Sixty-Fifth Annual Report of the Committee of Management.

The Committee of Management of the Geelong Infirmary and Benevolent Asylum have the honor to present to the Governors their Sixty-fifth Annual Report and Balance Sheet for the financial year ended 30th June, 1917.

Financial.—The Hospital finances would have caused the Committee grave concern during the year had they not received several valuable bequests and extraordinary donations. The total ordinary income from all sources amounted to £6,801, and the total ordinary expenditure amounted to £7,850. There was thus a deficit of nearly £1,000 between the ordinary income and ordinary expenditure. The year started with a credit balance at the bank of £966/17/11, which was, however, earmarked, as accounts brought over from the preceding year were owing to the extent of nearly £900.

£1,579 was collected by the Secretary from In-patients towards their maintenance, and £91 was collected at the Out-patients' Department; making a total of £1,660 altogether.

The Municipal Council's contribution towards the General Hospital only amounted to £52/10/- . This has since been augmented by £50 from the Geelong City Council. The municipal assistance to the General Hospital is practically negligible, and shows a great want of interest and support by the numerous surrounding Councils and Shires.

The Hospital Saturday and Sunday Fund shows a decrease of £63, and is the lowest for the last four years.

Despite the many calls that have been made on the public, the institution has been supported quite as liberally as in past years. The expenditure on maintenance was £7,850, against the previous year's £7,911. The reason it is not much more is that we have treated 227 less In-patients during the current term, and also less Benevolent inmates have been in residence.

The item "Surgery and Dispensary" shows an increase of £237, which is principally accounted for by the increased cost of drugs and dressings.

Under the items "Domestic" an increase of £300 is shown. This is caused by the purchase of £120 worth of new bedsteads, the increased cost of bedding and drapery, and of fuel.

No other items under the heading of "Expenditure" call for comment.

Infectious Diseases Wards.—These have been fully occupied during the year, Diseases treated being Cerebro Spinal Meningitis, Diphtheria, Scarlet Fever, etc.

Wards.—The Defence authorities have erected a Ward, with Nurses' Quarters, on the Infectious Wards block, for the use of soldiers. When the local camp was closed the department notified your Committee they would sell the ward for £437/10/-, and failing a purchaser would remove them. The buildings are valued at at least £1,200. The Committee not having the money to purchase, invited the Councils interested to finance the proposition by subscribing the necessary money to acquire them for the institution. At a conference held recently by the several municipalities the various representatives decided to recommend their Councils to accede to the request.

The Infectious Diseases Block should now be fully provided for, for at least some years, with one of the most up-to-date Infectious Hospitals in the State.

Out-door and Casualty Patients.—Out-door: Number admitted, 820; casualties, 423—total, 1243. Number of occasions on which they attended, 4,388. 284 infectious diseases patients were admitted; diphtheria, 167; typhoid, 11; phthisis, 12; scarlet fever, 34; cerebro spinal meningitis, 60; febrile, 14; 8 deaths occurred from diphtheria; 1 typhoid fever; cerebro spinal meningitis, 22. The rate of mortality has been 9.8 for all cases, 8.7 for indoor patients.

Operating Theatre.—330 operations have been performed.

Daily average of occupied beds: Hospital, 69.8; Benevolent Asylum, 66.7. The average cost per bed, on the Government basis of 2 Benevolents to 1 In-patient, was £78/13/1. This is £4/5/4 per bed more than last year, occasioned by extra cost of medicines, food, salaries and wages, and the lower number of patients treated.

Kitchener Memorial Hospital.—During the year it was decided at a public meeting to at once commence organising to acquire the necessary funds to rebuild the General Hospital, which is rapidly falling into decay. The matter was enthusiastically taken up by leading citizens, and C. Myers, A. Bowman, and C. Brownlow, Esquires, were appointed to carry the movement through. These gentlemen have worked continuously and assiduously in the meantime, and the funds now in hand amount to over £4,500. When enough money is in hand to warrant them to do so, it is, we believe, the intention of the Committee to approach the Government for assistance to augment the fund.

Hospital Sunday.—Great difficulty was again experienced in getting Lady Collectors to organise this movement, and strong representations were made that it should be postponed, as the annual date fixed came just before a collection organised for patriotic purposes. It was felt, however, that if the date were once altered the collection would suffer, and it was decided to go on with what help we could get. A number of children were dressed as nurses by the matron, and the nurses also left their work and collected enthusiastically, with a few ladies of the town who threw themselves whole heartedly into the movement. The weather was very much against us, and it says much for the energy of the honorary collectors and organisers that the results were as large as they were. Altogether with the church collections the sum of £640 was realised.

Egg Collections.—The Editor of the "Advertiser" organised his annual egg campaign with most satisfactory results, and nearly 1,890 dozen eggs were received and preserved. Mrs. J. Small and her band of ladies worked hard, washing and cleaning the eggs, and putting them in the preservative. The eggs have kept splendidly up to the present time, and are greatly appreciated. The editor, collectors, donors, and ladies who helped are gratefully thanked for their kindness, also the head teachers. The preservative "Ovo," in which the eggs were immersed, was given by Mr. A. J. Leckie. His kind gifts are now acknowledged with grateful thanks.

Medical Staff.—Doctors F. J. Newman, A. W. Marwood, T. J. M. Kennedy, and G. McCallum were re-elected by the subscribers last year, with Doctors R. G. McPhee and H. F. Elvins as Honorary Anesthetist and Skiagraphist respectively. Dr. B. C. Joel was appointed Honorary Oculist, and Dr. J. E. Piper Honorary Pathologist. During the year Doctors Marwood and Elvins obtained leave from your Committee and went to the Front. This makes three of the Honorary Medical Staff who are on leave. Doctors Grimwade, Darby, and Morgan have continued to give their services. The Committee's thanks are hereby tendered to the Staff for their professional assistance to the institution.

Gifts.—The Committee desire to tender their thanks to the Ladies' Flower Mission for supplying flowers; the proprietors of the "Geelong Advertiser," "Geelong Times," "Argus," "Age," "Leader," "Australasian," and "Federal Record" for supplying their respective journals. Thanks are also tendered to the friends of the institution who provided the usual Christmas dinner, and tobacco and cigars for the patients and inmates.

Legacies and Bequests.—Our appeals in former reports have been liberally responded to by generous benefactors, otherwise the institution would not to-day be paying its way. We would again bring the matter of remembering the institution prominently before those who are able to leave a legacy to this charity when making their wills.

Obituary.—With very deep regret your Committee have to record the loss of a much valued member of the Board of Management through death, namely, Mr. W. Humble. Mr. Humble was identified with the hospital for over 36 years. For 27 years he was a member of the House Committee. His sound judgment and valued experience will be greatly missed.

Reserve and Endowment Fund.—The amount to credit of Reserve Fund is £5,454/5/2, and the Endowment Fund amounts to £7,685/2/6.

Nursing Department.—During the year five nurses presented themselves, and were successful in passing the Final Examination of the R.V.T.N.A. Two of our sisters have resigned on account of being accepted for service abroad, whilst eight probationers have entered the hospital, as vacancies occurred.

Governors.—The following were elected Governors for five years:—Mr. F. J. Leary and Mr. T. H. G. Balfour. Mr. S. Mackay was elected a Governor for two years.

Life Subscribers Elected.—Mrs. B. W. Mitchell, Mr. Charles Cole, Miss M. Heinz, Mr. James Scott, Mr. Hamilton Calvert, Mr. Thomas Brady, and Mr. William Broom.

Infectious Wards.—The daily average of patients under treatment has been over 11. Cerebro spinal meningitis has been more prevalent during the period under review—56 cases, with 22 deaths. The Municipalities under the Board of Health's award still continue to pay at the rate of £60 per annum per occupied bed; although the extra cost, which has to be made up by the General Hospital, is much more.

Committee.—At the last annual meeting Mr. G. Martin, J.P., was re-elected President; Messrs. J. Nicol and W. C. Kerton, Vice-Presidents; Mr. A. Collier, Honorary Treasurer. Messrs. J. Purdie, E. Philpott, J. P. McCabe Doyle, R. Williams, F. J. Leary, and Dr. T. J. M. Kennedy were elected to the Board of Management. On the death of Mr. W. Humble, Mr. George Humble was elected to his seat. He retires according to the rules, but is eligible for re-election. The following members also retire by effluxion of time. They are eligible for re-election, and offer themselves accordingly:—Messrs. Charles Shannon, W. W. Bradley, W. Higgins, J. Purdie, and Rev. S. Hollow.

In conclusion the Committee offers their earnest and sincere thanks for all the help that has been given to the institution during the financial year. Considering the terrible war that has now been raging for three years, the Committee cannot be too thankful for the help vouchsafed by the generous public to this institution for the relief of sickness and old age.
