Financial.—Notwithstanding the continued high cost of everything used in the Institution, and greatly increased wages awarded by the Wages Board, your Committee are pleased to state that the downward trend has been checked. We started the year with a debit balance of £988; we end with a credit balance of £128/16/10.

The total income from all sources amounted to £ 11,061/4/5, and the total expenditure was £10,415/16/3. The Secretary collected £1,251/3/1 from In-patients towards their maintenance, and £75/3/6 was received from the Out-patients department.

The Municipalities of the whole district gave £75/15/-

Infectious Diseases Wards.—428 patients were admitted for treatment. This is the heaviest year since the wards were opened. The diseases were as follow:—Diphtheria, 306; Scarlet Fever, 118, and Meningitis, 4.

Under an award of the Board of Health made some years ago your Committee has been compelled to treat patients from the Councils in the Infectious Diseases Wards at the rate of £60 per occupied bed. It is needless to say each bed costs much more. During the year your Committee met a Conference of the Municipalities interested, with a view to obtaining more equitable payment, as the Government does not pay anything towards the upkeep of the wards through the Government grant.

The Councils offered £80 per bed—this was not considered enough by the Hospital authorities, and the offer was not accepted. The Councils at the time said that if it could be proved that each occupied bed cost more than £80 per annum they would be willing to pay the extra cost. Your Committee therefore engaged a Melbourne firm of chartered accountants to go into the cost per bed for a period of six months from January to June, 1918, and they found the cost per bed to be £80 per annum.

The General Hospital has for some years had to bear the extra cost of treating these infectious patients, which your Committee do not consider at all equitable.

Influenza Epidemic.—This dreaded disease which created such great alarm and caused so many fatalities in Europe, America, and the Islands, was notified in Australia towards the end of last year, made its appearance in this City, and on 29th January of this year the first case was admitted to this Institution. Thereafter the cases increased till 27th February, from that date there was a rapid decline, and for more than a week we were free, but on March 26th a fresh outbreak occurred of a more serious type. There has been a total of 325 cases admitted to the end of June, of which 269 were discharged, 41 died, and 15 remain in the Institution. In this connection your Committee are very grateful for the generous and valuable assistance rendered by the Defence Department and the Red Cross Society, for Tents, Blankets, Sheets, Towels, etc, the members of the Red Cross Society (Geelong Centre), V.A.D., Belmont Croquet Club, W.C.T.U., P.W.M.U., for Fruit and Delicacies, etc, which have been regularly received and much appreciated; the Owners of Motor Cars and Motor Boats, and they take this opportunity of tendering their sincere thanks to all who have responded so liberally. The Medical Officers, Nurses, Voluntary Helpers, and Staff have been unremitting in their dangerous and arduous duties, and we gratefully acknowledge their devoted service. The Matron well deserves a special word of praise for her unremitting and cheery attention during a peculiarly strenuous time.

Outdoor and Casualty Patients.—Outdoor patients admitted, 699; casualties, 418; total, 1117.

Operating Theatre.—270 operations have been performed.

Occupied Beds.—Daily Average—General Hospital, 80; Benevolent Asylum, 53. The average cost per bed on the Government basis of two benevolent beds to one in-patient was £98/5/3.

Kitchener Memorial Hospital.—Your Committee are unable to give any details as to the re-building scheme. The lawsuit concerning the money left by the late Mr. Dutton has not yet reached finality.

Hospital Sunday.—It is very gratifying to state that, notwithstanding the many calls made on the citizens for War purposes, Hospital Sunday receipts were exceptionally good. Perfect organisation, active co-operation and unstinted generosity resulted in a record being established with a collection of £1,183/8/8, as against £563 last year. We gratefully acknowledge this generous response to our appeal, and are confident that this liberal support will be continued and even increased.

Government Grant.—In 1916 the amount of grant was £2250. The following year it was reduced to £1913, at which it remains, although your Committee hoped there would have been an advance this year in view of the greatly increased cost of provisions, drugs and dressings. We have in accordance with instructions from Government, carefully investigated the position of all patients admitted, with the object of obtaining contributions toward their maintenance.

Wages Board.—In December 1917, a Wages Board Award was brought into operation for all Hospital employees, except Nurses and Officers. The wages for the Staff affected thereby has been increased by £965/11/-.

Entertainments.—Police and Firemen's Carnival, £289/14/6; Newtown Presbyterian Choir, £17/1/-; Gnarwarre Social, £7/12/10; Bannockburn Rifle Club, £4; A.L.P. Society, Balliang, £5/16/8; Marcus Branch Victorian Farmers' Union, £11; Boat Race, Queenscliff, £3.

Egg Collection.—The Editor of the "Advertiser" again organised an Egg Collection with most satisfactory results. 3286 dozen eggs were received and preserved. The Editor, Collectors, Donors and Head Teachers of State Schools are gratefully and sincerely thanked for their valuable assistance.

Medical Staff.—Drs. Marwood, Elvins, and McPhee are still on active service at the front. Dr. G. McCallum has kindly undertaken charge of the X Ray department during Dr. Elvin's absence. Drs. Grimwade, Darby, and Morgan have continued their service as locum tenens for the members of the staff who are away at the Front. The Committee's thanks are hereby tendered to the Staff for their professional assistance to the institution.

Gifts.—The Committee desire to tender their thanks to the Ladies' Flower Mission for supplying flowers, the proprietors of the "Geelong Advertiser," "Geelong Times," "Argus," "Age," "Leader," "Australasian," and "Federal Record" for supplying their respective journals. Thanks are also tendered to the friends of the institution who provided the usual Christmas dinner, tobacco, and cigars for the patients and inmates.

Legacies and Bequests.—We would bring the matter of remembering the institution prominently before those who are able to leave a legacy to this charity when making their wills. The receipts from bequests have during the last few years been of great benefit in keeping the institution going, bridging over the shortage of the ordinary income and enabling the work to be carried on.

Reserve and Endowment Fund.—The amount to the credit of Reserve Fund is £6703/18/1 and the Endowment Fund, £7851/0/5.

Obituary.—With very deep regret, your Committee record the death of Mr. J. Nicol, Vice-President of the institution. Mr. Nicol was elected on the Committee in 1887, and for many years was Chairman of the House Committee.

Nursing Department.—During the year eight nurses presented themselves for, and were successful in passing the final examination of the R.V.T.N.A. Sixteen probationers have been appointed, twelve of whom were called owing to the extra work caused by the influenza epidemic.

Martin, Rev. Kingsley Cole, Rev. C. Tregebar, J. D'Helin, J. A. Thear, were elected members of the Committee of Management. According to the rules the following retire: Mr. James Wighton, President; Messrs. C. Shannon and H. Blomfield Brown, Vice-Presidents; Mr. A. Collier, Hon. Treasurer. They are eligible for re-election, and offer themselves accordingly, with the exception of Mr. C. Shannon who after 42 years service on the Committee does not seek re-election.

The following members of the Committee also retire by effluxion of time: Messrs. F. J. Leahy, W. H. Thacker, J. P. McCabe Doyle, Dr. Kennedy, Rev. J. Snell. They are eligible for re-election and offer themselves accordingly.

Superintendent and Secretary.—Mr. Reilly, owing to ill-health, was compelled to resign his position as Superintendent and Secretary. His successor was found in Mr. W. Simpson, previously Dispenser at the institution. Mr. Simpson has filled the combined offices of Superintendent, Secretary, House Steward and Dispenser, and your Committee are glad to state that this arrangement has worked excellently. A considerable saving in salary has been effected and the duties have been carried out most satisfactorily and with strict regard to economy.

In conclusion the Committee desire to cordially thank all who have in any way assisted the institution during the year, including the Press for its criticism and suggestions. The Great War, now happily ended, crippled the resources of this and similar charities. It is the belief and heartfelt wish of the Committee that the spirit of generosity so amply developed and munificently exercised may now find its proper satisfaction in ministering to local needs which have during the past years been necessarily relegated to a subordinate position.


