<p>Geelong Advertiser, 5th October 1862 : Queenscliff Bathing House Co - Charles C SIMPSON, Secretary. =====</p> <p>Geelong Advertiser, 24th April 1871 : SIMPSON, Charles Cheney, Hesse Street appointed Vendor of Stamps. =====</p> <p>Geelong Advertiser, 13th August 1872 : Messrs. Craig, SIMPSON and Admans returned to the Queenscliffe Council. =====</p> <p>Geelong Advertiser, 6th September 1872 : Charles C. SIMPSON advertised at Queenscliff re the supply of local and Portarlington bricks for works at Queenscliff. =====</p> <p>Geelong Advertiser, 22nd May 1873 : R. Jordan, Returning Officer, listed the following candidates for the Board of Advice for Queenscliff School District; Hugh Bryans, George Stewart Caldwell, James Gardiner Caught, William John Craig, Samuel Evans, John Henry Henley, William Leihy, James Liddell, Charles Cheney SIMPSON, Thomas Stoneman and John Williams. =====</p> <p>Geelong Advertiser, 9th September 1873 : Advertiser reported a revival of cricket at Queenscliff. SIMPSON, J.P. He had been a Chemist for 34 years, a Warden of St. George's Church of England, and a leading Mason and public figure. He was to be interred at Queenscliff on 25/12/1892 - George Priddle, Undertaker. ===== Geelong Advertiser, 27th February 1893 : Life-like portrait of the late C. C.
