**Financial.**—Although the cost of everything used in the Institution continues to soar, and an increase of salary was granted to the Nurses, your Committee are pleased to state that the Credit balance shows a further increase of £248/17/2, and now stands at £377/14/-.

The total income from all sources amounted to £11,406/18/3, and the total expenditure was £11,029/4/3. The Secretary collected £1,379/11/9 from In-patients towards their maintenance, and £103/9/6 was received from the Out-patients' Department.

The Municipalities of the whole district gave £105/2/-

**Infectious Diseases Wards.**—551 patients were admitted for treatment. This is the heaviest year since the Wards were opened. The diseases were as follows:—Diphtheria, 330; Scarlet Fever, 96, and Pneumonic Influenza, 121.

The Councils offered £80 per bed, but the Government would not agree to this increase, so the grant still stands at £60.

In the meantime, the cost has further increased by 37 per cent. since the claim for £80 was made, so that your Committee is in a worse position than ever.

**Influenza Epidemic.**—This dread disease has fortunately been conquered, and your Committee is pleased to report that for the period from July 1st, 1919 to September 15th, 1919, only 121 cases were treated. On this date the Wards closed, and have not been re-opened.

Your Committee again express their thanks for the generous and valuable assistance given by the Defence Department and Red Cross Society for Tents, Blankets, Sheets, Towels, etc., and Members of Red Cross Society, Geelong centre, V.A.D., Belmont Croquet Club, W.C.T.U., and P.W.M.U., for Fruit, Delicacies, etc, which were regularly received, and much appreciated. The owners of Motor Cars and Motor Boats, and they again take this opportunity of expressing their sincere thanks to all who responded so liberally.

The Medical Officers, Nurses, Voluntary Helpers, and Staff, were unremitting in their dangerous and arduous duties, and we gratefully acknowledge their devoted services.

The Matron also deserves a special word of praise for her unremitting and cheery attention during that strenuous time.

**Outdoor and Casualty Patients.**—Outdoor patients admitted, 662; casualties, 512; total, 1174.

**Operating Theatre.**—276 operations have been performed.

**Occupied Beds.**—Daily average—General Hospital, 74; Benevolent Asylum, 51. The average cost per bed on the Government basis of two benevolent beds to one in-patient was £110/5/2.

**Hospital Sunday.**—It is very gratifying to state that, notwithstanding the many calls made on the citizens for War purposes, Hospital Sunday receipts were exceptionally good. Perfect organisation, active co-operation and unstinted generosity resulted in a collection of £988/3/2, as against £1,183/8/8 last year. We gratefully acknowledge this generous response to our appeal, and are confident that this liberal support will be continued and even increased.

On April 1st a scheme was inaugurated of allowing patients' friends to visit the Hospital on certain days, other than those set apart for Visiting Days, on a payment of sixpence each visit. This scheme has worked satisfactorily and to date the sum of £49/5/- has been received.

**Government Grant.**—Your Committee regret to state that the Government have seen fit to reduce this amount again, and it now stands at £1,900. Though the balance sheet shows a credit balance of £377, this has only been obtained by most careful economy and with a larger Government Grant, many things are required which are at present done without.

We really require more up-to-date Ward utensils, such as Ward Waggons for Surgical Wards, and also a large supply of up-to-date Instruments, and £500 could easily be expended in this direction alone.

The Salaries of the Matron and Nurses were increased in September last, and this item shows an increase of £58/11/10 over last year.

**Entertainments.**—Football Match, Portarlington, £4/11/9; Dance, "Wormbete," Winchelsea, £3 2s.; Football Match, Drysdale, £2; Social at Gnarwarre, £7/12/3; Public School Sports, £64/2/-; Dance, Mt. Moriac, £1/17/3; Entertainment, Esplanade Hotel, Queenscliff, £1/10/-; Race Club, Mount Moriac, £6/6/-; Football Match, per Com. E. V. Boyle, Osborne House, £42/19/2; Band Concert by St. Augustine's Band, £15/7/6.

**Egg Collection.**—The Editor of the Geelong "Advertiser" again organised an Egg Collection with most satisfactory results. 3,112 dozen eggs were received and preserved. The Editor, Collectors, Donors, and Head Teachers of State Schools are gratefully and sincerely thanked for their valuable assistance.

**Medical Staff.**—Drs. Marwood, Elvins and McPhee have returned from the Front, and resumed their duties as Honorary Medical Officers, and Skiagraphist to the Institution. They retire, but are eligible for re-election, except Dr. Marwood.

The Committee takes this opportunity of congratulating them on their safe return.

Drs. Grimwade and Darby have been temporarily appointed as Honorary Medical Officers to the Out-patients' Department, pending the alteration of the Rules of permanent appointment.

Dr. McCallum has left the district and so has resigned his position as Honorary Medical Officer. The Committee in thanking him for his valuable services expressed their regret at his departure after so many years of useful work at the Hospital, and desire to place on record their thanks to Dr. Elvins who has been acting in Dr. McCallum's stead since the latter's departure.

**Gifts.**—The Committee desire to tender their thanks to the Ladies' Flower Mission for supplying flowers, the proprietors of the Geelong "Advertiser," Geelong "Times," "Argus," "Age," "Leader," "Australasian," and "Federal Record" for supplying their respective journals.

Thanks are also tendered to the friends of the Institution who provided the usual Christmas Dinner, Tobacco and Cigars for the patients and inmates.

**Legacies and Bequests.**—We would bring the matter of remembering the Institution prominently before those who are able to leave a legacy to this Charity when making their Wills. The receipts from bequests have during the last few years been of great benefit in keeping the Institution going, bridging over the shortage of the ordinary income and enabling the work to be carried on.

**Reserve and Endowment Fund.**—The amount to the credit of Reserve Fund is £7,913/19/6, and the Endowment Fund, £8,070/1/6.

**Obituary.**—With very deep regret, your Committee record the death of Probationer Nurse Todd. Nurse Todd joined the Staff as Probationer Nurse on April 18th, 1918. The suddenness of her death was a great shock to all concerned, and though every effort to save her was made both by relatives and the Staff, she died on May 4th last, after a short illness, lasting only a week.

**Nursing Department.**—During the year seven Nurses presented themselves for, and were successful in passing the final examination of the R.V.T.N.A. Six probationers have been appointed during the year.

**Governor for Five Years.**—Mr. W. H. Eden.

**Life Subscribers Elected.**—Messrs, H. Hooper, W. E. Wise, G. G. Jobbins and Mrs. R. Grant.

**Committee.**—At the last Annual Meeting, Mr. James Wighton was elected President; Messrs. W. W. Bradley and H. Blomfield Brown, Vice-Presidents; Mr. A. Collier, Hon. Treasurer; Messrs. Dr. T. J. M. Kennedy, F. J. Leary, W. H. Thacker, J. F. S. Shannon, Revs. J. Snell, and T. Worsley Maguire, were elected members of the Committee of Management. According to the Rules the following retire: Mr. James Wighton, President; Messrs. W. W. Bradley and H. Blomfield Brown, Vice-Presidents; Mr. H. K. S. Rusden, Hon. Treasurer; and Messrs. T. McCormick and J. Kerley. They are eligible for re-election, and offer themselves accordingly.

The following members of the Committee also retire by effluxion of time: Messrs. E. Philpott, J. Purdie, W. W. Higgins and G. B. Humble. They are eligible for re-election, except Mr. E. Philpott, and offer themselves accordingly.

The Committee regret to announce the retirement of two eminent gentlemen who have rendered very valuable services to the Hospital for so many years.

Dr. Marwood has been an Honorary Medical Officer to the Hospital for the past 30 years, with the exception of service with the A.I.F. Abroad.

Mr E. Philpott has been a Member of the Committee for the past sixteen years, on both the General and House Committees.

Both these gentlemen carry with them the thanks and esteem of all connected with the Institution.

**Superintendent and Secretary.**—Mr. W. Simpson, owing to ill-health was compelled to resign his position as Superintendent, Secretary, and Dispenser. Mr. Simpson fulfilled these duties satisfactorily, and your Committee very much regret the cause of his resignation, feeling that the Institution has lost a most valuable servant.

His successor is Mr. J. A. DuBois Williams, from Adelaide, South Australia, who joined the Institution on June 3rd of this year.

In conclusion the Committee desire to cordially thank all who have in any way assisted the Institution during the year, including the Press for its criticism and suggestions. The Great War, now happily ended, crippled the resources of this and similar Charities. It is the belief and heartfelt wish of the Committee that the spirit of generosity so amply developed and munificently exercised may now find its proper satisfaction in ministering to local needs which have during the past years been necessarily relegated to a subordinate position.


