Sixty-Second Annual Report of the Committee of Management.

The Committee of Management have the honor to submit to the Governors and Subscribers their Annual Report and Balance Sheet for year ending June 30th, 1914.

The financial year opened with a credit balance of £732 and closed with the Bank Account showing a credit of £767 3s. 7d., with accounts owing for maintenance of approximately £750.

In the £767 credit is an amount of £240, specially subscribed to purchase beds. This reduces it to £527.

The Institution was therefore not able to pay its way, and has gone back financially. No part of the £800 borrowed from the Reserve Fund some time ago has been returned.

The ordinary income has been maintained, as compared with other years. Private contributions amounted to £1051, which is about the average.

Hospital Sunday Fund returned £655 14s. 2d., compared with £640 of the previous year.

Municipal grants apart from payments for Infectious Patients amounted to £128 2s., which is an advance on previous 12 months.

There is £100 of painting urgently needed to be done here. Your Committee have appealed to the surrounding Councils to supply the necessary funds. The majority have already promised to do so, and it is hoped shortly to get the work in hand.

The total number of patients passing through the Institution was 2273, of these 1320 were admitted to the Wards.

OUT-DOOR PATIENTS.—Number admitted, Males, 495; Females, 458; Total, 953. Number of occasions on which they attended, 4738.

INFECTIOUS DISEASES.—211 patients were treated. They were as follows:—Diphtheria, 153; Typhoid, 48; Phthisis, 5; Scarlet Fever, 2; Chicken Pox, 3. 3 deaths occurred from Diphtheria and 4 from Typhoid Fever.

Rate of mortality has been 6.5 for all cases; 6.5 for Hospital In-door patients. 13 deaths occurred within 24 hours of admission.

OPERATING THEATRE.—291 operations have been performed.

The daily average of occupied beds has been 63.2 Hospital; 8.5 Infectious Wards, and 66.8 Benevolent Asylum. The average cost per bed, calculated on the Government basis of two Benevolents to one In-patient, was £72 10s. 6d. This is £6 4s. 3d. more than last year and is caused by increased cost of food, labour, etc.

HOSPITAL SUNDAY.—Considerable difficulty was experienced in getting the necessary lady collectors for Hospital Saturday, but eventually a little band volunteered and worked with great energy throughout the day with our own nurses, with the satisfactory result recorded above. The street collections amounted to £180 6s., £37 12s. 7d. coming from Newtown and Chilwell and £18 6s. 1d. from Geelong West District. All who so kindly helped are hereby gratefully thanked. In another part of the report will be shown list of the various collectors and amounts they obtained.

OBITUARY.—It is with great regret that we have to record the death of a generous supporter of the Institution, viz., the late A. Miller, Esq. On occasions when appealed to he showed sympathy with us, and during last year a special appeal was made to him for help. Unfortunately he was too ill at the time to do anything, but with his usual generosity and thought he did not forget us, leaving in his will an annuity of £200 for all time. Mr. Miller will be missed by a large number whom he so generously helped. Such men can ill be spared and it is with deep regret that we record his death.

HOSPITAL BALL.—In July last a number of ladies and gentlemen decided to give a Ball in aid of the Hospital. Their efforts were very successful and they raised the sum of £221 0s. 6d. It was a great help to the Institution. H. Parrington, Esq., was a splendid secretary and gave invaluable service. D. Aitkens, Esq., Manager for Messrs. Dalgety & Co., gave the use of the Wool-store, and the Electric Supply Co. the lighting free of cost. To all and everyone who assisted, either with money or personal service, your Committee's thanks are hereby tendered. It was hoped that this Ball would be an annual fixture, but no move has been made so far this winter to organize another.

NEW BEDS.—The *Geelong Advertiser* recently made an appeal to equip the Hospital with new beds. The Public generously responded with 79 beds at £3 each. Your Committee is glad to report that the whole of the Hospital will now be equipped with new up-to-date bedsteads, which is very gratifying. The Editor and Proprietor of the *Geelong Advertiser* and the many kind friends who donated are gratefully thanked. The individual subscribers appear in another part of the report.

EGG COLLECTION.—In the spring the Editor of the *Geelong Advertiser* organised an egg collection. 20,000 eggs approximately were received and preserved in Waterglass, the gift of Mr. T. A. Dickson. The eggs were of excellent quality and proved of great benefit to the patients. They have now been nearly all used. A band of ladies, headed by Mrs. J. Small, worked very hard, washing and cleaning every egg before it was put down. The Editor, Mrs. Small and her band of ladies, and the donors are gratefully thanked for their kind help, also the Head Teachers, without whose assistance the collection could not have been made.

MEDICAL STAFF.—Drs. F. J. Newman, A. W. Marwood, T. J. M. Kennedy and G. McCallum were re-elected by the subscribers, with Drs. R. G. McPhee and H. T. Elvins as Hon. Anaesthetist and Skiagraphist respectively.

During the year it was decided to create an Oculist's Department and Dr. B. C. Joel, of Melbourne, was appointed. It is also intended to recommend the Subscribers to appoint an Honorary Pathologist to do the Pathological work of the Institution, which is now all sent to Melbourne and has to be paid for. *A large sum*

LEGACIES AND BEQUESTS.—To those who are fortunate enough to have the means to do so, we especially appeal to be remembered by them when making their wills. In this way they can be of great help to the sick and suffering poor, and they will in no way miss what they give. It is often not possible for a man to give largely in his life time, as it might reduce his source of income too much, but after death this does not apply, and he could well afford to leave something to the Hospital, who now forgets to do so.

NEW HOSPITAL.—Your Committee feel it their duty to again bring before the subscribers and the Public, the pressing necessity of providing a new Hospital. The present building is over 65 years old, is out date and decaying in many places, in consequence of being built of a particularly friable freestone. A modern Hospital would be different in every respect to our own. The present building could be rebuilt piece by piece. All that is preventing a start being made is the want of money. It is estimated that approximately £45,000 would be required to completely re-erect, but a much smaller sum would enable the Committee to start building. When Trustees of large Estates and wealthy men in Melbourne have been approached for money for this object their first question is "What have the local people subscribed?" and they invariably say they are not going to give anything until the district has led the way.

COMMITTEE.—At the last Annual Meeting G. Martin, Esq., J.P., was re-elected President; Dr. J. Small and J. Nicol, Esq., Vice-Presidents; E. E. Headdey, Esq., Honorary Treasurer. During the year Mr. Headdey resigned and G. B. Hall, Esq., was elected Honorary Treasurer in his stead.

R. Williams, Esq., was elected to a seat on the Committee at the last Annual Meeting. T. A. Dickson, Esq., has retired and his seat was filled by the appointment of W. H. Thacker, Esq. The Rev. R. Kelly resigned his seat and the Rev. S. J. Hoban was elected to fill the vacancy. The Rev. F. W. R. Newton also vacated his seat on leaving Geelong, which was filled by the election of the Rev. S. Hollow.

Revs. S. Hollow, S. J. Hoban and Messrs. W. H. Thacker, W. Higgins, J. Purdie and W. W. Bradley now retire in accordance with the rules. They are all eligible for re-election and offer themselves accordingly.

In conclusion, your Committee would respectfully impress upon those who have the means to help, that the calls upon the resources of the Hospital are advancing rapidly year by year, and increased private contributions must be looked for if the Institution is to keep in the front with similar Institutions. Without a continued response from the Public it would be impossible to carry on the work, and while your Committee are most grateful for benefits received, they look forward with confidence for future help in the noble work of this Institution.
