the Institution, and your

Committee deeply appreciates the generous donations they have received.

Nurses' Training School.—In September last Nurse Little left the Hospital, having completed her training and gained her certificate. During the year Sisters Lean and Boucher resigned their positions, having held them for a number of years. Misses Zoe and Ruby Parry have been appointed trainees.

Nurses Tapp, Sewell, Anderson, Mockridge and Zoe Parry passed their examinations in Anatomy and Physiology and are attending the course of lectures now being delivered by the Hon, Medical Staff. Every facility for learning is given to the Nurses which is much appreciated by

them.

Training Nurses Coate, Webb and Hill were candidates for their certificates at the recent

examination held in Melbourne, they all passed and are now qualified.

During the year the Matron, Sister Johnston and Nurse Hill took up a six months course in cookery instruction, and having passed an examination in theory and practice, gained a certificate from the Education Department.

The separate Dining Room provided by the Committee for the Nurses and furnished by

their own efforts has proved to be an additional comfort and convenience to them.

Last November, the Matron Miss Davidson went up for an examination on the subjects: (a)—Hospital Management and Organisation. (b)—Management of Training Schools. She passed and obtained a Matron's Certificate of Technical Fitness. This is the first and only examination of its kind that has been held in the Commonwealth.

Operating Theatre.—There has been a marked increase in the amount of surgical work during the past year, the number of operations performed being 287 as against 178 last year, and

205 the year previous.

The recently installed plant for the supply of hot and cold sterilized water with the necessary fittings, revolving basins, etc., has been much appreciated, the sterilization of the hands of surgeons and nurses being now much more easily effected, and a considerable amount of labour saved.

Life Subscribers and Governors.—Mr. J. T. Mallet was elected a Governor for two years as first-named Executor of the will of T. Mallet. Mr. John Lang was elected a Governor for 5 years as first-named Executor under the will of O. Connor, deceased. Mr. R. J. Muncey, of Geelong, was elected a life subscriber on the nomination of the Independent Order of Rechabites.

Staff.—Mr. A. J. Fargie, Dispenser, resigned in March, and Mr. G. W. Franklin was appointed to the position. With this exception the personnel of the Officers remains the same

Medical Staff.—The Committee have no changes to report with regard to the Medical Staff, except that Dr. T. J. M. Kennedy has been granted leave to visit Europe, and Dr. R. J. McPhee has been appointed to act for him during his absence. Each member of the Staff carries out his duties with commendable zeal and ability. The great success obtained at the Hospital in the treatment of surgical and medical cases is undoubtedly due in a large measure to the careful attention bestowed by these gentlemen who give their professional services gratuitously for the benefit of the sick poor.

It must be understood that the Resident Surgeon, Dr. Darby, works hand in hand with the Hon Medical Staff. He is most careful and pains-taking in his duties, and your Committee is

well satisfied with the interest he takes in all that pertains to his office.

Gifts of Ice and Fish.—Messrs Humble & Sons are gratefully thanked for their gratuitous supply of ice throughout the year, and also for the use of their cool chamber during the summer free of charge; to the Queenscliff Fishing Co., your Committee's thanks are conveyed for their numerous donations of Fish.

During the year an Association was formed, called the Hospitals and Charities' Association, which nearly every Hospital in Victoria joined. Among other objects may be mentioned that of checking the aspirations and demands of the Trained Nurses' Association and of combining to bring Hospital questions and requirements more prominently before the public; backed by the weight that such a combination would give.

Your Committee, after due deliberation, decided to join, and is now affiliated with the

Association. The President Mr. G. Martin, being a member of the Finance Committee.

Votes of thanks are hereby tendered to the Ladies' Flower Mission, for supplying cut flowers weekly throughout the year; to S.M.P., for two wool dressing gowns; to the Holy Trinity Guild, Lara; to the Y.M.C.A., and to a Sewing Bee arranged by Mrs. I. Hodges, for sewing done. To the Press sincere thanks are offered for the full reports it has at all times given of the meetings, to the Proprietors of the following papers for the gratuitous supply of their respective editions:—
"Australasian," "Leader," "Weekly Times," "Argus," "Age," "Geelong Advertiser," "Geelong Times," "Ballarat Courier," "Messenger," "Southern Cross," and "Advocate."

The Xmas Dinner was as usual a perfect feast, and was much enjoyed by all who were well enough to partake of the generous fare. After it, every man was regaled with extra tobacco and cigars, which had been thoughtfully provided by generous townsmen. Those who contributed in any way are gratefully thanked. Board of Management,—Geo. Martin, Esq., J.P., was re-elected President at the last

Annual Meeting; J. Nicol, Esq., and C. Shannon, Esq., Vice-Presidents; and J. W. Sayer, Esq., Hon. Treasurer. It is with great regret that we have to record the death of a valuable worker and respected member of Committee, the late Mr. J. Munday, who for many years gave valuable help, both as a member of the House and General Committees. He was a fearless gentleman, honourable and outspoken, and his decease is much deplored. J. P. McCabe Doyle, Esq., was elected to fill his place. The Rev. W. Williams, an able and hard working member of the Finance and General Committees, resigned on being transferred to Melbourne. His seat has been filled by the Managers who elected the Rev. A. Powell. The Rev. A. Davidson, after many years valuable counsel and help, resigned recently on account of ill-health. At the time a special letter under the seal of the institution, was forwarded to him expressing the Committee's thanks for his valuable services. It is sincerely hoped that he will again be as well as ever. His seat will have to be filled at the forth-coming Annual Election. In accordance with the Bye-laws, Messrs McCabe Doyle and Powell now retire, but are willing to be re-elected. The following members of the Committee also go out by effluxion of time, having been longest in office, Messrs W. Higgins, A. Collier and E. Philpott, they are all eligible for re-election and offer themselves accordingly.

Conclusion. - The Committee looks backward with satisfaction on the year just closed. The Operating Theatre has been brought up-to-date, and the Infectious Wards are ready to be opened. For the future they have confidence in the hope of not only maintaining, but increasing the efficiency and usefulness of the Institution, for there is no finality in the treatment of disease. New discoveries are daily being made, which involve the purchase of expensive drugs, appliances or instruments. A Hospital to keep its place must ever press forward. All sections of the community are therefore earnestly appealed to, to give what help they can, to enable the Staff to keep the Institution in the front rank of the Medical Charities. No person however poor or wealthy can afford to neglect to give what he can spare towards the maintainence of these Institutions. It is in hospitals that the medical profession has the best chance of studying and combating disease. which in the long run all classes of the community profit by. To support them is an ideal system of life insurance. The poor man gets the benefit for nothing, and the rich are privileged in being able to pay for it.

QUALIFICATION, DESIGNATION AND PRIVILEGES OF BENEFACTORS.

Bye-Law No. 5.—The following shall be the qualification, designation, and privileges of Governors. Contributors and Honorary Coffectors, viz.: £50 personal contribution in one year—Life Governor: £30 personal contribution in one year—Governor for 5 years, with privileges during that period of a Life Governor: £20 personal contribution in one year—Life Subscriber; £50 bequest under will, first-named or acting executor (bequest under will) under such will—Governor for 5 years, to be entitled to 4 In and 8 Out-Patients annually; £25 bequest under will, first-named or acting executor under such will—Governor for 2 years, to be entitled to 2 In and 4 Out-Patients'

Tickets will be issued by the Secretary to the Subscribers at the time of payment of subscriptions. Subscribers hall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the Secretary, of exchanging Out-Patients for In-Patients; and "vice versa"; One In-Patient's ticket being equivalent to Three Out-Patients'.

Bye-Law No. 8.—Subscribers of £1 and upwards shall have full power to vote at all meetings from time of payment, and shall be deemed Annual Subscribers from date of payment.

Bye-Law No. 9.—At all Annual and Special Meetings of the Corporation, Life Governors shall have three votes: Life Subscribers and Annual Governors, two votes: Annual Contributors of £5.5/- and upwards, three votes; £3.8/-, two votes; £1, one vote; Honorary Collectors for whole amount collected in one year, one vote.

Extracts from Bye-Laws.

QUALIFICATION, DESIGNATION AND PRIVILEGES OF BENEFACTORS.

Bye-Law No. 5.—The following shall be the qualification, designation, and privileges of Governors, Contributors and Honorary Collectors, viz.: £50 personal contribution in one year—Life Governor; £30 personal contribution in one year—Governor for 5 years, with privileges during that period of a Life Governor; £20 personal contribution in one year—Life Subscriber; £50 bequest under will, first-named or acting executor (bequest under will) under such will—Governor for 5 years, to be entitled to 4 In and 8 Out-Patients annually; £25 bequest under will, first-named or acting executor under such will—Governor for 2 years, to be entitled to 2 In and 4 Out-Patients' tickets annually; £20 Society, Association, or Company collecting or paying in one year (to nominate for each £20 collected or paid)—Life Subscriber; £1 and upwards, Minister of Church Contributor.

Provided always that no minister, Congregation, Association, Society, Company or Person shall nominate as a contributor or contributors any person or persons, the yearly subscription or subscriptions for whom shall be sought or intended to be paid out of moneys derived from public or private collections for Charitable purposes. Every firm or partnership subscribing may exercise their privileges through one of themselves to be nominated in writing by such firm, and the Trustees or Executors of every Estate subscribing may exercise their privileges through one of themselves being nominated in writing by such Trustees or Executors, and every Public or Corporate body subscribing may exercise their privileges through some person in their employ to be nominated in writing by such Public or Corporate Body. The power of voting by nominees at Annual or Special Meeting being limited to three votes for all they represent.

Bye-Law No. 6.—Life Governors will be entitled to recommend 1 In and 4 Out-Patients (always on the books); Governor for 5 years (personal donation)—1 In and 4 Out-Patients always on the books during that time; Governor for 5 years (Executor under will)—4 In and 8 Out-Patients' tickets annually; Governor for 2 years—2 In and 4 Out-Patients' tickets annually; Life Subscriber—1 In and 2 Out-Patients' tickets annually; Contributor—1 In and 2 Out-Patients' tickets annually for each £1 subscribed; Honorary Collector—1 In and 2 Out-Patients' tickets annually for each £1 collected.

Bye-Law No. 7.—Recommendation shall be made by ticket and shall only be used for the recommendation of persons UNABLE to pay for medical attendance; the reception of such persons shall be subject to the approval of the Committee of Management, and provided that the funds and accommodation of the Institution admit of their reception. When recommendations cannot be acceded to, a ticket in lieu of that used shall be returned to the Subscriber. Bye-Law No. S.—Subscribers of £1 and upwards shall have full power to vote at all meetings from time of payment, and shall be deemed Annual Subscribers from date of payment.

Bye-Law No. 9.—At all Annual and Special Meetings of the Corporation, Life Governors shall have three votes: Life Subscribers and Annual Governors, two votes; Annual Contributors of £5 5/- and upwards, three votes; £3 3/-, two votes; £1, one vote; Honorary Collectors for whole amount collected in one year, one vote.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS INTO THE INFIRMARY.

Bye-Law No. 58.—Accidents and such cases of decided emergency only as in the opinion of the Resident Surgeon cannot be delayed may be received in the Infirmary at any time without tick provided, however, that should an accident or emergency case remain in the Institution the days or more, an In-Patient's Ticket must then be procured without delay. The admission patients in ordinary cases recommended by Subscribers' tickets shall be daily (Sundays exceptable between the hours of nine and twelve o'clock in the forenoon, by the Secretary, and the Home ary Medical Staff for the week, or in the absence of such Staff, by the Secretary and Resider Surgeon: such admission to be temporary, and subject to the approval of the House Committee at its next meeting.

ADMISSION OF PAYING PATIENTS.

Bye-Law No. 59.—Paying Patients may be admitted at the discretion of the House Committee who shall fix the weekly rate to be charged to each Patient, and in the event of an operation being necessary may fix a fee therefore, and may require the same to be paid in advance; and every person admitted on the ground of emergency to the benefits of the Institution, and able in the estimation of the Committee, to pay, shall be required to do so at such rate as the Committee may determine. Each admission of a Paying Patient shall be reported to the General Committee at its next meeting, and shall be subject to confirmation.

Bye-Law No. 60.—The General Rules and Regulations of the Institution shall be applicable and he observed by all Paying Patients.

PERSONS NOT ADMISSIBLE.

Bye-Law No. 61.—No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no insane person, exert on remand for medical examination in the Lunacy Ward; no one having a contagious or infection disease: no one subject to epilepsy; nor any one who, in the opinion of the Honorary Medical Staff for the week, or the Resident Surgeon, might receive equal benefit as an Out-Patient, shall admitted; and no child under five years of age shall be admitted, except in cases of accident of for a surgical operation; nor except under special circumstances shall Patients be admitted for other districts where hospitals exist; provided that the House Committee or Officers of the festitution shall have discretionary power to admit such prohibited cases, and shall report upon the exercise of such power to the next General Meeting of the Committee of Management.

ADMISSION OF INMATES INTO THE BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

Bye-Law No. 62.—The admission of Inmates into the Benevolent Asylum shall be restricted to those days in each week upon which the House Committee meets, when applications shall be considered and decided upon. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement; no person insant; making the child under twelve years of age; no one having a contagious or infectious disease shall be so mitted.

PAYMENT OF MAINTENANCE.

All Patients will be expected to pay towards the actual expenses of their maintenance, so tar as their circumstances may enable them; and all property found on Patients who may die in the Hospital will be appropriated to defray the expenses of the maintenance and burial. The residue, if any, to be handed over to their legal representatives.

The Committee of Management shall appoint a Sub-Committee (with the concurrence of the Surgeon) which shall have power to discharge any Patient in case of his refusal to pay; and shall have the further power to require (if necessary) Patients to make a declaration before a Justice as to their means.
